Lyttle had four hits in five trips, including a double in addition to his home run. Catcher Randy Brown had two hits in four times at bat, including two doubles. Both drove in three Seminole runs.

The Seminoles scored in every inning except the fifth

and ninth. Spring Hill picked up two runs in the fourth and one in the ninth.

The Seminoles were scheduled to play Spring Hill again today on the FSU diamond. North Carolina comes to town tomorrow for a 3 p. m. game. Miami will be here for Friday and Saturday games. The Friday game will be a night affair at Centennial Field.
