

## U-M tennis team after four in row

With a breezing 7-2 victory Saturday over Florida State, University of Miami's tennis team today visits the University of South Florida in Tampa in search of its fourth straight victory of the season.

The Hurricanes handled FSU Saturday at the U-M courts as two of the three U-M freshmen won their matches. Neal Edwab, playing No. 3, defeated Juan Ortiz, 7-5, 7-5, and No. 4 Andre Zietsman whipped Ricardo Bernd, 7-6 (5-3), 6-2.

U-M clinched the victory in No. 1 doubles, as Zietsman and Joaquim Rasgado, who won his No. 1 singles match in straight sets, defeated FSU's Richard Le Gendre and Rejean Genois, 6-1, 1-6, 6-3.

Miami's next home match is Thursday at 2:30 against Pennsylvania.

## UM Wins Over FSU In Tennis

MIAMI — Florida State's tennis team dropped a 7-2 decision to Miami here Saturday afternoon.

The Seminoles could manage victories in only two singles matches while losing the other four, and losing all three doubles matches.

Florida State's No. 2 player, Rejean Genois, whipped Miami's Martinez, 6-3, 6-1, for the Seminole netters' first win of the afternoon, and in the sixth match, the Seminole's Steve Diamond stopped Alvaro Fillol of the Hurricanes, 7-6 and 6-3.

It was the Seminoles first loss against two opening wins with another tough meet coming up Thursday. After battling Miami, the nation's No. 10-ranked team, the Seminoles host the University of North Carolina, the fifth-ranked squad nationally. That event will start at 2:30 Thursday on the Seminole courts.
