

**GAINESVILLE** — A spirited Florida State track team was taking bows today for two good reasons.

(1) A second perfect dual-meet season in three years and

(2) A third straight showdown victory over rival University of Florida.

Coach Mike Long's Seminoles wrapped up their 1960 dual season here yesterday by outrunning the Gators, 79½-56½. It gave the Tribes a 4-0 dual chart and their 11th triumph in their last 12 starts.

A quartet of seniors who finished their dual-meet varsity careers with three straight verdicts over Florida were key performers yesterday.

Ron Harrison, the lanky Orlando sprinter, won both the 100 and 220-yard dashes and anchored FSU's winning 440-yard and mile relay teams.

Tom Kenney, the "old reliable" from Miami, captured firsts in both the mile and two-mile runs.

Co-captain Ted Keen ran a leg on the 440-yard relay team, placed second behind Harrison in the 100 and 220, and got a third-place tie in the pole vault.

Claude Grizzard, gutty Atlantan, won the low hurdles, placed second in the high hurdles, and ran with FSU's mile relay foursome.

The Seminoles dominated the running events, taking eight of nine possible firsts in the track events. Florida grabbed firsts in five of the six field events.

Overall, FSU had a 9-7 edge in firsts, 8-5 in seconds, and 8-4 in third-place finishes. There were ties for second and third place in two events.

"I continue to be amazed by the way our fellows respond," Long said today. "We have asked a lot of them, but they go out and do the job. These young men have justified our confidence in them."

Along with outstanding efforts from the four key seniors, FSU got strong showings from many others. Sixteen Seminoles figured in the scoring as State took a 3-2 edge in their track rivalry with Florida.

Long will take a nine-man contingent to Philadelphia today to ready for competition in the Penn Relays this weekend.

FSU's freshman squad made it a sweep yesterday by scoring a 10-6 victory over the Baby Gators. Broad jumper Herbie Kraft, sprinter Craig Johnson, and weightman Bob Smith were standouts for the Baby Seminoles.
