GAINESVILLE—Florida State's bid for a record 16th tennis victory fell short here yesterday as Florida's Gators turned back the Seminoles, 6-3.

The state rivals split the six singles matches, but Florida swept all three doubles events. Morrill Hay of the Gators snapped a 16-match winning streak by FSU's Gordy Smith in singles and Jim Shaffer topped the Tribe's Rebel Bellamy in the No. 1 singles match.

FSU, now 15-3 for the season, hosts unbeaten Miami at Tallahassee Saturday.
