

Unbeaten in dual competition, Florida State's track team came from behind yesterday to stun Louisiana State's defending Southeastern Conference champion Tiger team.

The victory, probably the best ever in the history of the Seminoles, was achieved in a dual meet at the University of Florida. The Seminoles, who had lost to the Tigers in the 1959 dual meet, were led by Coach Tommie Smith. The Tigers, coached by Tommie Smith, were led by Coach Tommie Smith.

Florida State's victory was a surprise to many. The Seminoles had been out of the top 10 in the Southeastern Conference for several years. The Tigers, on the other hand, had been the dominant force in the conference for many years. The Seminoles' victory was a significant upset.

FSU won a number of horses, but the biggest one has to be Ron Harrison. The lanky Orlando senior upset LSU's Ralph Palmer, defending SEC champ in both the 100 and 220-yard dashes, in both short sprints.

Harrison taped 100 yards in 9.7 seconds and hit the tape in the 220 at 21.7 seconds.

FSU got important first places from Tom Keeney in the mile run, Tim in the 440 dash, Steve Long in the high jump, Don Roberts in the 880 run, Jeff Clark in the discus, and Kent Mills in the two-mile run.

Overall, FSU won nine of the 16 events, using the opening 440-yard relay by a yard but

taking the final mile relay with room to spare. The Seminoles had a 9-5 edge in the second places and a 7-5 margin in third places.

Junior Dickie Durham was a double winner for the Tigers, taking the low and high hurdles. Durham's 14.6-second time in the 120-yard high hurdles tied a FSU track record.

Keeney's 4:21.8 effort in the mile run was among the day's better showings.

The triumph avenged last

year's 55-50 Seminole loss to LSU at Baton Rouge. It was the only FSU dual loss over the past three seasons. In six seasons under Long, the Tribe has now won 26 of 30 dual engagements.

Yesterday's meet before 1,200 spectators served both teams as a final tuneup for the Florida Relays at Gainesville tomorrow. The Seminoles will enter a 19-man varsity squad and a five-man freshman contingent. LSU is defending champion.
