The Regional: The Regional, hosted by South Carolina in Columbia, is a single elimination tournament and will feature six teams. Florida State is the sixth seed in the regional and will face third seeded Georgia Tech in a 10am match. In other matches, #4 North Carolina will play #5 Clemson. #2 Virginia Commonwealth will play the winner of the Florida State-Georgia Tech match while #1 South Carolina will meet the winner of North Carolina and Clemson on Saturday.

Last Time Versus the Yellow Jackets: Twenty-ninth ranked Brian Stanton defeated No. 33 Rob Givone at No. 1 singles, 7-6, 6-4 to give Florida State a 4-3 win over Georgia Tech in Atlanta, GA. Florida State won four of the six singles matches to take the victory. The scores:

A First: Florida State will be making its first ever trip to the NCAA Championships. The Seminoles have sent individual players to the Tournament with the most recent selection being Stephen Noteboom in 1991.

Words from the Head Coach: Head Coach David Barron on making the NCAA Tournament, "I'm proud of the team. I felt that we had a better year than in the past. We had some close matches that we lost, but we improved. This was a reward for getting through such a tough schedule. This is a tremendous honor to the program. When I came in, I gave myself five years to achieve my goal of getting a bid to post-season play. This was a long time coming, I'm happy for FSU."

Expansion: This is the first season that the NCAA Championships have been expanded to a regional format. Previously, only the top 20 teams in the country were selected. This season, eight regions will have between four and six teams competing.

A Look at the Region: In its second season in Region II, Florida State posted a 6-5 record against region opponents. A rundown of the Florida State results versus the region:

Back into the Top 35: The Seminoles moved back into the top 35 after falling to 37th in the April 12 poll. Florida State in the rankings:

Movin' On Up: Brian Stanton, a junior from Coral Springs, FL has steadily moved up in the rankings this season. Currently, he is ranked 28th. This is the highest ranking for a Seminole since Stephen Noteboom ranked 22nd in 1991. Stanton is also ranked in doubles with Ken McKenzie. The pair are currently ranked 30th, although they have been as high as 21st.

Challenging Schedule: Thirteen ranked teams graced the Seminoles schedule in 1994. Included in those 13 were three top ten teams, #7 Mississippi State, #5 Duke and #8 Texas Christian. Against top 50 teams, Florida State was 5-8.

Close Only Counts in Horseshoes: Of Florida State's eight losses, five were by 4-3 scores. In fact, Florida State lost two matches to two top ten teams, #5 Duke, and #8 Texas Christian by 4-3 scores. In matches that came down to the wire, FSU stands at 3-4.

Gotta Have It? In five of Florida State's eight losses, the Seminoles lost the doubles point. Outcomes of two of those matches would have been different had FSU taken the 1-0 lead into singles. Against both Clemson and Texas Christian, FSU dropped the point and ended up losing the match 4-3. However, winning the point does not always guarantee victory. In matches versus North Carolina, Duke and Clemson in the ACCs, FSU had the point advantage after doubles but still ended up losing 4-3. Florida State has also shown the propensity to return from the point deficit. Against Wake Forest, West Virginia and Georgia Tech, the Seminoles won the match despite losing the doubles point.

About the Coach: David Barron has guided the Seminoles to a 15-8 record including a 9-3 home mark and 6-5 record on the road this season. In four seasons, Barron has compiled a 62-32 overall record at Florida State.

Post Season Kudos: Two-time all-leaguers Ken McKenzie and Brian Stanton represented Florida State on the All-Atlantic Coast Conference team. McKenzie, who was the named co-champion at the No. 2 singles flight, produced a 15-7 record, including a 7-1 mark in the ACC. Listed 28th by the ITA, Stanton was the No. 1 singles flight runnerup in the ACC with a 6-1 record in league play.

David Barron

Head Coach

University of Evansville

David Barron never slows down. Whether he's coaching, recruiting, lobbying for a new tennis center or involving himself in charitable activities, the fourth year head coach partakes in a whirlwind of activity that has reaped huge benefits for the Florida State Men's Tennis Program.

This season, Barron coached the Seminoles to their first ever trip to the NCAA Tournament. FSU finished with a 15-8 record and boasted a top 30 player in #28 Brian Stanton and a top 30 doubles team in #30 Stanton and Ken McKenzie.

In 1994, Florida State played in its new tennis facility, the Scott Speicher Tennis Center and one of the central figures behind the existence of the facility was Barron. Through his vision and lobbying, Barron did much of the leg work to make the Center a reality on the Florida State campus.

A native of Evansville, Barron played on a Junior College National Champion team at the University of Central Florida Community College before graduating in 1981. He then went on to the University of Evansville where he was team MVP in 1983 while earning his Bachelor's degree. Barron earned a Master's in Business Administration from Nova University in 1985.

Barron returned to Florida and worked at Nick Bollettieri's prestigious Tennis Academy. There he met Andy Brandi, who went on to become the head coach of the Florida Gator women's tennis team. Brandi brought Barron to Gainesville in 1985 where they proceeded to lead the Lady Gators to becoming one of the top teams in the country. Recently, two other organizations have benefitted from Barron's involvement. The fourth year head coach was heavily involved in a campaign to raise money for the Children's Miracle Network. By organizing a Tennis Pro-AM last fall, money for the pediatric programs at Shands Hospital at the University of Florida was raised. Barron also lobbied to get Florida State's Scott Speicher Tennis Center to become the site of a 1994 ATP Challenger event. The tournament will have \$25,000 in prize money and two Florida State players will receive wild card spots in the draw.

Barron, who is married to the former Michelle Sharp is USPTA (United States Professional Tennis Association) certified. He is currently working on his Doctorate in Athletic Administration at Florida State.

COLUMBIA, SC--Making its first ever NCAA Championship Tournament appearance the Florida State men's tennis team was eliminated by Georgia Tech, 4-2, at Columbia, SC in Region II first round action Friday.

Georgia Tech senior Mark Ottinger rallied from a 4-1 third set deficit to edge FSU sophomore Jason White 6-4, 4-6, 7-6 (7-4) to clinch the Yellow Jackets victory.

After dropping the first two matches, Florida State tied the match 2-2 on the strength of victories by Brian Stanton and Adam Baron. Stanton recorded his 26th singles victory for the season, 2-6, 6-3, 6-3 over Rob Givone at No. 1 singles to put the Seminoles on the board. Playing at No. 5, Baron evened the match by winning a second set tiebreaker 7-2 for two set sweep (6-2, 7-6) over B.J. Traub.

Individually, Stanton improves to 26-9 and defeats his eighth nationally ranked opponent of the season.

"Georgia Tech was extremely aggressive, attacking the net more often than in our last meeting," said head coach David Barron. "The way Mark (Ottinger) player typified Tech's entire team effort. They were a little more experience, with today being our first time in post-season play. I told our team that you have to crawl before you can walk."

With the win Georgia Tech, now 15-10 overall, avenged a 4-3 defeat to FSU last month. Ottinger, who had lost to White 6-2, 6-0 in the teams' previous meeting, made a lunging backhand volley to intercept White's passing shot and earn a 6-4 lead in the tiebreak. Ottinger served the next point, and White's backhand sailed long to earn the Yellow Jackets the match clinching fourth point.

Georgia Tech advances to face second seed Virginia Commonwealth Saturday.
