

Florida's golf team caught Florida State's Seminoles completely by surprise yesterday afternoon and dealt a 14½-12½ setback at the Capital City Country Club.

The defeat by the Gators was the first time Florida has turned back Dr. Don Veller's potent team in three dual meets, and gave the Seminoles their first defeat in 20 meets.

Tommy Aaron, playing in the No. 3 spot for Florida, was medalist for the afternoon with a three-under par 69.

Bunk Berry was FSU's low scorer with a one-under 71.

Jack Veghte, usually one of FSU's more consistent performers, and Bob Shave, the sophomore bright hope on Veller's

team, had bad days. Veghte shot an 81—the poorest round he has ever had here—and Shave had an 80, causing this twosome to drop 7½ points to the Gators.

FSU will get another crack at Florida in April when the two teams meet in Gainesville.
