Florida State, stymied by both North Carolina and Miami Friday, got sweet revenge yesterday as the Seminoles whipped the Tar Heels and the Hurricanes 4.1 and 10-2 respectively at Seminole Field.

In the first game the Seminoles made the most of four hits and seven walks as they slid past North Carolina, Marty Brooks went the distance for FSU to pick up the win.

Dick Fernandez and Mike Martin were the only Seminoles successful at the plate, as they each collected two hits.

Fernandez singled in the third inning with no one out, but FSU was not able to capitalize and he was left stranded.

In the fourth the Seminole second baseman got another chance, however, with two runners on via walks. With two out Fernandez stroked a line shot into right field; and when the ball took a big mor past regime header wike McLaughlin, Maury Hopkins and Mike Martin trotted home, Fernandez going to third.

Rolling along behind the strong pitching of Brooks, FSU did not hit the score-board again until the eighth inning when, with two men out and Hopkins on first via another walk, Mike Martin lofted his fifth home run of the season over the score-board in right field.

The Tar Heels picked up their lone tally with two outs in the ninth-on-a-single by McLaughlin and a run-scor-

ing double by first baseman Danny Talbott.

Seminole left-hander Eddie Howell spun a three-hitter at the Hurricanes as the Tribe's batsmen exploded for 1 run on 15 hits.

After FSU scored a single run in the first frame the game settled down and appeared to be headed for a tight pitchers' duel between Howell and Hurricane starter Rick Jones. Gary Sprague, who had four hits in five trips against Miami, started the Seminoles rolling with a single in the first. Jim Lyttle forced Sprague at second, and then stole second. An infield out sent Lyttle to third and he scored on a single by Tom

The Tribe made the single run stand up until the fifth inning when a triple by Sprague and a single by Lyttle added another run.

The Seminole bats finally broke through in the sixth as they pounded Jones for six runs on six hits.

With one out in the sixth Pete Sarron singled and went to second on another safety by Martin. A wild pitch moved both runners into scoring position and Fernandez lined a sharp single to right to score them.

Howell's single moved Fernandez to third and Sprague grounded into a fielder's choice scoring Fernandez. Lyttle singled, sending Sprague around to third, and Randy Brown blasted his third homer of the year into the right field scoreboard.

John Danchik came in to relieve Jones and he got Thomas to ground to third to end the inning.

Two walks, a double by Dan Stefkovich and an infield out gave Miami its only two runs in the seventh.

FSU came back with two more in the eighth, when Danchik had trouble controlling the ball.

A single by Sprague, an infield out and single by Brown scored one run. Danchik then loaded the bases with walks to Thomas and Hopkins and a wild pitch allowed Brown to score from third.

The Seminoles, now 20 and 7 for the year, enjoy a well earned rest tomorrow and Tuesday before they meet Furman University here Wednesday.
