FSU golfers eighth

KEY BISCAYNE — After one round of play in the Pat Bradley Invitational, Florida State's women's golf team is in eighth place among 17 teams with a total of 314.

Miami leads the tournament, sponsored by Florida International University, with a 291.

Penny Hammel, from Miami, is the individual leader with a 70. FSU golfers include Debbie Moss (77), Sherri Lindsey (78), Lorraine Elder (79), Elaine Carson (80), and Debbi Zahand (84).

Other teams in the tournament include South Florida, second with a 301; Duke, third at 306; Texas A&M, fourth at 307; Furman, in fifth place, 308; Georgia, sixth at 310; Alabama, seventh with a 313; and Ohio State and North Carolina, tied for ninth with 315.
