

In the "second game Ammann completely handcuffed the Clemson batters after the third inning, not allowing a hit beyond that point. He gave up two hits in the second inning, however, when the Tigers got their only run.

FSU scored twice in the sixth when Sumner beat out an infield hit, and Moates was safe at first when the Tigers elected to let his sacrifice bunt roll hoping it would go foul. Gold grounded out advancing the runners, before Hogan singled them both home.

Gold's homer in the eight accounted for the other FSU run.

The two wins extended FSU's win streak to 17 games and left it with a 26-5-5.

The Seminoles play Georgia in Athens Monday and Tuesday, before returning home on Thursday for a night game with St. Leo.
