

FSU Scores in Each Period to Beat Newberry, 24-0

Seminoles Overcome Staggering Penalties

SETZLER FIELD, NEWBERRY, S.C., Oct. 21.—Florida State University's Seminoles overcame the effects of a mountainous total of penalties, a wet field and a gallant Newberry College eleven to fashion a 24-0 triumph here tonight that kept the Floridians among the ranks of the nation's undefeated and untied teams.

The victory was the fourth of the season for Coach Don Veller's husky Garnet and Gold squad, and the loss was the sixth straight for the luckless Newberry team. And it spoiled Newberry's Homecoming.

FSU punched over a score in each of the four quarters, while keeping the Newberry attack pretty well bottled up with a hard-charging line and an alert secondary.

ITALIANO AND SELLERS

Halfback Nelson Italiano and fullback Mike Sellers paced the FSU attack. Italiano figured in three of the scores, passing for two and running for one. Sellers failed to score, but it was his thrusts into the line when the chips were down that kept the Seminoles on the move.

The Seminoles scored in the opening minutes of the game without relinquishing the ball after the kickoff. Italiano, filling in for the injured Dick Peterson, speared little Eddie Gray with a pass on a play that covered 80 yards. Gray took the ball on his 45 and outraced the pursuers to the goal.

Italiano hit paydirt himself late in the second period when he shook free on a 33-yard scoring dash over tackle.

Early in the third quarter FSU marched 40 yards to score after a 35-yard punt return by Harry Bringger moved the ball over into Newberry territory. Italiano and Dick Turk sparked the drive, with Turk getting the last yard with a drive into the line.

FINAL TD

The final TD came on a 20-yard pass from Italiano to end Clint Thomas in the end zone.

Little Ernie Huggett, placekicking specialist, had a rough evening, getting none for four. Penalties robbed him of two conversions, however.

The Seminoles, who ate up 304 yards along the ground and added another 95 through the airplanes, were hit for a staggering total of 190 yards in penalties and had to overcome assessments practically every time they got their hands on the ball.

Newberry too, came in for its share of setbacks, losing 110 yards in penalties as the officials practically took over the play of the ball game with an almost weird display of flag throwing.

Newberry made only one serious threat all night, getting to the Seminole 15-yard line after a pass interception had given them an opportunity in the first period.

Quarterback Charlie Berry's passing and running provided most of the spark for the South Carolinians with an occasional boost from Max DuBose.

Most of the time the big Florida line, led by Dwight Osha, Dub Kendrick and Earl O'Neal kept the Indians locked up on the ground. When the forwards missed, linebacker Mike Sellers was there to stop the ball carriers.

Bringger and Wayne Benner thwarted the Newberry air game with alert work in the secondary.

The game was played in an almost constant drizzle. A crowd of 1,200 saw the tilt.

FIRST QUARTER

Eddie Gray took the opening kickoff three yards deep in his end zone and brought it out to the FSU 17, and the Seminoles started through the mud and drizzle to their first score.

After each team had drawn the first of the many penalties that were to follow, Sellers cracked five yards back up to the 22 and Italiano skirted right end for a first down on the 31. Gray moved to the 40, but the play was nullified by a penalty that set the Floridians back to their own 16. Sellers ployed to the 20, and on the next play Italiano faded back and speared Gray with a pass on the 45. Taking the ball over his shoulder in back of the Newberry secondary, the fleet Gray outraced the opposition to score on a play that covered 80 yards. Huggett's kick was good, but the Seminoles were penalized back to their 17, and the attempted boot from there missed.

Generating a little steam of its own Newberry drove to the FSU 40, but Benner stole a pass on the 12 and came out to the 19 to halt the threat. The South Carolina squad kept FSU backed up in its own territory through the remainder of the period.

SECOND QUARTER

Getting underway again, FSU drove 75 yards to the Newberry 8 before a penalty set them back, and the ball went over on the 10. Newberry kicked out to Bringger on the 45. He came back to the 31 and the Tribe was rolling again. Italiano sliced off right tackle, shook over tacklers at the 20 and 17 and galloped to the score. Huggett's kick was wide

and it was 12-0 with time running out in the half.

The Seminoles kicked off to Newberry and the half ended with the ball on the 48.

THIRD QUARTER

FSU kicked off to Newberry to open the second half, and forced the Indians to punt after limiting them to two yards in three tries. Bringger took Berry's boot on his own 25 and whizzed back 35

yards to the enemy 40. With Italiano and Turk alternating in thrusts at the line FSU rolled to the five. Turk took over from there and slammed across in three lunges, getting three, one and the final yard. Huggett missed with his kick and it was 18-0.

The two teams see-sawed around midfield for the remainder of the period.

FOURTH QUARTER

After the ball had traded hands without any serious threats during the first portion of the final period, the Seminoles took the bit in their teeth again when Lanton intercepted a Berry pass on the Newberry 20 and went to the 15.

Another penalty rocked the Seminoles back to 30. Sutherland went to the 24 and FSU moved to the 20 when a penalty nullified a pass interception for Newberry and set the South Carolina squad back on its own 20.

Italiano passed to end Clint Thomas in the end zone for the score.

Huggett's kick was good but the Seminoles caught another penalty to the 17 and the succeeding placement was short from there.

The game ended after FSU had kicked off to Newberry again.
