

Florida State's golf team got brilliant play from unexpected sources to defeat the University of Florida 14½ to 3½ at the FSU course Saturday afternoon.

Low scorer with a 73 for the Seminoles in the 18 hole match was Bill Boutwell, the team's number six man. Richie Karl, Mark Blair and John Daneil-son, Coach Hugh Durham's number three, four and five men respectively, had 74s.

Denny Lyons, number one man and low medalist in Friday's pro-am preliminary to the George Washington Tournament at CCCC, was high for the Seminoles with a 78.

Florida's Dave Hamner, paired with Lyons, shot a 73 to lead the Gators, winning two of Florida's points.

FSU freshmen split 6-6 with the Baby Gators in a 12 point match.
