> Florida State's game swimmers kept the meet close through the first eight events, but Florida's talented Gators finally unleashed their fury and went on to topple the Tribe 61-52 at Union Pool Saturday.

> The Seminoles scrapped and fought the Gators, and were down by just two points, 34-36, when Florida pulled away with

two straight sweeps.

The Gators took first and second in the 200-yard backstroke and the 500-yard freestyle - a 16-2 advantage in points which are awarded on a 5-3-1 basis -- and for all practical purpose's the meet was won.

"Our kids\_did the best they could," said Seminole Coach Bim Stults, "It just wasn't enough. Florida has a very talented team and they did the job." -

Although the meet is early in the swimming season, three meet and Union Pool records fell as well as one Florida

State school record.

Florida jumped off on the right foot winning the medley relay with a meet and pool record time of 3:38.363...

They followed that with wins والأفاف للمستكل والأراب والأفرار الأمار

in the 1000 and 200-yard freestyle to run up an 18-7

advantage.

The Seminoles got their first win in the 50-yard tree behind Dean Jerger, but Florida captured the individual medley to lead 27-16 going into the onemeter diving break.

The Seminoles began chipping away at this point.

The Tribe's All-America diver Phil Boggs led a one-two sweep with a meet, pool and FSU record of 314.75 points.

Freshman butterfly specialist Mark Middleton captured the 200-yard event and the Seminoles trailed by

only one point, 31-30.

Florida's Bruce Williams won the 100-yard freestyle, but the Gators were only able to pick up one point as the Seminoles finished second and third.

Then came the crucial backstroke and 500-free events.

Florida's Bill Dorney, one of several high school All-Americas among the Gator "freshmen, won easily. The big battle was for second place where Florida's Bill Strate nipped FSU's Bill Gest by .252 of a second.

With their lead now increased to 44-35, the Gators swept the 500 behind Mark McKee and Greg Hardee.

To stay in the meet the Seminoles needed at least a first and third in the breaststroke, but could only muster a second, giving Florida a 58-39 advantage.

The dual meet competition there is a total of 113 points so it takes only 57 to win.
