**HATTIESBURG, Miss.**—Mississippi Southern College defeated Florida State 73-58 in her last dual meet today on a rain-soaked track and turf—despite an 18-point performance by Seminole sophomore Carlos Fraundorfer that included FSU records in the discus and broad jump.

The Southerners got off winging with a sweep in the high jump and led all the way. Winning only six of the 15 events, they nevertheless had the greater depth to stave off an Indian rally.

State's Fraundorfer set school records of 141' 2" in the discus and 22' 9½" in the broad jump. He also won the shot in a slow ring with 43' 11¾" and ran second in the 100.

Sophomore Ken Jarrett was FSU's other double winner as he paced easy victories in the mile and two mile.

MSC's Bob Scott copped a sprint double and Nick "The Cat" Revon, basketball ace who troubled FSU's cagers, won the high jump and javelin.

Both squads were below full strength. The Seminoles were especially weakened by the absence of five regulars who quit the squad last week.

FSU Captain Dick Mize turned in the best running time with 51.3 for his first 1952 victory in the quarter mile. There were three other FSU winners: Julian Hurst in the high hurdles, Wes Minton in the lows, and Joe Fracassi in the pole vault.
