

FSU Fifth In Meet

ATHENS, Ga. (AP) — By virtue of strength in the other than first places, Miami took a slim lead over Southern Illinois after the first day of competition Thursday in the 10th annual Southern Intercollegiate Invitational swimming championships.

Southern Illinois won two of the evening's three events but trailed Miami 84-82 in the standings.

Georgia is in third place with 66 points, South Carolina in fourth with 56 and Florida State fifth with 22.

One tournament record was broken in the 1650 freestyle. Pat Miles of Southern Illinois won the event in 16:12.6, smashing the old record of 16:50.0 by Tim Hoxin of Southern Illinois set in 1970.

FSU Fifth In Swimming

ATHENS, Ga. (AP) — Bill Tingley, Dale Korner and Rob Dickson captured first place in separate events Saturday to lead Southern Illinois to the championship of the 10th Southern Intercollegiate Invitational swimming meet at the University of Georgia.

Southern Illinois rolled up 464 points during the three-day meet, followed by Miami with 423, South Carolina 406, Georgia 293 and Florida State 165.

FSU Is Last In Swimming

ATHENS, Ga. — Florida State's swimmers are last in a field of five as the 10th annual Southern Intercollegiate Invitational enters the finals here today.

Southern Illinois leads the tournament with a 302 score, Miami is next at 273, then there's South Carolina at 230, Georgia at 178 and Florida State at 93.

In yesterday's action, Larry Shuman won the one meter diving for the Seminoles. Two other Florida State swimmers, Steve Driver and Tom Arnold, took 5th and 6th places in the 100 yard breaststroke.

The Seminoles' were also fifth in the 800 yard Freestyle Relay.
