IT'S EASY BEING GREENE

Rashad Greene has made his ascent up the career receiving record charts seem easy and America once again got to see just how good the senior is with a 203 yard receiving performance. Greene set a new career high with his yards tonight (previous best was 163) and he was just one catch short of tying his best mark for single game receptions as well. Greene passed Greg Carr and Kez McCorvey and moved from sixth to fourth place on the all-time career receiving yards list (2668).

GOING GREENE

Rashad Greene joined elite company tonight with his 203 yard receiving performance. Greene became just the sixth FSU player ever to record 200+ receiving yards in a single game. His 203 yards ranks as the 11th-best performance in the history of FSU football. College Football Hall of Famer Ron Sellers had five 200+ receiving yard games in his illustrious FSU career.

THAT'S EIGHT

Reigning Heisman Trophy winner Jameis Winston once again broke 300 yards with his 370 yard passing performance tonight. The redshirt sophomore has gone over 300 yards passing eight times in 15 starts in his short career. That is already good enough for a tie for fifth all-time at FSU. On top of his big night through the air, Winston added the longest run of his career with a 28-yard TD run.

JALEN UP THE OPPONENT

Jalen Ramsey had a freshman All-American 2013 but he never had double digit tackles in a game that is before tonight. Ramsey set a new career high for tackles with eight at the half and added on to that number in the second half to finish with 12.

NATE THE GREAT

After leading FSU with four interceptions last year, sophomore Nate Andrews wasted little time adding number five and turning it into six. This was the first pick six for the Noles since E.J. Levenberry took one back 78 yards versus Idaho on November 23, 2013.

WHAT A START

Nate Andrews beating FSU's explosive offense to the first TD of the season probably wasn't what anyone expected but the sophomore scored the first TD of 2014 on a nine-yard pick six. It was the first opening TD of the season to come via the defense since Antonio Cromartie had a 61-yard fumble return at Miami in 2004.

FIRST TOUCH, FIRST TD

Not a bad start for Mario Pender. The redshirt sophomore is following in the footsteps of his backfield partner Karlos Williams. The first touch of Pender's career went 11 yards for a Seminoles' TD. Versus Nevada last year, Williams took his first carry at running back 65 yards for a TD.

FIRST STARTS

The season opener tonight in AT&T Stadium marks the first career starts for FB Freddie Stevenson, LB Reggie Northrup and LS Stephen Gabbard. It will also be the first ever start on **OFFENSE** for running back Karlos Williams. His only previous start was at linebacker versus Georgia Tech in the 2012 ACC Championship Game.

ALL-WHITE

This is the first time the Seminoles have worn all white uniforms since a 2009 loss to USF. That was a home game but FSU wore the all whites in conjunction with a white out promotion. The last time Florida State wore all whites away from Doak was in 2007 versus Clemson, a game the Seminoles lost 24-18. In 2005, FSU lost in the all whites again at Virginia 26-21. The last win in all white uniforms was 2004 at NC State 17-10.

YOUNG TWO-DEEP

Despite the Seminoles returning 15 starters from the 2013 National Championship team, this is still a young roster. On today's flip card, there are 20 freshmen or sophomores on the two-deep.

THE OKLAHOMA STATE LOSS...

- Was the Cowboys' first season-opening defeat since a 35-14 setback at Georgia in 2007.
- Moved the Cowboys to 9-6 in their last 15 games against ranked opponents.
- Moved the Cowboys to 15-3 in their last 18 non-conference games.
- Moved the Cowboys to 11-3 in their last 14 games played in the state of Texas, dating back to 2010.
- Moved the Cowboys to 4-2 in their last six neutral-site games.
- Oklahoma State captains for today's game were FB Teddy Johnson, DT James Castleman, FB Jeremy Seaton and QB J.W. Walssh.
- Oklahoma State had 11 players make their first start as a Cowboy, including Zac Veatch, Zachary Crabtree, Marcell Ateman, Tyreek Hill, Emmanuel Ogbah, Ofa Hautau, Josh Furman, Seth Jacobs, Larry Stephens, Jordan Sterns and Ashton Lampkin.
- OSU has scored 20 or more points in 53 consecutive games dating back to the start of the 2010 season. That streak is the longest active streak in the country and the second-longest since Division I split into the FBS/FCS in 1978, trailing only USC's 63 straight games of 20 or more points from Sept. 2, 2002 through Nov. 25, 2006.
- FSU only gave up more 20 points in two games last year.
- A total of 14 freshmen played for the Cowboys, including seven true freshmen. The redshirt freshman include Jeral Morrow, Tre Flowers, Zachary Crabtree, Kaleb Smith, Vili Levini, Vincent Taylor and Dawson Bassett. The true freshmen were Dylan Harding, Gyasi Akem, Chris Lacy, Ramon Richards, Justin Phillips, Juwan Offrey and James Washington.
- Oklahoma State intercepted FSU QB Jameis Winston twice, which ties for the most in one game in his career. Winston threw just 10 interceptions in 2013.
- Seth Jacobs recorded the first interception of his career in the second quarter.
- The Cowboys have forced at least one turnover in 22-straight games.
- Desmond Roland scored on a 1-yard run in the second quarter. In 2013, he led the Big 12 in touchdowns scored with 16.
- Emmanuel Ogbah's second quarter sack was the fifth sack of his career. He added his second of the game and sixth of his career in the fourth.
- Ashton Lampkin's second quarter interception was the second of his career.
- David Glidden's 55-yard touchdown catch to in the second-quarter was longest reception of his career and his second TD grab. It capped a three-play, 76-yard drive of 58 seconds.
- With that drive, OSU has at least one touchdown drive of faster than two minutes in each of its last 36 games and in 52 of its last 53 contests.
- No team was within three points of FSU during a second half last season. Oklahoma State cut the FSU lead to 20-17 in the third quarter and 27-24 in the fourth.

Quotes From Coach Jimbo Fisher and Jameis Winston

THE MODERATOR: Coach has joined us now. Coach, congratulations on tonight's win and your thoughts about the game?

COACH JIMBO FISHER: Well, first of all, I would like to thank everyone here at the Cotton Bowl and at the Cowboy Classic. This is a tremendous venue. This is a tremendous place to play a game, a great atmosphere, a great experience for our kids to be on this stage. And I think we'll learn a lot from that. And, you know, right now I think, as a team, we're a work in progress. We all know that. We have some good players. But we still have to play good. And I have to coach better. And we all have to look at ourselves in all three phases and get better.

But, still, our team, we understand how to win games, and we're doing a good job. I'm proud of them for doing that. You know, a lot of credit to Oklahoma State. I thought they did a heck of a job. I told you Mike has a got a good football team, and he's a heck of a football coach. He has done a great job for a long time.

And I think hopefully this will be a good learning lesson for our guys in that, you know, you got to play great. It is not about being great; it is about playing great. And our preparation and things, we got to get better. We got to hone in on some little things and all the phases of what's going on. And, as I say, we are in an opening game and hopefully we'll make a lot of improvements in the next week and keep getting better.

And like I said, last year's team was the same way. We got better every week. We've got to continue to do that. But last year is over, and I think tonight I think will help us get over that. I think we were still not living in that way. We all preached that, but I felt they felt the pressure of being number one, I really do. And so now I think we can relax and realize we got to go play football. That's over with. Now relax and be the team we can be and move on down the road. And I'm looking forward. I still think we still have a chance to be a very good football team. Anxious to coach these boys. Questions.

Q. Coach, can you talk about how well your defense was able to contain Hill, Number 24 of the Cowboys, because he was all over the place?

COACH FISHER: Well, he did. We lost leverage. We lost leverage on the edge at times. And they got the ball in different ways and did heck of a job. He was one heck of a football player. Like I said, we recruited that young man. We knew how good he was,

Q. Jimbo, human nature, you have been through this before, winning a national championship is to let down, you know, be the hunter instead of the hunted. How did you deal with that and how do you deal with it now?

COACH FISHER: You constantly educate, but I think tonight is a great learning tool. Again, I don't think we let down. I think we were just worrying, and once we got going, the worrying, okay, I don't want to lose this game. Worrying about results. I keep telling them, you don't worry about results. You worry about the process of playing well, executing well, doing the little things. The results will come.

And quit worrying about everybody else's expectations and play your own game.

Q. At that point in the game, that intentional grounding by Mario Edwards that he caused, I mean, how big was that for y'all?

COACH FISHER: Very critical. It changed the momentum and gave us the ball back where we could get points. And we dad-gum had a little rail rap. We ran that almost out-of-bounds and got it back. And that cost us a situation there. But that was a big play by Mario. A critical, critical play by Mario.

Q. Did it seem like week one was more about surviving it than winning it when you say your players were just trying to get over that hump?

COACH FISHER: I think we were once we got into the game. That's what it seemed like in the game. And the thing I was proud about in our game which is very rare and hard to overcome at times, we lost momentum of the game. They had momentum in the football game. And usually the team that wins momentum wins the game. That's why I'm very proud of -- we never had momentum, but we kept fighting, scratching, and clawing and figured out a way to win the game. But I do think what you said is true.

Q. Seemed like your one steady influence on offense was Rashad Greene. Just talk about his performance, what he gave you.

COACH FISHER: I mean, just being where he was supposed to be when he was supposed to be there, Rashad is, like I said, he's -- he's that rock. He always has been. He has been the guy that's kind of -- he is not under the radar when you look at the numbers, but he is at the point because he is so quiet and unassuming. But he can play

Q. I wonder, can you describe what you saw when J.W. Walsh went around the end there and P.J. got to him? What did you see as that play unfolded?

COACH FISHER: Oh, when he cut him, when he went out, as he was coming down, he was losing track of the ball when it hit the ground. And he flipped him and that was a critical play and got the turnover.

Q. Jimbo, can you talk about Jameis' play? He had some nice throws, but maybe also forced a couple --

COACH FISHER: He did. He forced -- he got a ball at 3rd and 10 down there with -- you know, I was disappointed that we dropped the ball first -- that drive down was there was critical. We were up 10-nothing. Dropped the ball in the flat for a 5-yard gain. And we missed a slant, which might have scored or got down there, and then we, third down, we got a little greedy one time. And then right before half, we hit the first down. We go two minutes once we get to the 30, we felt very comfortable. We had to go and, you know, he just tried to squeeze the ball in there. And, you know, sometimes that's what great players do. But then he got his bearings back.

And, you know, I mean, lost feel for the game, got it back, come back and played, and played a pretty good second half. So -- but he did. He forced two balls there. And we'll learn from it and get better.

Q. Coach, how big was J.W. Walsh in the second half in keeping Oklahoma State in that game?

COACH FISHER: Well, I thought him and Tyreek Hill and all those guys, they were throwing the football, running the quarterback runs and getting to the edge. And I told you, they got a great football team and always have done a good job there. And they were very instrumental in leading that team.

Q. Jimbo, you played -- looked like you played very well coming out of the gate. What do you think happened?

COACH FISHER: Well, I just think, you know, sometimes when you play well and you have had success, and they made plays. We just -- we didn't have the red zone

opportunity. When you have chances to put people away and get up three scores, that changes the game. When you get up three scores -- we were up 10-0, we threw the pick down there. And then we come back, got up 17-0, we gave up a drive. A little disappointed we weren't kicking the ball like we wanted, as deep and as long, and the places we were. And they were getting field position. They got that drive before half to make it 17-7. And then when we went -- maybe I shouldn't have went two minutes, but I always do. We hit the 30. I feel very confident in Jameis and our players. That's what where we go two minutes, we had a minute left in the half, we had two time-outs. We were able to move the ball there.

And we threw a pick, and that lost the momentum. Now, we got the score coming out again, but, again, we got stopped in the red zone. That's one thing, we didn't play -- we didn't convert touchdowns in the red zone. We had to kick some field goals. And then they came back and hit the bubble pump and then hit the guy in the seam and all of a sudden the momentum is changing. It is a real ball game.

Q. Talk a little bit about Jameis' touchdown run. You almost become a fan when you watch him run like that and he hurdles people and spins around.

COACH FISHER: He does. He becomes a competitor. I mean, that's the thing about him that you love when you coach him. Even when he is not playing at his best or whatever goes on, there's still a competitor in him if I got to run, I got to hit somebody, I got to get hit, whatever I got to do to get in the end zone or make plays for my team, that's what he does. And that was a heck of a play.

Q. Are you surprised -- or do you think that Jameis has the trust in the other receivers? He seems to be targeting Rashad Greene over and over again. Is that sight taking longer than you thought it was?

COACH FISHER: No, because I called it. Game was on the line.

(Laughter)

Game was on the line. You go to your money guy. And he was a guy -- tried -- you know, O'Leary. But one of the things they were doing, they were playing some leverage on Nick, too, that created leverage for him to get open. And that was what we was going back to. I mean, if you're able to get your best player the ball, you keep getting your best player the ball. He had -- 89 made some real nice plays in the game. Caught a nice post and got some balls. I think Kermit had, what, four or five catches in the game. Caught some nice balls in the flat. I think all those -- where's the numbers at right here?

Let me see. Rashad had 11. Carlos had 5. Kermit, 3. Nick O'Leary, 3. And Christian had 2, but he had the one big post and he had the big play in the beginning. He probably had about 70, 80 yards of receiving, too. So ...

Q. Jimbo, how good was it to get Mario Pender on the field in that first run he had?

COACH FISHER: Really good. I tell you what, the first carry and got in the end zone. And this guy is going to be a player. Will get him more. And we got to get Dalvin, too. We had a plan to get Dalvin. The game got crazy. And we'll get him in the game, I promise. He is ready to play. We'll get him in there too. But I was very proud of Mario in the game. I mean, just the look in his eye when he was on the sideline and coming off and telling you what was going on. I mean, it wasn't starry eyed. It was a guy that, hey, I'm in this game and fit in. He will be a heck of a player for us.

Q. In that first half, it looked like Jameis had some open lanes to take off and run with it. But is it something you don't want him to do? Or does he have free --

COACH FISHER: No. He has free run to do whatever. I mean, he -- first half, he had those two interceptions. But other than that, I think he played pretty well. He had the two forced plays. But he has got to be able to run the football. He can scramble and do some things. Actually, there was a couple times I wished he'd have thrown the ball away, take a couple of sacks that I didn't think that he should have taken and put us in bad field position. We got to work on that and get the ball out of his hand.

Q. You touched on it when you started talking. Do you think it could end up being a good thing that you were challenged?

COACH FISHER: No doubt. Anytime you get challenged in adversity, and again, we didn't ever swing the momentum. They still had the momentum at the end of the game. And then -- but you know what was critical? We were able to go out and get that first down and Greene at the end of the day and get that big first down to run the clock down was very critical. Again, doing little things that we had to win it. We didn't play well, like we wanted to play. A lot of credit goes to Oklahoma State. But we still made critical plays when we had to make critical plays. And there is something to that.

Q. You did mention -- as good as Pender has looked, you did have more trouble running the football, I think, than you anticipated?

COACH FISHER: Oh, much more. They did a great job.

Q. What were they doing upfront?

COACH FISHER: They moved and ran to our spots and then got safety downs involved. That's why we were able to get the play action shots.

They were getting eight, nine guys involved in the run. Their safeties are playing nine yards deep, eight yards deep. They were triggering and coming downhill quickly.

They were doing a good job upfront and getting penetration, getting nine guys down in there and forcing us to throw the football. That's why we were able to hit some of those big passes over the top.

When you play quarters and you get seven, your front four, your three backers, and then those two safeties, that's really a nine-man box when you are starting to go that way. They did a real nice job. They really did.

It was hard fought-out yards that Carlos had in that ball game.

Q. Coach, it seemed like your defensive line rotation was pretty small in this game going against an up-tempo team? Were those guys getting worn out a little bit?

COACH FISHER: Maybe a little bit. With a loss of not having a couple of guys that we normally have there, we got to get that rotation bigger and feel more comfortable playing more guys. And some guys got to play better in practice and then we will put them in the football game.

We are going to need everybody. That's the way it's going to be. It will be a long season, and we got to keep developing these guys. Sometimes when you get in the

THE MODERATOR: Coach, opening comments?

COACH MIKE GUNDY: Obviously, we were extremely disappointed in the end of the game. And I told the team -- in our punt game, our special teams, that's my responsibility. I didn't see that coming. And, ultimately, at the end, there was some plays they made; there were some plays we made. But our inability to punt the ball like we needed to, based on just proper execution, is what -- really what cost us the game. And so we'll get that cleaned up in the next game.

THE MODERATOR: All right. We'll open it up for questions. Again, grab a microphone. Raise your hand.

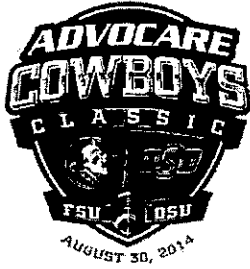
Q. Mike, could you talk about just the overall effort? I mean, you know, you guys were sizeable underdogs, and you had the chance to win the game on several occasions. Were you surprised by that, or did you fully expect the kind of effort you got from your guys tonight?

COACH GUNDY: Well, you don't ever know what to expect with so many young players on the field. But there was not any fear in any of their eyes. We had tremendous leadership from our veteran players, and our freshmen played. They played hard. And they made some mistakes, but they made mistakes going full speed. And that's the future of your program. The guys didn't have the deer-in-the-headlights look at all. You know, we played a great football team. But they stood toe to toe.

The disappointing part of it is that that's the third game in a row we've lost with five minutes to go we had a chance to win. Same thing in the Cotton Bowl, same thing Oklahoma. So we have to find a way to finish. As coaches, we got to look, we got to research, come up with a way -- myself. Starts with me, staff, and all the way down to the players. But I'm very proud of our team, the way they competed; and they didn't back down from anybody.

Q. Coach, do you see the benefit of playing a game like this so early on? Would you rather avoid these kind of opponents and nonconference schedule in the future?

COACH GUNDY: Well, there's been a lot of talk about scheduling. I'm not so sure that you want to jump on the returning national champion in preseason. But, you know, there's always discussions that we have and try to find out what's best for our team based on maturity and

Q. You got some big plays out of J.W. Walsh tonight but also a few mistakes. How would you grade his performance?

I'm not trying to -- Jameis Winston is a great player. I'm not trying to take it away. When you're competing in a game like we had tonight, there's going to be some good plays and there's going to be some bad plays.

Q. Mike, there was a lot of talk about Tyreek in the preseason, and you didn't shoot it down. Obviously, you guys felt like you had something special there. And do you feel like we saw that tonight?

COACH GUNDY: Well, we know he's fast. We've confirmed that because those guys chasing him are fast. And he competed. You know? It all comes down to competition. And he is what is known as a great track athlete that has had success in football. And it was just one game for him. But he certainly was willing to stand toe to toe. And that's what it takes. I mean, you've got to have guys who can compete. He's just blessed with tremendous speed and ability.

So I was proud of the way that he competed, and our team kind of rallied around him. I thought our offensive staff did a great job with using him in certain ways. Had a really good plan.

The three plans that we had since May I thought were really good. Again, we failed to execute the punt. But other than that, without watching tape, I don't see a lot of areas that me, as the head coach, would be disappointed in the game plans that we had going into the game.

Q. Mike, down 17-0, what did you feel changed for your-all's team that got you back in the ball game?

COACH GUNDY: Well, three offensive linemen playing for the first time ever in their college career. And I think the first quarter, the other team was really strong and really fast. And I don't really know how you prepare them for that. And they settled down, and they started to adjust to the strength and the speed of their down guys, and they got a little better as the game went on.

Q. 38 was all over the field, Emmanuel Ogbah. If you could kind of tell us about him and what you saw from the side line and how he played tonight.

COACH GUNDY: Well, you know, we've talked in preseason. And I felt very good about our

defensive front. We have some maturity; we have depth; we have leadership; we have strength, guys who have been in our program for a number of years and been developing in our strength conditioning program. And he's got a chance to be a good player. As long as he continues to work hard and pay the price, he should get better and better each week.

Q. You know, going into a season with so many questions about experience and everything like that, even though you lose this game, do you think it's a bit of a statement that you guys are able to hang so tough with the number one team in the country?

COACH GUNDY: I think the one thing we proved is that the young players and this team won't back down from anybody. But I'm going to go back to we had a chance to win with five minutes left. And we had the same opportunity in the Cotton Bowl and the same opportunity at the last game of the year. So, as the coaching staff -- I really mean this -- we have to find a way to come up with a plan. I don't know what that is. I'll take any recommendations anybody has, if they work. And then we have to instill that in our players.

So if you're asking if it's a moral victory, there's really no moral victories. You lose 80-10 or you lose -- whatever we lost -- 37-31, it still is a loss. But what I had mentioned to you guys before the game and leading up to the month is that I needed the guys to play hard. I need them to understand and execute the game plan. And I need them to be physical and tough. And, without watching tape, I'm going to say that they played that way tonight. And I go back to we have great leadership with our veteran players in Game 1. Still a long season. And then we had freshmen running down the field and playing hard. And I couldn't be more proud of them because, you know, you think you're playing high school ball next year -- or last year, and then the next game you're playing against the returning national champion. That's a little different.

Q. Mike, you had the bad snap on the punt late. You had one earlier, sort of went to the -- one of the outbacks. Can you just describe what that was? It wasn't a design fake, I'm guessing.

COACH GUNDY: Without -- well, I'm not going to say. That's a good thought, John. You can tell you're a veteran guy. It was a fake. It went bad.

I don't have an answer for you. And during the game, we try to do the best to get the information we can, but you really -- there's so many things going on. We didn't have good information. Then it happened again. And I'm not really sure because -- you guys will know better than me. I don't know that we've had a bad snap or two in my eight years. And so we'll get to the bottom of it.

That's what disappointed me in that when I said I did not see that coming. And so we have to

Q. How does the young guys playing well -- how does that change your expectations for what this team can accomplish this year?

COACH GUNDY: Well, we have high expectations. I mentioned that early in the year. People asked questions about what direction our team is going. And the answer is that we have a few veteran players that understand, and there's a big gap. And we have a lot of young kids that we think are good players that don't have a clue.

So it's encouraging. And I go back to that they had a chance to back down, and nobody really would have said anything. You know, returning national champion comes to town and guys got a little scared and backed down a little bit. Everybody would have said, well, that's okay; let's get ready to play next week. They didn't back down.

So, as a coach, then what we're instilling in them is working, in my opinion. The challenge for our guys is tomorrow they got to go back to work to get ready for the next game. And in college football, those great victories, they don't last long. And then, when you have a tough loss like this, they can't last long either because you've got to get ready for the next one.
