

CLEMSON, S. C. — Florida State's relief pitching could produce no game-saving heroics yesterday as the Seminoles dropped both ends of a doubleheader with Clemson, one a no-hitter by Tiger pitcher Dave VanVolkenburg.

The Tigers won the first game 11-0 on the no-hitter, then took the nightcap 12-7.

The closest thing the Seminoles got to a hit all afternoon off VanVolkenburg was a line drive down the right field line which was picked off on a running catch by Steve Kelley.

Clemson's first run came when Johnnie Severs tripled and was driven home on a single by Craig White.

Barry McQueen pitched well for the Seminoles, but was taken out after allowing two singles in the sixth inning. Three relief pitchers went into the game in that inning for Florida State, but none were able to hold down the Tigers as they sent 15 men to the plate, and scored 10 runs on five hits.

Florida State made things a little easier by walking four batters and hitting two.

A fourth-inning Seminole rally was cut short with the bases loaded on walks as Dave Grimes struck out and Greg Gromek lined a hard drive to center field to retire the side.

In the second game, Seminole pitcher Robin Flake proved ineffective as he allowed seven runs, five in the first inning. Three of the runs came on a home run by Tiger shortstop Calvin Weeks, and two more scored on a line single by Craig White.

Mike Scarce took over the pitching duties in the second inning and struck out eight batters before falling apart in the fifth inning. With two outs, Scarce gave up six straight hits worth five runs.

Florida State got its first hit of the day in the third inning when Scarce lined a single to centerfield. The Tribe got another hit in the sixth, and finally got a sustained batting effort in the seventh inning with six hits and four runs, two on a double by first baseman Dan Roatche.

Florida State added three more runs in the ninth inning, but there was no way to match the output of the Tigers.

Clemson is now 18-11 for the season, while Florida State is 26-10. The Seminoles meet the Tigers again today at 3 o'clock, then travel to Athens for a doubleheader with the University of Georgia tomorrow afternoon.
