

Florida's Danny Eggart dashed up a deandy four hitter which caught Florida State's Seminoles with their power switched off, and the Gators ran away with a 6-2 baseball victory here Friday.

Blountstown's Earl Montgomery, the Gator second baseman, was the game's big offensive star. Montgomery, in five trips to the plate, got three hits, in-

cluding a ninth inning triple, drove in three runs, laid down a sacrifice bunt and went out on a scorching liner to Gerry Chmielewski at third.

The Seminoles' two runs came in the third inning when Chmielewski singled and scored on pitcher Marty Howell's double to left. Jim Reed went out third to first, then centerfielder Mike Augustine doubled to right center scoring Howell.

Howell looked good losing his fifth game of the year, but ran into trouble at the start.

Chmielewski, a tough luck man with the bat for the Seminoles this season, also had his problems afield along with shortstop Larry Johnson. The two accounted for five of the chalked up by Florida State.

In the first inning with the count 0-2, leadoff man Don Pendley hit an easy roller to third. Chmielewski came up with it in fine fashion, but his low throw got away from George Rountree at first, and Pendley was able to make third before the ball was captured.

Jim Duncan walked, but Montgomery drove in two of his three runs with a single and an error by Augustine in center. Gator catcher Dave Porter scored Montgomery with a single, and the Seminoles faced a 3-0 lead before they got a chance at the plate.

The Gators got another hit in the eighth on singles by Montgomery, Bill Blanton and Roy Cramer with a error by Johnson. Tom Shannon's fly to center and Montgomery's triple scored Eggart and Pendley — both of whom had walked — in the ninth.

Besides the three hits in the third, a single by Gary Nichols to lead off the fourth was all the hitting Florida State could manage, although McBryde, Nichols and Augustine backed Gator outfielders to the fence several times.

The two teams play a second game this afternoon at 1:30. Righthander Cliff Ranew of Florida State is scheduled to go against Florida's Charles Anderson.
