

Miami swims past FSU

CORAL GABLES — Florida State's men and women swimmers were dumped Saturday by fired-up squads from the University of Miami in the final competition of FSU's dual-meet season.

The Hurricane men trounced FSU 84-29. The lone winner for the Seminoles was freshman Sam Seiple, who captured the 100-yard freestyle in 47.7 seconds.

Meanwhile, the strong FSU women's team was being upset 78-53. Lenore Gribble paced the Lady Seminoles with three victories, taking the 200-yard freestyle in 1 minute 55.06 seconds, the 100-yard freestyle in 53.52 seconds and the 100-yard butterfly in 59.07.

Lisa Nencioni was a double winner for the FSU women, taking the 100-yard breast stroke in 1:08.30 and the 200-yard breast stroke in 2:26.22.

In a pair of dual meets Friday, the FSU swimmers easily turned back Indian River Community College. The Seminole men collected a 60-40 victory, and the Lady Seminoles swamped the Indian River squad 71-54.

The FSU men ended their dual-meet season with five wins and five losses; the women's squad was 9-3.

Both Seminole swim squads will begin their championship competition seasons in two weeks, when they will travel to Athens, Ga., for the Southern Intercollegiate Championships at the University of Georgia.
