Warming Up for the South-
ern Intercollegiate crown in
Tallahassee starting to-
day, Florida State's golf
team defeated University
of Florida in a team match,
10 1/2-11 1/4 holes yesterday.

Earlier this season, the Gators
beat FSU in Tallahassee. The
return match, originally sched-
uled for Gainesville, was post-
poned because of rain and mov-
ed to Athens on the eve of the
Southern Intercollegiate.

Sophomore Bob Shave was

medalist for the Tribe, carding a
3-under-par 69. He beat Hale
Baugh, who posted Florida's
low score for the day, a 72.

Others results:

Hank Aaron, Florida, beat
Bunk Berry, 3-0; Jack Veghte,
FSU, beat Jim McCoy, 2-1; Art
Gleason, Florida, beat Ed Jen-
kins, 2 1/2-1 1/2; Harry Shoemaker,
FSU, beat Pete Treham, 3-0;
Bob Shuman, FSU, beat Ralph
Ghiotto, 2-1.

Today FSU and Florida are
among 34 collegiate teams going
after the SI championship.

Rex Baxter Jr. husky par-
buster from University of Hous-
ton, was favored for individual
honors. In addition, Baxter and
his Cougar teammates were rat-
ed a strong threat to take the

team title.

Led by Baxter, Houston cap-
tured the team championship
last year in the NCAA, the only
college tournament which out-
ranks the Southern Intercolle-
giate.

The team battle, settled after
38 holes, shaped up as a three-
way scrap among Houston, de-
fending champion North Texas
State, which has taken four of
the last six SI affairs, and Okla-
homa A.&M. The Argies, who
have skipped the past few SI
tournaments, beat North Texas twice
this season in dual matches.

Although Baxter reached the
quarter-finals of the 1956 U.S.
Amateur, thereby earning a berth
in the recent Masters, he has
never fared well in Athens.
