San Juan, P.R. — The Florida State University Lady Seminoles fell 64-44 to the 11th-ranked Texas Tech Lady Raiders Monday night in first round action of the San Juan Shootout. FSU falls to 4-5 on the season while the Lady Raiders improve to 9-2 on the year.

Junior guard Anja Pedersen led all FSU players in scoring with 12 points on four three pointers off the bench. Despite the loss, Coach Marynell Meadors was pleased with her team's effort.

"I thought we played very hard tonight," Meadors said. "We showed moments of greatness out there, but unfortunately, our shots just didn't fall for us. We were very patient on offense and the effort was excellent throughout the ball game. I was real pleased with our overall performance."

With the score 5-3 in favor of the Lady Seminoles, Texas Tech went on a 9-0 run to take an early 12-5 lead and never looked back. Thanks to solid three-point shooting for the Lady 'Noles, FSU was able to cut the lead to five at 19-14, but could get no closer the remainder of the game. Florida State connected on seven three pointers for the contest.

The Lady Seminoles will face Southern Illinois at 4 p.m. tomorrow. The 3-3 Salukis lost 64-52 to Old Dominion in action earlier in the day.
