

The bats of Florida State outfielders Walt Sumner and Dave Moates led the Seminoles to 10-9 and 8-4 wins over Belmont Abbey and Wake Forest Wednesday at Seminole Field.

The Tribe will meet the same two clubs again today, playing Belmont Abbey at 3 p.m. and Wake Forest at 7:30.

Sumner led the hit parade with seven in the two games. He picked up three safeties in six tries in the afternoon contest and added a four-for-five performance against the Deacons.

Moates collected three hits in each game, including a double and a triple against the Crusaders in the afternoon.

Florida State jumped out to an 8-00 lead over Belmont Abbey, but had to battle from behind in the ninth inning to win as the Crusaders came back strong in the late innings.

Back-to-back doubles by Sumner and Moates slated the Seminoles' first run, and Moates scored the second when Jeff Hogan singled in the third inning.

The Tribe added six more in the fourth to take what appeared to be a comfortable lead. Dick Gold's bases-loaded double and Mike Eason's three-run homer did all the damage.

The Crusaders got a single run in the sixth, breaking starting pitcher Craig Skok's scoreless inning string at 28.

The Seminoles appeared to have the game well under control going into the eighth, but then the roof fell in. After Larry Hartsell was safe on a two-base error by rightfielder Floyd Matthews, the Crusaders rapped Skok for three straight hits, including two doubles.

John Franks was called on in relief, but the big righthander could not find the plate and walked the next three men on 15 pitches. With the Seminole lead now cut to three, Carl Gromek was called in. He got the first batter to pop out, and then Tom Adeimy grounded to short, but Hogan booted the ball allowing another run to score.

Hartsell, batting for the second time in the inning, lofted a fly ball to center, but Sumner dropped it. Moments later John Hickey flied to Sumner, and again the senior centerfielder let the ball get away and the game was tied.

The Crusaders then got the go-ahead run on a passed ball.

A single by Sumner and walks to Moates and Gold loaded the bases for the Seminoles in the ninth.

Jim Gurzynski lofted a fly to left field, and Sumner raced home with the tying run. Third baseman Hickey cut the throw off and tried to double Moates off at second. His throw was wild, however, and Moates scored the winning tally.
