DELAND—Florida State University's golf team moved into the sixth annual Florida Intercollegiate golf tournament today after finishing second in a four-way match yesterday with Miami, Stetson and Florida Southern.

The Florida Gators and Rollins Tars join those four teams in the annual Intercollegiate. Last year Florida and Miami tied for the crown while FSU's Sonny Tinney won the individual title.

Tinney is no longer eligible to participate, but the Gators and Hurricanes are again expected to lead the battle for the team title.

An 18-hole medal round is set today. Two rounds are scheduled Friday and the tourney winds up with 18 more holes on Saturday.

Miami won yesterday's four-way meet with a team total of 25½ points. FSU was a close second with 22½, while Stetson with 18 and Southern with six trailed the leaders.

The Seminoles Randy Church was high point man for the four teams yesterday scoring nine out of a possible nine points. Jimmy James with six, Rudy Boyd with 5½ and Bob Harwood with two contributed the remainder of the Seminole points.

James with a sparkling 71 was runnerup for medal honors yesterday.
