AUBURN, Ala. — Jerry Mc-Daniel and Floyd Lorenz paced the Florida State track team to a 95-50 victory over the Auburn thinelads for the Tribe's 11th straight dual meet victory and fourth this season. The loss snapped a home-streak of 20 straight for Auburn.

Florida State took first places in 14 out of 17 events, led by McDaniel and Lorenz with two each.

McDaniel captured the 220 with a time of 22.0, and took the 440 with a 48.1. He also ran a leg on the mile and 440 relay teams, both of which posted triumphs.

Lorenz took both the high jump and the high hurdles. He soared 6-5 in the high jump and ran the hurdles in 15.0.

Don Casteel broke his own school record in the triple jump with 46' 9½." He set the old record of 46' 6" last week at the Florida Relays.

Sid Gainey tied his record with a leap of 24' 1" in the broad jump. Gainey also set the record last week in Gainesville. Ken White took the 100 with a 9.8, Bill Nelson's 4:20.4 won the mile and Steve Landis captured the 330-yard hurdles with a 38.5. John Brogle won the 880 with a 1:55.5 clocking.

The 440-relay team of Mc-Daniel, White, Bob Sable and Al Cato turned in a winning 42.4 time, and the mile relay team of Bill Campbell, Doug Daniel was clocked at 3:20.4, another first.

In the field events, Ray Hoxit tossed the discus 137' 212"; Darryl Guthrie took the javalin with a 190' 6".

The next dual meet for the Seminoles will be in Columbia, S. C. Monday against the University of South Carolina.

The FSU freshmen cindermentied with the Baby Tigers 8½ 8½. Bud Manning took one first and tied for another to page the Baby Seminoles. Only first places were scored.
