

FSU men, women stop Miami in close meets

Florida State's men and women topped Miami in two swim meets at Florida State Saturday, but the wins were far from overwhelming — both teams won on the last event of the day.

FSU's men won 58-55 when the 400-freestyle relay team scored a one-second victory over Miami. Crucial wins for FSU were made by Paul Shreve in the 200-freestyle, David Rae in the 200-butterfly and Keith McConnell in the 200-backstroke. Miami Olympian Greg Louganis handily won both diving events.

The women needed wins in their final two events to score a 66-65 victory. Lisa Nencioni came through in the 100-breaststroke for her third win of the day, and the 200-freestyle relay team of Kim Dunlop, Kathi Miller, Jeanne Dowdle and Lisa Davison sewed up the win.

FSU men's coach John Stafford, working with one athlete under suspension, said that his swimmers worked as a team for the first time this season to beat tough Miami.

"Nobody was worried about his time," he said. "They just wanted to know what they had to do to win."

For the Lady Seminoles, the victory was also sweet, avenging a 100-31 Miami win last year. The Miami team included three All-America swimmers, several recently recruited Canadian swimmers and one member of the British World Games team.

"We wanted this win," Coach Terry Maul said. "Our ladies swam very well against top level international competition."

In addition to Nencioni's triple win, Kathi Miller added victories in the 100-butterfly and 200-breaststroke.

FSU's women are now 8-2.
