Seminoles, UF Divide

The University of Florida assured itself of a winning season and saddled Florida State with its most defeats in a season, but Saturday's doubleheader split did absolutely nothing to break the team's career series deadlock.

FSU came back to capture the second game 4-3 after the Gators, now 22-19, won the opener 6-2. The split left the all-time series tied at 35-35-1. The two play a single game in Gainesville today and again Monday, with both hoping to break the deadlock.

The Seminoles' opening game defeat was their 24th this season.

However, a backfiring Florida gamble opened the way for the Seminoles in the fifth inning of the nightcap, and they held the Gators off for win No. 36.

Steve Tebbetts and Randy Davidson opened the decisive Seminole fifth with walks, and freshman Jim Busby sacrificed

both along. Tebbetts then scored on Jim Foxwell's grounder to short as the Gators tried unsuccessfully for the play at the plate.

FSU had jumped out to a 3-0 lead with an unearned run in the first and Guillermo Bonilla's two-run single in the third.

Florida came back with an unearned run in the fourth and John Fuller smacked a two-run home run, his second of the day, in the sixth to narrow the gap to one.

The Gators then threatened again in the seventh, but pitcher Terry Farer ended the threat and the game by picking off Sammy Rick at second base.

Farmer went the distance for the third time in his last four outings and raised his record to 6-4.

First game starter Danny O'Brien was not as fortunate.

Florida scored two runs in the second and two in the third with Fuller's first home run of the day the highlight.

UF's Doug Corbett proved to be an iron man, coming back to pitch a complete game in the opener after going five innings before Friday's rainout, that was officially declared a 0-0 tie.

Corbett shut down the Seminoles until the seventh when Bonilla powered a two-run homer over the left field fence. He had registered 11 scoreless innings before Bonilla had his say.
