

FSU Golfers Bow to Miami In Dual Match

ATLANTA, Ga.—Florida State University's golf team suffered its first loss of the season yesterday when they met the University of Miami in a dual meet here. The Seminoles played as a warm-up for the Southern Intercollegiate Golf tourney which opens today. The dual meet score was Miami 11, FSU 7.

Both teams turned in low scores but the 'Canes held the edge in individual play. The foursomes split evenly with Seminoles with Hewitt and Montney taking Miami's Keller and Sullivan 3 to 0 and FSU's James and Bassett going down to Severn and Mandley by the same point score.

Ted Hewitt, all-around FSU player, lost to Bob Keller 3 to 1 on a 76 to 73 round. Dick Montney shot a 71 to Tom Sullivan's 78 to win three points.

James dropped 3 points to Severn with a 74 and Bassett was defeated by John Mandly. Mandly had a 73, Bassett a 78.

The match was decided on James and Bassett's loss to Severn and Mandly.
