MIAMI — A crowd of 1,400 watched as the Florida State University Seminoles baseballers took a close one in the University of Miami 6-5 here Saturday afternoon. Florida State traveled to Lakeland during the night meets the Detroit Tigers in an exhibition game this fernoon.

Action began early as the Hurricanes' bats boomed in the bottom of the first inning, scoring four of Miami's ave runs.

Tito Gomez led off with a single, Dave Sunenburg crificed him to second and Dan Stefkovich brought him come with a single.

With Stelkovich on first, Bob Gangling and Rich terman walked. Stelkovich then scored on a fielder's choice. George Maduar singled to bring in the other two runners, giving the Hurricanes a 40 edge after one inning. The Seminoles picked up one in the third inning when

pitcher Wayne Vincent, singled through the box, moved to second on Chuck Cone's ground out, and scored on an error by Miami's Gomez.

The fourth and fifth innings were scoreless, but in the top of the sixth, Florida State took control by scoring four times.

Tom Whitaker walked to open the inning, Ed Yarnell hit a double moving Whitaker to third. Mike Fason (hitting for Lane Hitchcock) was walked, loading the bases. Dick Gold then singled to left and moved to second when the fielder bobbled the baseball, both Whitaker and Yarnell scoring.

A wild throw to third scored Gold and Phil Spooner (running for Eason). This gave the Seminoles a 5-4 lead. In the eighth inning, Whitaker was hit by a pitch from Miller, the Hurricanes' second relief pitcher.

Whitaker moved to second on Yarnell's sacrifice and

scored when Spooner singled to left. Gold and Eason each

grounded out to close the inning.

After pitching to one man in the bottom of the eighth,
Vincent, the starter, was moved to the outfield and Sullivanwas brought in to pitch to one man. Vincent was thenreturned to the mound where he again pitched to only

one man.

Vincent was then replaced by Jeff Hill who pitched for one-third of an inning and gave up one hit. Jim Helms took over the mound duties and was finally replaced by Mike Reviling.

working the ninth inning.
