

Miami swimmers beat Florida State by 72-47

MIAMI — The Florida State men's swim team dropped a 66-47 decision to the University of Miami here Saturday, dropping its record to 9-2 in dual meets this season.

On Friday, FSU defeated Indian River, 72-47.

In the Saturday meet, Keith McConnell set two Florida State records and qualified for the NCAA nationals in three events. He and the rest of the 400

medley relay team (Kevin Marshburn, Larry Brown and Steve Albritton) all qualified with a time of 3:26.08. McConnell swam a 100 backstroke in 52.45 during that relay, setting an FSU record and qualifying for a second NCAA event. He set his second school mark of the day and earned his third NCAA qualifying time with a 1:52.84 in the 200 backstroke.
