

Lady swimmers fall 87-43

Florida State's women's swim team lost its first dual meet of the 1976 season Saturday falling to arch-rival Florida 87-43 at FSU's Union Aquatic Center.

Temperatures in the low 40's did not provide ideal swimming conditions for either team, but the nationally-ranked Lady Gators captured nine of the 15 events, including both one and three-meter diving competitions.

Florida took both the 200 medley relay and 200 freestyle relay, winning by only .5 second in each race.

The first-year swimmers for FSU, Ritchie Dorrier and Kim Reeves, had outstanding meets taking first and second place in the 50

freestyle, both girls posting times of 26.3.

In another judges' decision, FSU's Penny Knutson took a first away from Florida in the 100 breaststroke.

Florida State's Jackie Walker also swam past the Florida swimmers gaining a 14 second edge over a Lady Gator third place finish in the 500 freestyle. Lady Seminole, Missy McInnis came in second.

Said Maul, "I'm pleased with their showing. The girls have a good attitude, and we still have a chance for a winning season."

The Lady Seminoles travel to Tampa next Saturday to meet the women of South Florida.
