Tigers tamed by FSU

Ed Schneider had to work for it. The night portion of Florida State's Wednesday doubleheader against Auburn would not come as easy for the Seminoles as the day game.

That one ended 21-7, as Auburn committed four errors in an 11-run second inning and walked 16 hitters overall. "I thought we played terri-bly," said Auburn Coach Paul Nix. No one was arguing.

The Seminoles led 21-1 after five innings. Jim Weaver and Lionel Martinez each drove in five runs and Ken Fischer pitched the first seven innings to win his fourth.

But it took a complete game from Schneider, a three-hit shutout, for the Seminoles to subdue the Tigers 2-0 in the nightcap for an FSU sweep of the Southeastern Conference team.

Florida State, winners of nine straight, is 27-5. Auburn slipped to

Schneider, now 6-0, couldn't even remember the last time he went the distance. It wasn't this season; his longe... previous effort this year was six innings. It wasn't last season, when he was at Indian River Community College, because Schneider had a pulled shoulder muscle and was use-

In between, last autumn, he stretched a tendon in his left elbow, the one he uses to pitch. So he rested, not picking up a baseball or doing anything risky.

Now he's doing some pushups and isometrics and throwing three-hitters and has an earned run average of about one.

"It's psychological, getting yourself to think you're not hurt," said the hard-throwing junior who has been drafted by the professionals four times.

"Dr. (Doug) Henderson (the team physician) told me I would pitch the rest of my life with pain. I'm used to

it now. It's there, but I don't feel it." Schneider felt heat from Auburn just once, when the Tigers, trailing 20, had runners on second and third with two out in the eighth. Barry Panter, the Tigers' lead-off hitter, was at

Schneider got two quick strikes. "I told him, 'Here comes a fastball, right in your kitchen,' " catcher Craig

Ramsey said.

Panter stood like a statue as a fastball blew across the middle of the plate for called strike three.

"I guess he thought a curve ball was coming," Ramsey said. "It was his fault," said Schneider.

"He didn't swing the bat."

Schneider almost was matched by Tiger pitcher Mark Shiflett, who en-tered the game in the second inning after starter John Hanson injured his

In seven innings, Shiflett allowed just six hits. But one was a single by Rick Figueredo that scored Weaver in the fifth, and two more were backto-back doubles in the seventh by Figueredo and Lionel Martinez.

That was enough support for Schneider, who allowed his first hit in the fifth inning when Dan Weingarten singled off the pitcher's glove.

Weingarten and Jeff Ledbetter had instigated a brief bench-clearing episode in the fourth. Ledbetter was picked off first base for the second time in two innings, and was caught in a rundown. He attempted to redeem himself by crashing into the Auburn first baseman with hopes of knocking the ball loose.

Ledbetter threw his 210 pounds into Weingarten, who lost not the ball, but his temper. He went after Ledbetter but no damage was inflicted as the benches emptied and the players held one another back.

Ledbetter and Weaver each have 13 homers to lead the team. Weaver, with his five RBIs in Game 1, now leads Ledbetter, 47-45, for team bonors in that department.
