University of Florida's swimming team jumped to a broad early lead and splashed on to a 65-48 victory over Florida State on a bone-chilling Saturday afternoon at Union Pool here.

The victory was the second of the season for the Gators over the Seminoles and came in FSU's last home meet of the season. The Tribe travels to Athens, Ga., next weekend for the Southern Collegiate Invitational.

Five records fell the first two times these teams met this year, but that wasn't the case yesterday as a biting wind made the 40-degrees temperature seem much colder. There were no records set in this one as Florida pulled a notch closer in a series which is led by FSU 12-9-1.

Florida jumped out front 7-0 following an easy victory in the first event, the 400-yard medley relay. Bill Dorney, Gary Chelesky, Steve McDonnell and Bruce Williams were timed in 3:46.78, which was — to give an indication of the times — some eight seconds off the pool record.

Then came a 1-2 finish for the Gators in the 1,000-yard freestyle to up the margin to 15-1. Brant Bittner won it in 10:22.65, with Greg Hardee second and FSU's Gerry Norris third.

Perhaps the most crucial event of the day, for the Seminoles, was the third race — the 200-yard freestyle.

FSU Coach Bim Stults knew the Gators were very strong in the distance events, and saved his better swimmers for the sprints. The 200-yard freestyle was the first of these, but Florida Coach Bill Harlan crossed things up by putting his outstanding sprinter Bruce Williams back in the pool after he had anchored the opening relay.

Williams responded by

winning the 200 freestyle and the Gators' lead was increased to 23-2 when UF's Mark McKee came in second. The best FSU could do was a third-place finish by John Hegert.

The Seminoles won four of the next five events and pulled back to within 14 points at 42-28, but Florida again sprinted away — winning the next three races, to mathematically clinch it. Just 57 points is needed to sew a meet and, following UF's third straight win in the 200-yard breaststroke, the score stood 64-33 with two events remaining.

Florida State won both of those.

Florida State's Dean Jerger and Phil Boggs were the only double winners in the meet, Jerger winning the 50-yard and 100-yard free-style races, and Boggs dominating both the one and three-meter diving events.

Mark Middleton was a winner for Florida State in the 200-yard butterfly and Lee Eisinger, Jerry Stevens, John Hegert and Jerger won the 400-yard freestyle relay.

The Seminoles took 1-2

finishes in just two events — both of the diving competitions. Terry Maxhimer trailed Boggs in each.

"I'm disappointed naturally," Stults said after the meet. "But it's really about what we expected. Florida has a strong club.

"I'd like to say I think we would have done better if the weather had been different, but I would be lying," Stults added. "We didn't plan a lot of strategy for the meet, although we did hold out some men in that first relay, hoping to have them ready for later events."

The Seminoles are now 7-3 for the season, with South Carolina the only team, other than Florida, holding a win over FSU this year.
