## FSU'S WOOD TAKES THIRD MIAMI WIN

## But 'Canes Win Dual Match 7-2

MIAMI (AP)—If you're a tennis enthusiast, perhaps you've heard of Lex Wood. If not, it's

time you did.

Wood, a 22-year-old from Kingwilliamstown, South Africa, is an English major at Florida State University. He has been in the United States two years and is completing his first season as a member of the Seminoles' varsity tennis squad.

Twice in as many days, Wood defeated Rodney Mandelstam, No. 1 singles player on the University of Miami's team who, incidentally, comes from Johannesburg.

Wood continued his mastery of Miami players for the third day in a row Tuesday by beating John Hammill, the No. 2 player.

Wood's performance outshone that of Fern (Peachy) Kellmeyer of Charleston, W.Va., who made her debut with the varsity squad. Peachy, one of the few coeds on a college varsity men's tennis team in the country, lost to Don Monk of Florida State, 6-1, 1-6, 6-1. She teamed with John Santrock to defeat Monk and Steve Burtt in the doubles, 6-3, 6-2.

Miami won the meet, 7-2, to make the Hurricanes' record for the season 14-1.

It was Wood's 21st triumph in 22 intercollegiate matches this season. His only loss was to Marty Reissen of Northwestern in three sets.

Wood, who stands 5-foot 8 and is strong and wiry, has one more year of eligibility and will graduate next year. He plans to study for his master's degree in English, also at Florida State.

Wood was nominated for the South African Davis Cup squad but older players were selected.
