**GAINESVILLE**—Florida State used its strength in the running events to cop its first dual track victory ever over Florida here yesterday 74 1/15-56 14/15.

The score was even more convincing than pre-meet predictions as the favored Seminoles took nine first places. State won seven of the nine running events including a sweep in the 880.

It was the third straight dual victory this year for the unbeaten Seminoles and the fifth consecutive team effort.

The Seminole tanksters are rapidly gaining a reputation as streak-breakers. Today's victory broke an 11-meet dual win streak for Florida, dating back to 1955. Last week, State broke a 37-meet Roanoke winning streak with a 79-43 victory.

It was the most decisive setback the Gators have been handed since 1949, when they fell to Auburn, 78-46.

Two Florida State school records fell during the meet. Jerry Henderson established a new standard in the javelin with a throw of 215 feet, six and a half inches, breaking the old record of 205 feet, one and half inches by Ron Weaver in 1955.

Jim Casteel set a new record in the 440 by covering the distance in :48.7, breaking his own school record of :49.9, set against Roanoke.

Casteel was high scorer for the day for the Seminoles with 13 1/4 points. In addition to his 440 victory, the versatile sophomore had seconds in the broad jump and 220, a third in the low hurdles and ran the anchor leg of the winning mile relay team.

Mike Conley and Jack Terwilliger each had 11 1/4 points with two firsts apiece and a leg of the mile relay.

Conley won the mile and two-mile in 4:21.4 and 9:57.0 respectively and Terwilliger coped the 100 and 220.

Florida won four of the six field event and both hurdles events. In addition to Henderson's victory in the javelin, Dick

Elwood won the pole vault with a vault of 13' 1 1/2" for State's two victories in the field events.

The Seminole freshmen made it a clean sweep by beating the Baby Gators, 8-7, the frosh meet was scored on the basis of one point for first place only.

Bill Archer of Melbourne led the Baby Seminoles to victory. He took firsts in both the low and high hurdles, and the broad jump and ran a leg of the mile relay.

Other first-place winners for the frosh were: Don Roberts in the mile and two-mile and Charles Drago in the shot put and discus. Drago's 134' 5 1/2" heave in the discus surpassed the winning varsity entry by Stan Mitchell of Florida.
