

## Seminoles hold off Gators 14-10

Florida State exploded for seven runs with two out in the bottom of the eighth inning and went on to claim a 14-10 victory over Florida Wednesday night at Seminole Field.

The victory, FSU's 17th in 20 games, moved the Seminoles to 26-11. Florida is 16-8. The teams, which split a pair of games in Gainesville last month, play again tonight at 7:30.

FSU center fielder Mike Fuentes had two singles and walked three times but failed to reach the NCAA career home run record set by the Atlanta Braves' Bob Horner from 1976-78 while at Arizona State. Fuentes has 55 career homers (18 this season) and is one short of Horner's mark.

Displaying a total disregard for the soggy, slightly foggy conditions, the two teams combined for 25 hits, five home runs (including two grand slams) and committed only one error.

"It's amazing with the conditions we had tonight that both teams played so well defensively," said FSU coach Mike Martin. "With 25 hits and only one error, you'd have to say it was a well-played game."

The lone error was committed by FSU right fielder Mike Yastrzemski in the third when he allowed Ron Cardieri's single to scoot under his glove, scoring one run and advancing Cardieri to second. The error, Yastrzemski's third of the season, moved FSU's total to 83.

That aside, it was a well-played, exciting contest watched by the season's second-largest crowd of 2,283.

Florida took the first lead, reaching starter Rick Hatcher for two runs on a

double, single and triple in the third. FSU erased that margin the next inning behind Mark Lacy and Mark Barineau.

Lacy, who extended his hitting streak to 15 games, led off the fourth with a towering homer (his fifth) to left-center. Two outs later, with runners on first and second, Barineau unloaded his second round-tripper of the year, a blast over the right-field wall that pushed FSU to a 4-2 lead.

FSU added two runs the next inning and seemed to have the game in hand. Then came the seventh inning.

Batting around, Florida scored five runs, highlighted by shortstop Steve Lombardozzi's grand slam, to take a 7-6 lead. All five runs came against Hatcher with two outs. Jamie Shouppe came on in relief and walked a batter before inducing a pop-up to short by Dave Falcone.

FSU tied the score in its half of the

inning on a walk to Mike Fuentes and singles by Jeff Ledbetter and Lacy.

Then the explosion. After pinch-hitter Lionel Martinez grounded out, Barineau walked and was forced at second on Don DeLoach's grounder to third. Fuentes singled DeLoach to second before Ledbetter stroked a single for the go-ahead run, leaving runners at first and third.

Lacy walked to load the bases and Yastrzemski sent a low fastball downtown for his fourth homer of the year and the game's second grand slam. Joe Licata followed with a single, Chris Cawthon walked and Martinez, up for the second time in the inning, doubled to left to give FSU a seemingly insurmountable 14-7 lead.

But with the crowd filing out, Florida reached Shouppe for a pair of walks with two outs. Third baseman Mike Henley, who hit .432 for the Gators last season but entered this game bat-

ting only .250, smashed his second hit of the game, a three-run homer over the left-field wall.

Jay Keeler replaced Shouppe and struck out Steve Floyd to end the game.

"We didn't get any help at the end from our bullpen," said Florida coach Jay Bergman, who used four hurlers. The third pitcher, Scott Rickerson (0-2), picked up the loss. "All the games we've lost in the late innings have been because of that."

Martin, who used three pitchers, was not as dismayed.

"I thought Rick threw good. He had one bad pitch," said Martin, referring to the Lombardozzi grand slam. "Jamie was aiming the ball because he knew they were taking strikes. But that's really the first time he's had trouble with his control this season."

Shouppe (2-1) picked up the win but walked three in two innings.
