

Held to just two hits the night before, Florida State shelled University of Florida pitching for a dozen Saturday night — including seven for extra bases — and closed its 1971 season with a 7-0 victory at Seminole Field.

The victory enabled the Seminoles to take the season series between the two state rivals 3-2 and left them with a final 41-16 record. The Gators, suffering through just their third losing season since Bill Fuller became head coach in 1948, ended their campaign 19-26.

The big bats of senior Doug Kasimier and Larry Cocks, playing their final game as a Seminole, and junior Herb Sikes, a former Leon High standout, sparked Florida State at the plate, while Bill Fuller, Barry McQueen and Mac Scarce combined to shut off the Gainesville visitors' hitting.

Kasimier slammed a 350-foot homer, a double and a single, Cocks a triple and double and Sikes a triple, double and single to account for two-thirds of the Seminole hits.

Cocks got it all going with

Cocks got it all going with one out in the first inning when he ripped a low line-drive down the first base line for a standup triple. Senior Ron Cash, the leading Seminole hitter for the season, followed with a booming ground-rule double over the right centerfield fence to get FSU on the scoreboard.

Cash moved to third on Harry Saferight's infield grounder and came home on Sikes' double down the leftfield line.

Kasimier made it 3-0 in the second inning with his solo homer on the second pitch of the inning.

UF pitcher Doug Corbett then settled down, however, to retire the next Seminoles in order before Kasimier got it going again in the fourth with a double to the corner in rightfield.

Senior Greg Gromek

Senior Greg Gromek followed with a run-scoring single to center and pitcher Fuller punched a base hit through shortstop as the UF defender was moving to cover second against Gromek who was running on the pitch. The Gators escaped further

trouble, however, getting Dave Nichols to pop out to first baseman John Sutton in foul territory.

Sikes tripled and scored in the sixth inning, coming home on Kasimier's third straight hit, a single which just made it through the hole between the first and second basemen.

The final two runs were added in the seventh as Cocks led off with a double and promptly stole third. Cash walked and Saferight bounced out to the infield for the fourth straight time, scoring Cocks and moving Cash to second. Then Sikes singled to leftcenter to shove the runner home.

Fuller worked the first five innings and was credited with his ninth victory against two

losses. It was his second victory against the Gators. The sophomore lefthander left when a muscle just above his elbow starting tightening.

McQueen worked the next three innings, surviving Florida's biggest scoring threat in the eighth inning with a bit of nifty pitching.

Will Harmon led off the frame for the Gators with an infield single and Tony Dobies followed with a double down the leftfield line, putting runners at second and third and nobody out.

McQueen got pinch-hitter Tom Delaney to pop out to Sikes at third on the first pitch, struck out Rick Scarborough, then retired Glenn Hurst on a fly to center.

Scarce then came on in the ninth and fanned three straight Gators to record his 18th save of the season.

Corbett's record dropped to 6-8 with the loss. He worked six and a third innings, giving up all seven runs and 12 hits.

Bob Kowalski finished the game on the mound for Florida, allowing just a walk during his stint.

Florida left 10 base runners stranded, including two in the first, second, fifth and eighth innings. They had a man on third only in the eighth, however. Dobies and Harmon had two hits each to pace UF's seven-hit attack.
