other half and the meet by a score of 66-47 for its sixth straight victory.

Jumping into the the lead with wins in each of the first four events, the Gators rolled up the points by taking second place in two of the events.

Opening the meet was a Gator victory in the 400-yard medley relay, with Florida swimmers Bill Dorney, Gary Chelofky, Steve McDonnell and Bruce Williams setting a meet and pool record with a 3:34.7 finish.

Staying on the winning track, Brant Bittner and Pete Orschiedt of Florida finished one and two in the 1000-yard freestyle with Jerry Norris of FSU finishing third.

Florida took the next two events and it was not until the one-meter diving that FSU won its first event. Phil Boggs

finished first with 317.85 points and teammate Terry Maxhimer third.

Florida State went on to win the next three events, with Chet Miltenberger taking the 200-yard butterfly, Dan Jerger the 100 freestyle and John Hegert the 200 backstroke.

Florida finished second and third in all three events, however, then went on to take first in the 500 freestyle and both first and second in the 200 breaststroke.

Boggs and Maxhimer took first and second in the three-meter diving, but it was too late for the Seminoles, even when they added a win in the 400 freestyle relay. Florida's relay team led that one up to the last 25 yards when Dean Jerger caught Florida's John Bosbyshell to win.
