

GREENVILLE, N. C. — Al Beccaccio's slick 4-hit pitching kept East Carolina at bay as Florida State struggled from behind to a 6-1 baseball victory here Friday.

The Carolina team, with a 13-2 record going into the game, jumped ahead 1-0 in the first inning when it sandwiched two of its four hits around a walk.

FSU erupted with five runs in the fourth.

Mike Augustine led with a double. Gary Nichols walked. Billy Williamson singled in one run. Buddy Teagle walked. Jerry Chmielewski's single scored one, and Beccaccio's one - baser brought in two. A fifth run scored on an error.

The Tribe added one in the eighth on Nichol's single and Chmielewski's double.

Now 15-5 for the season, the Seminoles finish their swing through the Carolinas with an engagement against the Camp Lejeune Marines tonight, 7:30. Lejeune has an 18-2 record,

numbers among its players Bill Westendick a former FSU star.

Beccaccio, who normally has excellent control, walked eight ("due to the wildness of the umpire," according to one Seminole). He struck out six. His record is now 7-0.
