

FSU women win 20th, lose Foglio

It should have been a time for celebrating the ascendancy to the magical plateau of 20 season victories. But the Florida State Lady Seminoles couldn't quite get in the mood.

Florida State's hard work had produced a 66-52 victory over Miami and brought its season record to 20-7. But the Lady Seminoles were thinking mostly about teammate Lisa Foglio, the team's top shooter and second-leading scorer who was taken off the court with a compound fracture of her right arm.

Foglio was injured when she fell to the court and a Miami player tumbled over her early in the second half of Saturday's game. Foglio is expected to be out for the season.

"I'm very, very upset," said FSU coach Jan Dykehouse. "Lisa was playing the best she's ever played."

"This took a lot out of the win," said FSU forward Sue Galkantas, who had game-highs of 22 points and 12 rebounds.

Both teams started slowly offensively. At the 10:45 mark of the first half, the score was only 8-8. Miami shot an icy 29 percent in the first half.

The FSU women struggled throughout, having to hustle to the win because they only shot 43 percent from the field. Their hustle on defense also held Miami to a miserable 32 percent from the floor.

LeeVayn Oliver scored eight points in the final four minutes of the first half and sparked the sluggish Lady Seminoles to a 31-23 lead.

Fahey, who hit all five of her shots from the floor, and Galkantas pushed the lead to as much as 16 in the second half. Miami never got closer than eight points.

Oliver had 13 points and 10 rebounds and center Glenda Stokes had nine points and 11 rebounds for FSU.
