

Greg Gromek and Dick Nichols took charge Friday night as Florida State ripped Miami 11-4 at Seminole Field.

The two teams meet again tonight at 7:30.

Playing for the first time since becoming the nation's topped ranked ball team, the Tribe, now 36-3, jumped in front with seven runs in the first two innings and were never threatened.

It was not entirely smooth sailing as neither Mike Slade nor eventual winner Pat Osburn had one of their better nights for FSU.

The Hurricanes, whose record fell to 27-13, collected only five hits, but with the help of four Seminole errors and 10 walks, they managed a threat in nearly every inning.

For Osburn, who came on in relief of Slade in the fourth, it was win No. 9 against a single loss.

The Seminoles tallied four unearned runs in the first after starter Tom Borzecki had retired the first two men he faced.

Key to the uprising was a double error by shortstop Joel Green which allowed one run to score and another by catcher Al Volpe which gave up two more.

In the second, a double by Nichols, and run scoring hits by John Grubb and Larry Cocks resulted in three more tallies.

Slade started for the Tribe, but also ran into trouble early.

Ed Garvey walked to open the Hurricane fourth and Tony Barletta followed with a home run to right-center.

Another walk and an infield hit coupled with a throwing error by thirdbaseman Ron Cash resulted in another run. A second error by Cash allowed the fourth run to score.

That was all for Slade and Osburn came in. Chuck Leve

greeted him with a line drive into left-center that Greg Schnute snared with a diving, rolling catch and turned it into a double play, picking off a runner at second.

Miami reliever Rusty Cameron checked the Seminoles on three infield hits in the first four innings he worked, but the Tribe got to him in the seventh.

Two quick hits announced his downfall as Vince Battaglia came on. But he failed to shut off the rally as hits by Harry Saferight and Nichols accounted for three runs.

A walk and Gromek's fourth hit of the night scored the Seminoles' final run in the eighth.
