FSU Women Win Track Over Three

Florida State's womens track team captured its fourth straight title here yesterday in the fourth annual Florida State Womens Invitational meet at FSU.

The lady Seminoles rolled up 60 points in the university division, while second place Florida totaled 44. Tennessee had 39 and Alabama State 28.

Panama City Rutherford won the senior high school division racking up 48 and a half points. Madison was next at 42, Rickards 19 and Florida High 18 and a half.

Madison won the junior high competition with 27, Jinks had 20 and Everitt 15.

Twenty - one meet records were either tied or broken in the three divisions. Several Florida State participants broke or tied school marks. JoAnn Sharpe tied the FSU high jump standard of 5-1 and qualified for nationals. Susan Hagler's 11.8 in 100 set a new school mark. Hagler and Sharp were members of the record setting mile relay team that posted a 51.9. Peggy Reed set a meet record with a 36-3 and three - fourths in the shot put.

Leon's Bonnie Smith set two meet records in the high school division, clocking a 11.4 in the 100 and a 26.1 in the 220. Rickards' Sharon Bradford clocked a record time of 1:03 in the 440.

The meet's outstanding performer in the university division was Beth Jenkins of Alabama State, who won the 100 in 11.2 and the 220 in 25.5, both meet records.

In the senior high division, Madison broke the 440 relay record w i th a 53.6. Rutherford's Mary Ann Harris set a new mark in the shot put at 30-9 and three - fourths and in the discus at 75-5 and one half. Rutherford's Chareese Allen leaped 4-7 in the high jump for another new standard.

In the university division, Mary McGroarte of Florida had a 58.2 for a record in the 440. Another UF runner, Kristi Stovall, clocked a 2:24.1 in the 880 for a record.

Paula Hagarty of the Gators leaped a 16-4 for a new mark in the long jump. Tennessee's Zsa Zsa Yow timed a record - setting 16.5 in the 100 meter hurdles.
