

MIAMI (AP) — Florida State and Miami battled down to the last event Saturday in a tight meet, and the scorecards added up to a 70½-68 win for FSU. Then Miami's Coach, who was transcribing the result to the scorebook, said he spotted an error and discovered his Hurricanes won, 70½-69.

Miami Coach Bob Downes said

he tried without success to reach FSU Coach Mike Long to advise him and have him look over the figures. Downes said he did find several FSU athletes "and they were convinced and had no complaints."

The Miami Coach said FSU was credited—and Miami debited—erroneously with three points in the broad jump. Contributing to the mistake, he said, was confusion between the order of the competitors' jumps and the order of their placing, plus misidentification by an announcer of Miami jumper Jim Chase as an FSU man. He placed second.

The high hurdles event was marred by a helter-skelter spill of four men and their hurdles. Phil Dankes of Miami, who had been running in second position, scrambled to his feet and won the event.

The Seminoles had three double winners. Al Cato won the 00 and 220 yard dashes, Al Williams took the shot put and discus, and Bill Giswold won the high jump and the hop, step and jump.
