

# MIAMI EDGES FSU SWIMMERS

## Hurricanes Cop Meet 38 to 37

MIAMI, Feb. 4, (AP)—The University of Miami swimming team gained a one-point margin victory over Florida State University today, with the final tally 38 to 37.

Ebb Caffray, Miami, was the only double winner. He took the 220 and 440-yard free style swims.

The visitors from Tallahassee upset predictions by winning first and second places in the sprints and the going was rough from there on.
