

## Blake second in Festival

DURHAM, N.C. — Florida State hurdler Arthur Blake ran a career-best time but finished second to Greg Foster in Sunday's running of the 110-meter high hurdles at the U.S. Olympic Festival.

Foster, the 1983 world champion, 1984 Olympic silver medalist and current No. 1-ranked hurdler, matched the fastest time in the world this year with a winning time of 13.19 seconds. Foster took the lead from Rod Woodson at the third hurdle and beat Blake by just over a stride.

Blake's 13.29 timing was the fastest by a collegian this year.

• Michelle Finn, another FSU sprinter, ran on the South's second-place 400-meter relay Saturday night. Finn ran the third leg with Sheila Echols of Baton Rouge, La., Jackie Washington of Houston and Gwen Torrance of Decatur, Ga., who finished in 42.42 seconds. The West team won in 42.22.
