

FSU Swimmers Rally to Beat Miami Squad

A strong Florida State University swimming team hit its season's peak here Friday night when they scored a 40-38 upset victory over the University of Miami in a dual meet that was decided in the final event.

Trailing 35-33, FSU's 400-yard freestyle relay team of Dick Berndt, Pat Farrell, Jack White and Dick Wells splashed to a triumph that gave the Seminoles their victory.

Five New Records

Five pool records fell by the wayside and one mark was equaled as the intra-state rivals met for the second time this season. Miami, which had won the series opener 38-37 in the Magic City, accounted for four of the new records.

Bob Caffrey led the assault on the records, breaking the time for the 220-yard freestyle and equalling the old mark in the 100-yard freestyle.

Miami's Dick Fetterman, 1949 intercollegiate All-America tank selection, copped the 150-yard backstroke in record time. The Hurricane's Charles Small reduced the time for the 220-yard breaststroke, and the Miami 300-yard medley relay team hung up a new mark.

FSU captain Walt Jardine was the lone Seminole to establish a new figure in the triumph. His time of five minutes 7.8 seconds in the 440-yard freestyle beat the old record.
