

FSU golfers are in fifth

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — Florida State's women's golf team is in fifth place after the second round in the 1983 Carrier Memphis Women's Intercollegiate Golf Tournament at Stonebridge Country Club.

South Florida leads the competition with 589, followed by Duke at 604. Texas is in third place with 616 and Mississippi State is fourth at 621.

FSU was in eighth place after the first round Sunday, but the Lady Seminoles managed to move up three slots. Twenty-one teams are competing.

Debbie Moss, from Florida State, had the low round for the day with a 71. She's in seventh place for the tournament with a two-day total of 153. Kristen Ericson shot 78 both days for 156. Leading the tourney is South Florida's Diane Nawankaski with an even-par 144.

South Florida wins in golf

MEMPHIS, Tenn. — South Florida's Diane Nawankaski shot a total of 220 to finish first place in both team and individual categories in the final round Tuesday of the Carrier Memphis Women's Intercollegiate Golf Tournament at the Stonebridge Country Club.

South Florida finished first out of 21 schools competing with a total score of 900, followed by Duke with 913. Texas A&M finished third with 919; the University of Texas fourth
