

A WORLD-CLASS PROGRAM BUILT ON TRADITION







Florida State has been a mainstay in the collegiate softball scene since being one of the pioneer programs of the sport in 1978. Over the last 45 years, the Seminole program has done its part to help grow the game exponentially in that time span by churning out numerous All-America players, staffing quality coaches and stringing together many impressive seasons, including 12 trips to the Women's College World Series including a National Championship in 2018 and the 1981 & 1982 AIAW National Championships.

With the 2025 season marking head coach Lonni Alameda's 17th as the Seminole skipper, the direction of the program remains on the right path. 40-win seasons continue to be a staple of the program, with 40 in the program's 46 years, including 21 50-win seasons. NCAA Championship appearances are always expected, with the Seminoles being one of just nine schools to make an NCAA Regional in every year since 2000.

Historically, there are not many programs that can match the numbers put up by Florida State: 19 Atlantic Coast Conference titles, 12 NCAA Women's College World Series appearances, one NCAA national championship, two AIAW national titles, 37 All-Americans with 57 total All-America honors and 36 NCAA Championship appearances.

Being a Florida State softball student-athlete does not mean the sole focus is just on the field. Joining the program puts you in an instantaneous family that is fostered by a fun-loving coaching staff that brings out the best in each player through team-building activities.

In addition to the years of tradition etched in the Florida State softball program, the concept of team never holds a greater meaning than for those dressed in Garnet and Gold. Led by Alameda's fun yet focused approach, Florida State softball student-athletes leave their careers with life-long memories.




Community and Academic Success

- The Seminoles recorded a 100 percent participation rate in a variety of activities, including Literacy Week, National Student-Athlete Day, Miracle League Softball, as well as meeting with cancer patients at Tallahassee Memorial Healthcare.
- The Noles also "adopted" Madison Marshall in 2016 through a partnership with the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation. The 16-year old from Clarksville, Fla., found out she had brain cancer in 2015.
- Florida State Softball also "adopted" Hayden Stone in 2019 through the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation, after hearing about her recent diagnosis with a soft-tissue
- · Last season, the Seminoles "adopted" Ella from Team Impact after hearing about her battle with autism.
- In 2024, the Seminoles "adopted" Bailey Silverman and made her the 23rd member of the Seminole Softball team.
- FSU earned the Athletic Director's Cup For Service award in 2014, 2015 and 2018, given to the program with the highest amount of community service hours per student-athlete.
- The program carries several All-ACC Academic Honor Roll students, All-ACC Academic team members, postgraduate scholarship winners, CoSIDA/ESPN All-District and All-American performers.
- In 2024, FSU put a program record 15 athletes on the All-ACC Academic Team. Jaysoni Beachum, Autumn Belviy, Angelee Bueno, Ashtyn Danley, Devyn Flaherty, Madi Frey, Kennedy Harp, Jahni Kerr, Kaley Mudge, Annie Potter, Amaya Ross, Allison Royalty, Isa Torres, Hallie Wacaser and Emma Wilson were all named to the team. FSU also had the program's highest fall GPA in the fall of 2024. Kaley Mudge and Devyn Flaherty were also named CSC Academic All-Americans following the 2024 season.
- Florida State has been recognized three times in the last nine years with the ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year award for success both on and off the field -Kelly Hensley (2013), Alex Powers (2017) and Kylee Hanson (2018).
- Tessa Daniels earned the NCAA's Elite 90 Award in 2018 for holding the highest GPA of any student-athlete at the Women's College World Series.




The Seminole Softball Complex

- Known as one of NCAA softball's best atmospheres, JoAnne Graf Field at the Seminole Softball Complex is a modernized athletic facility that caters quite well to student-athletes, coaches and fans. Since opening in 1999, Florida State has enjoyed the benefits of playing on their home field. The Seminoles have recorded 609 victories in their 22 years at JoAnne Graf Field.
- The complex's unique design was featured in Athletic Business Magazine's 2002 Architectural Showcase. Approaching nearly 12,000 square feet, the FSU Softball batting facility is functional, unique and aesthetically pleasing. The facility, which was awarded the 2011 AIA Tallahassee Chapter Design Achievement Honor Award, is endorsed for its combination of external features, comfortable nature and multiple purposes within the sport of softball.
- The near million dollar facility that was spear-headed by architects Lewis + Whitlock is a beacon for future player development, while providing safety from inclement weather. The updated batting cage facility allows for training in any kind of weather or environment. There are three batting cages and three bullpen slots on the ground floor, while the second floor is an open space with artificial turf that can be used in multiple ways.
- In 2015, FSU finished remodeling the lower level of the Price Family Building, complete with an all-new locker room, as well as an updated training room with brand new contrast baths.
- -In 2020, a new shade structure was installed over the chairback seats to shield the fans from the elements. Over \$1.8 million was raised from donors for the project to continue to improve the fan experience and create a true home-field advantage for the Seminoles.
- Before the start of the 2023 season, JoAnne Graf Field got a new facelift with the addition of a new video board and turf in foul play in the infield. The biggest of the projects were the additions of the premium seating above the right field line and new seating along the berm in left field. In the premium seating in right field, fans now have their own food and beverage stations as well as their own separate bathrooms. Fans will get a great seat to the action with the overhang seating that puts you right near the action in right field. Along the left field line, fans will no longer have to sit on the berm and can now set their own chair on a platformright in front of a drink ledge to provide a better viewing experience.

FAMILY - When you play softball at Florida State, you don't just play for a team, you play for a family. Each person cares for their teammates as if they were a sister, committing to each other through thick and thin. As members of an extended softball family, each one motivates the other and enjoys seeing them succeed. When issues arise, communication is key and allows for a loving relationship that creates a bond that results in an entire team of student-athletes fighting for each other, both on and off the field to be the best they can be.



SMART - Being smart, in a wide variety of disciplines, is a cornerstone of the Florida State softball program. In school, it allows you to achieve a degree and plan for a future after softball. 2018 NCAA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

National Champion.

For a storied program that had reached the Women's College World Series nine times before, had three different National Players of the Year and was led by NFCA Hall of Fame Coach JoAnne Graf who was the first in NCAA history to win 1,400 games, the last accomplishment was finally secured on June 5, 2018 as Florida State earned the NCAA National Championship with a 8-3 win over Washington.

The Seminoles (58-12) received a gutsy performance from Meghan King in the circle and weathered an early deficit in the come-from-behind victory over the Huskies (52-10).

The victory exemplified the "Cardiac Kids" persona that the team took on throughout the ACC and NCAA postseason as the Seminoles became just the third team in NCAA history to lose their first game of the WCWS and come all the way back through the loser's bracket to win



the title, joining Texas A&M (1983) and UCLA (2003).

After falling to No. 3 UCLA, 7-4, in its opening game, Florida State stormed back through the loser's bracket, taking down No. 7 Georgia (7-2), No. 1 Oregon (4-1) and a pair of victories over No. 3 UCLA (3-1 and 12-6) to clinch a spot in the WCWS Championship Series for the first time in program history.

In game one of the finals against Washington, it was a pitcher's duel between FSU's Meghan King and UW's Gabbie Plain and the lone run of the night came on a solo home run by Anna Shelnutt in the top of the sixth inning.

Jessie Warren's heroics at third base stopped the Huskies' comeback hopes as, after a leadoff single, Warren dove in front of the plate to catch a sacrifice bunt attempt and throw to first for a double play. The play was featured on Sportscenter and earned Warren a spot among the nominees for the 2018 ESPY for Best Play.

King was back in the circle for the final and Washington tallied three quick runs after uncharacteristic errors and miscues allowed the Huskies to take an early lead. Shelnutt again sparked the Seminole offense with a two-run home run in the bottom of the first and home runs by Warren and Elizabeth Mason later in the game pushed the FSU lead out to 8-3.

King retired 11 batters in a row until getting out of a bases-loaded jam in the fourth inning, and shut down Washington the rest of the game, allowing just one runner to reach base over the final three innings as the Seminoles secured their first national title.

Jessie Warren was named the WCWS Most Outstanding Player and was joined on the WCWS All-Tournament Team by Meghan King, Anna Shelnutt, Elizabeth Mason and Sydney Sherrill.

It was the 16th National Championship for Florida State, the third for softball and the first in the fastpitch era as the Noles earned AIAW titles in slowpitch in 1981 and 1982.

As a team, Florida State set the WCWS record with 15 stolen bases in the tournament, and matched the record for most wins (6), while etching their name in the Top 5 of 15 different WCWS categories, including doubles (12 - second), runs scored (39 - third), home runs (10 - third) and RBI (37 - third).

Individually, Dani Morgan posted a WCWS record with seven stolen bases and Jessie Warren tied the all-time WCWS mark with 13 hits. Overall, seven different Seminoles now rank in the Top 5 all-time in WCWS history in 15 different categories, including Sydney Sherrill's seven two-out RBI ranks second and Zoe Casas's three doubles and Elizabeth Mason's nine RBI both are tied for fourth.

The Seminoles closed out the 2018 season on the top of the mountain, playing softball the only way they knew how - with fun and joy and love for each other.





2021 NATIONAL RUNNER UP


A run that will never be forgotten.

Still feeling the effects of the season being shut down to COVID-19 the year prior, the Florida State Seminoles went on a magical postseason run to return to the National Championship game.

After falling short in the ACC Tournament Semifinals, the Seminoles rolled through the Tallahassee Regional, going a perfect 3-0 and allowing just two runs.

This created a Super Regional matchup with No. 7 LSU in Baton Rouge, La. In the first game of the Super Regional, Kathryn Sandercock pitched a complete game shutout to blank the Tigers. Cassidy Davis's sacrifice fly in the sixth inning allowed the Noles to take the lead and hold on to it.

Game two of the Super Regional was an instant classic that got sent



into extra innings. Trailing 2-O heading into the sixth inning, the Noles pushed one run across to cut the lead in half heading into the seventh. Devyn Flaherty scored on a passed ball in the bottom of the seventh to tie the game to send it into extra innings.

The Tigers took the lead again in the top of the eighth inning but a solo home run by Elizabeth Mason sent the game into the ninth inning. With runners on first and second in the bottom of the ninth, Kiersten Landers hit one down the left field line to send the Noles to the Women's College World Series once again.

Much like in 2018, the Seminoles lost to UCLA in the first game of the Women's College World Series and would have to fight back through the Joser's bracket,


In the elimination game against Arizona, the Seminoles used another fierce comeback, scoring four runs in the final two innings to beat Arizona. Cassidy Davis's sacrifice fly in the bottom of the seventh kept the Noles alive.

The Noles defeated No. 5 Oklahoma State later that night and won twostraight games against No. 3 Alabama to send them to their second championship series.

The Seminoles won game one of the championship series but ultimately dropped the final two games against No. 1 Oklahoma.

The Seminoles had four super seniors who returned for an extra year due to COVID-19. Cassidy Davis, Anna Shelnutt, Dani Morgan and Elizabeth Mason were all a part of the 2018 National Championship team and were vital to this postseason run.

"I'm so happy for them to be able to end their career here. I can't tell you how many senior conversations we had over the journey of this season," Head Coach Lonni Alameda said. "How can we share it with the vision of where we want to go not only through story, but through the way that we do things, the ups and downs. This is a really trying year. It was a really trying year as a coaching staff, as players, and it wasn't just this season,"





2023 NATIONAL RUNNER UP

For the second time in three years, the Seminoles returned to the Championship series, but the WCWS run of 2023 was unlike any of FSU's previous 11 trips to Oklahoma City.

After a shocking exit in the regional in 2022, the Seminoles were ready to prove that they belong at the top of college softball. Facing one of the toughest schedules in the country that featured 20 regular season games against ranked opponents, 19 of which were away from Tallahassee, FSU found themselves with a 21-6 record and losing three out of four games against Oklahoma State and Oklahoma. The Seminoles then went on a historic run winning 33 out of the next 35 games to clinch the ACC Regular Season Championship and the ACC Tournament Championship.

After defeating Marist and UCF in the first two games of the Tallahassee Regional, FSU found themselves in a similar situation as 2022 as they fell 4-0 to South Carolina to force a winner-take-all game. Kathryn




Sandercock delivered and threw FSU's first postseason perfect game to advance FSU to the Super Regional.

FSU hosted Georgia and dominated the series with wins of 8-1 and 4-2 to send the Seminoles to Oklahoma City for the 12th time in school history.

For the first time in school history, FSU started 3-0 in Oklahoma City outscoring Oklahoma State, Washington and Tennessee 16-2 in the three games to advance FSU to the Championship Series.

The Seminoles would once again face Oklahoma who came holding a 51-game winning streak. Oklahoma outlasted FSU in the Championship Series in two games.

The 2023 WCWS teams was filled with some spectacular moments. Against Washington, Josie Muffley leaped in the air at shortstop to make a game-saving catch which turned into a double play to end the game to send FSU into the National Semifinal.



Against Tennessee, some unsung heroes stepped up as both Bethaney Keen and Hallie Wacaser hit home runs to give FSU a 5-1 win. It was Keen's first home run as a Seminoles and was just Wacaser's third home run of the season.

Kaley Mudge had one of the best catches you'll ever see in college softball in the first game against Oklahoma. Looking like the Sooners were going to end the game with a three-run home run, Mudge leaped and put her glove right over the fence to make the play and extend the game.

Florida State ended the season with a 58-11 record and were crowned ACC Regular Season and Tournament Champions. 2023 was the 19th time FSU has won the ACC Tournament Championship and the 14th time they had won the ACC Regular Season Championship.





"PLAY FOR THOSE WHO CAN'T"

One of the foundational principles that Florida State softball is built on is, "Play for those who can't." The Seminoles have displayed that throughout the years, including recently with people like Taylor Foster, Madison Marshall, Hayden Stone and Monk Bonasorte.

Taylor Foster became part of the FSU family in 2013 through a connection with the ACC, and despite growing up in North Carolina, dreamed of playing softball for the Seminoles. Foster was diagnosed with bone cancer in at the age of 13 and her passion and enthusiasm in the face of such adversity never faltered. The Noles would routinely stop by to see Taylor and her family when playing NC area schools and the players and coaches would often keep touch via calls, texts and video chats. After her passing in April of 2014, an annual memorial tournament and camp was started and organized by FSU softball players, coaches and support staff for youth in North Carolina to share Taylor's passion for the game and tell of her legacy.


In 2016, and through a partnership with The Friends of Jaclyn Foundation, FSU softball adopted Madison Marshall who had been diagnosed with a brain tumor in 2014 at the age of 14. The Friends of Jaclyn Foundation was created in 2005 and pairs children with pediatric brain tumors with collegiate sports teams, as they have seen the symbiotic relationships that are formed help both the child going through such a difficult situation, but also the teams that are able to come along side a family and help them fight and learn a new appreciation and perspective on life.

In 2019, again in partnership with the Friends of Jaclyn Foundation, the Seminoles adopted Hayden Stone, who had been diagnosed with a soft tissue cancer and lives in Tallahassee. Hayden and her family come to nearly every home game and during the 2019 season, the FSU players drew smiley faces on their necks in honor of Hayden as a way for her reduce the stigma of a scar on her neck. The Seminoles adopted Bailey Silverman this season to make her the 23rd member of the Seminole Softball team with Hayden in attendance

Monk Bonasorte, one of the main FSU athletic administrators responsible for hiring Lonni Alameda as head coach in the fall of 2008, had played football at FSU in the late 70s, and was voted into the FSU Athletics Hall of Fame in 1995. As a result, he bled Garnet and Gold and became a significant supporter of FSU softball, as well as all of the other sports on campus. In October of 2015, Bonasorte was diagnosed with brain cancer, yet never wavered in his passion for FSU and life. Right up to his passing in November of 2016, he continued to give his life to this university and be an example of the Florida State "Unconquered" spirit.

In 2017, the Lonni Alameda Softball Camps began the annual Monk Bonasorte Camp (Camp MB42), where the young players in attendance not only learn about the skills of softball, but also about life and who Monk was, what he meant to Florida State and how he battled through such adversity. All of the proceeds of the annual camp go to the FSU Monk Bonasorte Scholarship, and to date, the camp has raised nearly \$10,000.

There are numerous other relationships that have been formed over the years with young fans like Amber Howard and Maddie Briscoe, and even former players such as Dana Bailey that have battled cancer, the FSU players and staff know that there is much more to life than just this game. Though several are now gone, they are certainly not forgotten and remain a significant part of Seminole softball to this day.









1981 & 1982 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

Before the games were televised on ESPN and before there were professional leagues, the main goal of collegiate softball was to go out, give your best and try to win, but mainly the student-athletes were there because they loved the game and they wanted to have fun. For two years in the early 1980's, the Florida State softball team not only had fun, but also dominated its competition and brought home a pair of national championships.

There was plenty of reason for optimism going into the 1981 season after FSU won 13 of its last 15 games the year before and was one game away from advancing to the AIAW National Tournament. Countering the momentum from 1980 was the inexperience of the 1981 roster which featured only six returnees but a host of talented newcomers.

"It was a lot of fun," former head coach Dr. JoAnne Graf said. "They had known each other from summer league ball so I think there was a lot of respect right away. Anytime you win it's a whole lot of fun. That team was in every game, they won, obviously, most of them, but it's always fun to coach people who win and they worked hard. They just had that confidence, that air that they were going to have to lose the game; no one was going to beat them."

Any concerns about the 1981 season were quickly erased as the Seminoles ran out to a 19-2 start with a trio of tournament titles. The only hiccup during the year came at the South Florida Invitational as FSU lost three of four but that also served as a wake up call as the Seminoles won 16-straight games to push their record to 38-5.

Just when the Seminoles had everything going in their favor, another bump in the road came. Winners of its last 16 games, FSU dropped a pair of games to East Carolina to finish second at the North Carolina State Invitational. But just like the losses at South Florida, the setback refocused the Seminoles when they needed it the most.

Few would have guessed that the 5-2 loss to the Pirates would be the Seminoles' last of the season. FSU took four-straight heading into the FAIAW State Tournament where it breezed to the state title with four more wins to match the most wins in school history. Up next was the AIAW Region III Tournament where the Seminoles took the next step, sweeping four more games to advance to the National Tournament.

Proving its versatility, FSU won every way possible, outscoring Western Carolina 13-9 in the first game before winning a defensive triumph 4-3 over North Carolina State. FSU disposed of the Pirates 12-3 then beat North Carolina 4-1 to capture the school's first national championship in women's athletics.

Postseason accolades came in for Darby Cottle as the shortstop collected All-America honors after hitting .428. Joining her on the All-America squad was second baseman Jan Sikes as she hit .477.

"Those teams were so full of life, heart, we had great camaraderie," former player Susan Painter said. "It started at the top with JoAnne. We had a great group of players, but she was the main component. She kept us on top and kept fighting for us and for the title. Every great team has a fit and that one certainly did. It was quite a group. We still keep in touch, but I miss that."

The pieces were in place for another run in 1982 and the Seminoles wasted no time as they won their first 12 games, highlighted by the title at the Florida Invitational - including eight shutouts. Ironically the "low point" of the season came at the Lady Seminole Invitational where FSU lost three in a row.

But just like they had done the previous year, the Seminoles bounced back to win 10-straight, including titles at the Friendly City and South Florida Invitationals. Twice during the middle half of the season the Seminoles scored 30 runs or more, including a 39-5 drubbing of Georgia Southern.

Despite all of FSU's success that year - the Seminoles won four of six regular season tournaments - there was one team it could not get past: rival Florida, Of the 10 losses that season, six came to the Gators, including back-to-back losses at the Montgomery Invitational where FSU finished second.



Similar to 1981, the losses refocused the Seminoles as they won their next 12 going into the FAIAW tournament. UF got the Tribe again 2-1 in the third game, but the Seminoles won a pair to claim the state title. Florida State had relatively little trouble in the regional tournament, only dropping a 2-1 decision to South Florida before beating the Bulls for the trophy.

The stage was set for a repeat and the Seminoles were on a mission having won 21 of their last 23 games. The first three games were a breeze as FSU outscored its opponents 46-6 with wins over Georgia Southern, South Florida and UNC-Charlotte. All that stood between FSU and its second national championships were the Florida Gators.

While Florida State held an 8-6 lead in the season series, Florida was the only team that had been close to FSU over the last five years and handed the Seminoles their worst loss in school history at the time, a 14-0 defeat during the middle of the season. With the championship on the line the Seminoles were at their best and they prevailed 9-4 to claim their second-straight national championship.

The accolades poured in for the Seminoles again, headed by Cottle who was named the Broderick Award winner as the AIAW Player of the Year. She was joined on the All-America squad by Natalie Drouin, Painter, Toni Robinette and Sikes.

"We were like a big family, I don't even remember anyone not getting along," Drouin said. "We had two great teams and I don't know which one was better. They were pretty equal. At the time none of us really knew what we had accomplished, we just wanted to do our best and have fun, but afterwards it was thrilling."

The Seminoles won 110 games those two years with a 54-7 record in 1981 and a 56-10 mark the year after. Florida State was an offensive juggernaut those two seasons, scoring an average of 9.2 runs per game. What might be even more impressive was the Seminoles' pitching and defense. Behind Painter, the team's lone pitcher, FSU gave up only 2.7 runs per game, a number that is unfathomable in slow pitch.

"I remember a lot of team unity and enthusiasm," Cottle said. "We were a group of winners, that's for sure, and we were a team that was willing to do whatever it took to get to the top. I'm just proud to have been part of the teams that started a tradition of winning."

While the AIAW was disbanded one year later and FSU went to NCAA competition in 1984, the players on those teams were the founders of a legacy that continues today.




DR. JOANNE GRAF

Dr. JoAnne Graf spent 30 successful seasons at the helm of the Florida State softball program. With 1,437 victories under her belt, Graf retired on June 15, 2008, with more wins than any other head coach in collegiate softball.

The first collegiate softball coach to earn 1,400 victories, Graf's numerous achievements with Florida State softball include AIAW slowpitch national championships in 1981 and 1982, seven trips to the Women's College World Series, with the first coming in 1986 (just four years after FSU went to NCAA fastpitch softball), 21 NCAA Regional appearances and 10 Atlantic Coast Conference titles.

On April 2, 2005, then-Florida State University President Dr. T.K. Wetherell officially renamed the softball stadium "JoAnne Graf Field at the Seminole Softball Complex," making her





among only two active softball coaches with fields named after them. On September 13, 2013, Graf was inducted into the Florida State Athletics Hall of Fame

One of the most prolific coaches in collegiate softball, Graf concluded her career having won 75 percent of her games (1,437-478-6), including a 1,218-425-6 (.740) mark in NCAA Division I play. Her NCAA career win total is currently 11th all-time. Florida State averaged 50.75 wins per year under her guidance since beginning NCAA play ranked No. 1 during that span.

Graf is a 1975 graduate of Florida State. In 1992, she earned her doctorate degree in athletic administration at FSU, and taught at her alma mater until her retirement in 2013.

In 2019, FSU Softball began naming its first home tournament every season the "JoAnne Graf Classic" to honor the amazing person, teacher and coach that helped set the foundation that has helped the Seminoles be one of the best programs in the nation.


2014 WCWS TEAM: THE TEAM THAT STARTED IT ALL

10 years had gone by since the Florida State softball program had made a trip to the Women's College World Series, and for a program that was dominant in the 90's and early 2000's, a spark was needed.


After reaching a Super Regional in 2013, the 2014 team was hungry for more and was set on bringing the Garnet and Gold back to OKC. After dropping the season opener, FSU rattled off 17 consecutive wins and never looked back as they won their first ACC Regular Season Championship since 2004. FSU went on to win the ACC Tournament and hosted their first NCAA Regional since 2009.

The Seminoles dominated the Tallahassee Regional posting a perfect 3-O record with a win over Fordham and two wins over South Florida to advance to the Super Regionals where they would host Michigan.

The celebration was quickly over as Michigan dominated game one, thrashing the Seminoles 17-3 on their home field, FSU responded with



a 6-0 win in game two, setting up a winner-take-all game three. FSU jumped out to a 1-0 lead after the first inning, but Michigan brought a run across in both the second and the third inning to take the lead. FSU tied the game in the fifth inning to set up a wild finish.





Michigan was primed to take the lead in the top of the seventh inning as they loaded the bases with no out, but National Player of the Year Lacey Waldrop delivered with a strikeout and two groundouts to get the Seminoles out of the inning.

With a runner on in the bottom of the seventh, Courtney Senas hit the biggest home run of her career to walk off the Wolverines to send FSU back to Oklahoma City.

FSU did not pick up a win in Oklahoma City, but the 2014 team paved the way for Florida State Softball to become a perennial power. Since 2014, FSU was won six ACC Regular Season Championships, seven ACC Tournament Championships and has made five trips to the Women's College World Series including the program's first National Championship in 2018.

As part of alumni weekend, Team 31 was honored during the 2024 season as part of the 10-year anniversary.

Entering her 17th season as the head coach of the Florida State softball program in 2025, Hall of Famer Lonni Alameda has guided the Seminoles back into one of the nation's best teams. After seven Women's College World Series appearances from 1987-2004, the Seminoles have returned to the final site of women's collegiate softball five times in the last nine complete seasons (2014, 2016, 2018, 2021 and 2023), including winning the program's first NCAA National Championship in 2018, two WCWS Finals appearances in 2021 and 2023, a WCWS Semifinals appearance in 2016, as well as eight consecutive trips to the NCAA Super Regionals (2013-19, 2021). Florida State had earned seven ACC regular season/division titles in a row and six straight ACC Tournament titles heading into the 2021 season and now owns 19 ACC Tournament Championships while adding 17 ACC Regular Season Championships.

FSU has played in the NCAA postseason every year under Alameda and is one of only seven schools to participate in the NCAA Tournament in every season since 2000. Since Alameda has made Tallahassee her home, she has led the Seminoles to 13 ACC Championship game appearances in 15 full seasons, with titles in 2011, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2021 and 2023. The Seminoles have hosted a NCAA Regional the last 10 seasons and are one of just four programs (Alabama, Oklahoma and UCLA) to host a regional in each of the last 10 seasons.

FSU continued their reign as one of the top programs of the country in 2024 as they finished the season with a 46-16 record and reached a NCAA Super Regional for the 10th time in the last 11 seasons. After a tough start to the season where the Seminoles were 18-9 and were coming off losses in four out of its five games to the likes of Alabama, Duke and Texas, FSU went 22-1 in its next 23 games to put themselves in position to host another NCAA Regional. FSU breezed through the Tallahassee Regional as they went 3-0 in a regional for the first time since 2021. FSU's season ended in the Super Regional

as they fell to eventual Nation! Champion Oklahoma in Norman. FSU had one of the best offenses in school history as they broke the school record for batting average and scored the second-most runs in school history.

Several Seminoles had great individual success throughout the season as a school-record tying eight Seminoles were named to the All-ACC Team. Jaysoni Beachum, Michaela Edenfield, Kalei Harding and Kaley Mudge were each named to the All-ACC First Team. Ashtyn Danley, Devyn Flaherty and Isa Torres were named to the All-ACC Second Team while Jahni Kerr was named to the All-ACC Third Team. Beachum put together one of the greatest freshman seasons in school history and became the first Seminole to win the TUCCI/NFCA Division I Freshman of the Year. Beachum was also named the ACC Freshman of te Year and was a Second Team NFCA All-American. Michaela Edenfield was also named the a Third Team NFCA All-American.

After a shocking exit in the 2022 Tallahassee Regional, Alameda put together one of her best coaching displays in the 2023 season. Returning all but two starters, the Seminoles were ready to prove that they are still one of the top programs in the country, and they did just that. Playing one of the toughest schedules in the country which included 29 games against ranked opponents, 26 of those away from home, the Seminoles posted a 58-11 record. The Seminoles rolled through the ACC schedule finishing 19-2 en route to another ACC Regular Season Championship. The Seminoles did not drop a single series in ACC play and also went on to defeat Syracuse, Virginia Tech and Duke in the ACC Tournament to win their second-straight ACC Championship earning Alameda the ACC Coach of the Year honor.

The Seminoles then faced maybe their toughest mental test of the season in the Tallahassee Regional Final where they fell to South Carolina to force a winner-take-all. The Seminoles responded as Second-Team All-American and ACC Pitcher of the Year Kathryn Sandercock threw the Seminoles' first-ever postseason perfect game to send the Seminoles to the Super Regional. FSU dominated Georgia in the Tallahassee Super Regional in front of back-to-back capacity crowd to advance to their fifth Women's College World Series under Alameda. FSU stayed hot in Oklahoma City winning their first three games by a combined score of 16-1 to advance to the Championship Series for the third time in their last three trips to Oklahoma City. The Seminoles ran into a buzzsaw in Oklahoma who finished with the best record in collegiate softball history to win the National Title over the Seminoles.

The Seminoles placed eight on the three All-ACC teams including Kathryn Sandercock and Jahni Kerr who were named First Team All-ACC. Alameda was also influential in the development of star freshman pitcher Makenna Reid who was named a Top 10 Finalist for the NFCA/TUCCI Freshman of the Year award and was also named a Second Team All-ACC honoree,

In 2022, the Seminole were back on top of the ACC, winning their eighth ACC Championship under Alameda and 18th in school history. Florida State made it into the NCAA Tournament for the 22nd straight year and hosted a regional for the eighth consecutive season. Their number two national seed was the highest seeding that Florida State softball has had in the NCAA Tournament in program history. The Seminoles finished the season with a 54-7 record and a .885 winning percentage. That winning percentage is tied for the highest in a season in school history with the 1982 team that won the AIAW National Championship. The Seminole defense was a big reason why the Noles finished with 54 wins. FSU finished the season with the second-highest fielding percentage in the country (.982) and with the fifth most shutouts in the nation (20). The Florida State defense was led by first-team All-ACC members, Kathryn Sandercock, Sydney Sherrill, Kaley Mudge and Mack Leonard. Sandercock finished the season with a 1.44 ERA and a 30-3 record. Her 30 wins were the second-most in the country. Sherrill was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Year for the third time in her career as she finished the season with a .975 fielding percentage.

The Florida State offense showed some power in 2021 finishing with 70 home runs as a team. Those 70 home runs ranked fourth in a season in school history and led to 363 runs, the sixth-most in a season in school history. The offense was led by transfer Mack Leonard who led the team with a .375 batting average, eight home runs and 49 RBI. Kalei Harding and Michaela Edenfield helped bring home the most runs for the Noles as Harding recorded 15 home runs and 11 doubles leading to a team-high 53 RBI. Edenfield had 16 home runs in her freshman season, three shy of Jessie Warren's freshman record, and accounted for 50 RBI. Sydney Sherrill capped off her career with a .321 batting average and 16 more doubles to finish her career with an ACC and FSU record of 82 career doubles.

The Seminoles came up one win short of claiming their second national title in 2021 as the Noles made it all the way to the Women's College World Series Championship Series. Florida State finished the season with a 49-13-1 record in 2021 and did it differently than years past. FSU was not the power-hitting team of old but won by playing cerebral softball with good pitching and great defense, led by second-team All-American Kathryn Sandercock and the two-time ACC Defensive Player of the Year, Sydney Sherrill. Florida State led the ACC and was ranked 22nd in the country in fielding percentage (.975) in 2021 and finished with the second-best team ERA in the ACC and 11th best in the NCAA (1.82). The Seminole defense also turned and ACC leading 33 double plays, which ranked second in the nation.

The Noles finished second in the ACC regular season and did not win the ACC Tournament for the first time since 2014 but that did not affect their postseason run as the Noles won 10 games in the NCAA Tournament and were one game away from being crowned national champions for the second time in program history. FSU cruised through the Tallahassee Regional, going 3-0 while only allowing two runs. The Noles then headed to Baton Rouge, La. to take on LSU in the Super Regional and the Seminoles swept the Tigers winning 1-0 and 4-3 in nine innings in dramatic fashion to head to the WCWS for the fourth time under Alameda. After losing their first game of the WCWS, Florida State won four straight against Arizona, Oklahoma State and Alabama (twice) to head to the championship series for the second time in program history. After winning game one against Oklahoma the Seminoles would fall in games two and three.

Half of the 2020 Seminoles were newcomers with six freshmen, three transfers and two redshirt players, as the Seminoles replaced five starters from the 2019 season. The youth on the field was matched in the coaching staff as Troy Cameron joined the team, along with many new members of the support staff in several departments. Florida State finished with a 17-7 record in the shortened 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic, with nearly half of its games (11-of 24) coming against ranked



teams. The Noles went 5-6 versus ranked teams in 2020, including a pair of wins over No. 1 Alabama, road wins at No. 21 Arkansas and No. 22 UCF, along with a victory against No. 19 Baylor.

The 2019 FSU Softball team posted a record year offensively, finishing with a program-best 105 home runs, which ranked third in the country and surpassed the previous best of 76 from 2018. The Noles also set school records with 423 RBI and a .330 team batting average. Finishing with a record of 55-10, FSU topped the 50-win mark for the fifth time in the last six years. Sophomore infielder Sydney Sherrill (First Team) and redshirt senior pitcher Meghan King (Second Team) each earned NFCA All-America honors, while the duo – along with Dani Morgan, Elizabeth Mason, Carsyn Gordon, Cali Harrod, Cassidy Davis and Makinzy Herzog – were among the eight Seminoles to be named to the NFCA Southeast All-Region Teams, which led the country and marked the most All-Region honorees in school history.

The Seminoles extended their ACC series unbeaten streak to 52, posting a 48-0-4 series record against conference opponents, dating back to 2012, before losing the series on the road at Louisville on April 6-8, 2019. The Noles have earned a record of 147-18 in their last 165 ACC regular-season games. From May 7, 2016, to April 6, 2018, FSU tallied 36 consecutive wins in ACC play, which ranks as the sixth-longest conference winning streak in NCAA history.

The Seminoles topped the collegiate softball world in 2018, earning their first NCAA National Championship with an 8-3 win over No. 5 Washington on June 5. Florida State earned

the nickname of "Cardiac Kids" throughout the postseason as FSU tied an NCAA record of six wins in elimination games during the NCAA Tournament and the Noles had to come from behind in all three wins at the 2018 ACC Tournament. Florida State became the third team in history to lose its first game of the WCWS and come back through the loser's bracket to win the National Championship, joining Texas A&M (1983) and UCLA (2003).

Florida State earned a 58-12 record in 2018, the most wins in a single season under Alameda and it marks the fourth time in the last five seasons that FSU has topped the 50-win plateau. The Noles also set school records with 115 doubles and 76 home runs. The 115 doubles led the nation in 2018 and ranked in a tie for the eighth-most in a single season in NCAA history. Freshman Sydney Sherrill tallied 29 of those doubles to tie the NCAA single-season record and set the FSU and ACC mark, on her way to earning ACC Freshman of the Year and NFCA Third Team All-American accolades. Jessie Warren and Kylee Hanson also earned NFCA Second Team All-American honors, as the duo were named ACC Player and Pitcher of the Year, respectively.

Alameda, along with assistant coaches Travis Wilson and Craig Snider, were honored as the 2018 NFCA National Coaching Staff of the Year by helping FSU become the first ACC school to ever win a softball national championship.

Alameda and the Noles made program history in 2017, as Florida State earned a No. 1 ranking in the NFCA poll for the first time, holding the spot for eight consecutive weeks. FSU also earned its first win over the NFCA No. 1 team in the country as an 11th-inning home run by Alex Powers gave the Noles a 3-1 victory over Florida on May 3. The Seminoles added their fifth straight ACC regular-season title, posting a 24-0 record in league play, culminating in their 15th ACC tournament championship. FSU is one of four Power 5 schools to post an undefeated conference season, along with Oklahoma in 2019 (18-0) and 2018 (18-0), Nebraska in 1998 (16-0) and Iowa in 1997 (22-0).

Alameda also earned her fifth ACC Coach of the Year honor in 2017, moving into a tie for second-most in league history with North Carolina's Donna J. Papa. She now trails only NFCA Hall of Famer and former FSU head coach JoAnne Graf who tallied six ACC Coach of the Year awards in her illustrious career.

Florida State matched its record from 2016 by placing six members on the 2017 All-ACC First Team, including Jessica Burroughs (Pitcher of the Year) and Jessic Warren (Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year). Burroughs and Warren were also named NFCA First Team All-Americans, while Morgan Klaevemann (second team) and Alex Powers (third team), also earned a spot on the national teams. The Noles tied for the most All-Americans in the nation with Florida and Arizona and it marked the first time in the fastpitch era that Florida State softball had received four All-American accolades.

In 2016, Alameda led Florida State back to the WCWS, reaching the semifinals for the third time in school history and ending with a No. 4 national ranking, which tied for the highest final NFCA ranking ever for FSU. The Noles posted a 55-10 record, including 11 wins over ranked opponents, FSU defeated No. 2 Michigan (1-0) and No. 3 Auburn (4-3), marking the highest-ranked wins at FSU under Alameda, and both coming away from Tallahassee as the Auburn win came on the road and the Michigan victory at the WCWS.

The Noles finished 2016 with a 21-2 record in conference play and Alameda earned ACC Coach of the Year for the fourth straight season as Jessica Burroughs and Alex Powers earned ACC Pitcher and Player of the Year honors, respectively. FSU set an ACC record with six members on the All-ACC First Team as Burroughs and Powers were joined by Ellie Cooper, Meghan King, Morgan Klaevemann and Jessie Warren. Burroughs, Powers and Warren were named NFCA All-Americans, marking the sixth time that FSU had three All-Americans in the same season.

During the summer of 2016 and 2017, Alameda coached the USSSA Pride of the National Pro Fastpitch league. The Pride posted the best record in the league in both seasons.

The Seminoles reached the NCAA Super Regionals for the third consecutive season in 2015, finishing with a record of 49-14 and a No. 10 ranking in the final poll by the NFCA. FSU earned a trio of conference awards as Jessie Warren was named ACC Freshman of the Year, Lacey Waldrop secured ACC Pitcher of the Year honors for the second-straight season and Alameda was chosen as the ACC Coach of the Year for the third consecutive year.

Several Seminoles etched their name into the NCAA record book as senior Maddie O'Brien led the nation with 73 walks, good for No. 11 all-time in NCAA history. Freshman Morgan Klaevemann's 26-game hitting streak is the second-longest in

Florida State posted its best season in a decade with a 55-9 record in 2014 to finish ranked No. 7 in the country by both the NFCA and USA Softball. The Seminoles won 24 ACC games to set a new school and ACC mark for conference wins in a season and also set program records in runs scored (400), home runs (65), extra-base hits (168), RBI (363), walks (318) and slugging percentage (.493).

Several individuals earned regional and national awards as junior pitcher Lacey Waldrop was named USA Softball National Player of the Year. Waldrop joined Jessica van der Linden (2004) as Seminoles to win the national honor. Florida State was the first school in the country to have multiple players win the award. Waldrop joined junior shortstop Maddie O'Brien as an NFCA First Team All-American, marking the first time that FSU had placed two players on the first team in program history.

Waldrop and O'Brien also won 2014 ACC Pitcher and Player of the Year, respectively, while Alameda earned ACC Coach of the Year honors for the second year in a row. The Seminoles placed three players on the AII-Region First Team, six players on the AII-ACC Team, and five members on the ACC AII-Tournament Team.

The signature win of the 2014 season came at the Tallahassee Super Regional when senior Courtney Senas hit a two-run, walk-off home run against No. 13 Michigan to send the Seminoles to the Women's College World Series for the first time since 2004.

It was an impressive season in 2013 for the Seminoles as they fought through several injuries to key players yet reached the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time since 2006 following a miraculous comeback against South Alabama in the Mobile Regional championship game. The five-run comeback with two outs in the top of the seventh against the 13th-seeded Jaguars personified the team's never-say-die attitude. FSU finished with a 44-19 record and Alameda was named the ACC Coach of the Year, along with a school-record four All-ACC First Team selections and five overall.

The Seminoles set a new school mark with an 18-2 record in ACC play en route to the program's 11th ACC regular-season title. As the pitching coach, Alameda was influential on one of the most dynamic duos in the nation in Lacey Waldrop and Monica Perry. Waldrop earned NFCA Third-Team All-America honors, the first at Florida State since 2009, while Perry emerged as the most dominant pitcher in ACC play.

Aside from the five total AII-ACC Team members in 2013, Alameda coached her first ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year when Kelly Hensley was recognized for the honor, Hensley also was named to the Capital One Academic AII-America Third Team. Alex Powers (2017) and Kylee Hanson (2018) also have been named ACC Scholar-Athletes of the Year

In 2012, the Seminoles achieved a mark of 47-16, their most wins since going 62-12 in 2004. Alameda led FSU to a 15-13 record against NCAA postseason teams throughout the year, which included nationally-ranked victories over No. 14 UCLA, No. 23 North Carolina twice and Women's College World Series participant LSU.

As the team's pitching coach, Alameda's influence on FSU starters Lacey Waldrop and Monica Perry was enormous. Both pitchers finished in the Top 30 nationally in earned run average, making FSU one of just five programs to have multiple pitchers in the top 30. Each hurler earned ACC Pitcher of the Week honors twice and were named to the All-ACC squad. As a unit, the Seminoles finished 10th in the country with a 1.53 team ERA. In 2012, four more student-athletes made the All-ACC Team under Alameda's watch including Tiffani Brown, Briana Hamilton, Perry and Waldrop. Brown and Shayla Jackson also were named to the NFCA All-Southeast Region Second Team.

In just her third season as head coach at Florida State, Alameda helped the Seminole softball program snap a seven-year ACC title drought to highlight an entertaining 2011 season. Despite making the conference tournament in Atlanta as the No. 4 seed, it was Alameda's season-long coaching tactics combined with the energy of her motivated group that enabled the Seminoles to storm through the competition and defeat second-seeded North Carolina, 4-1, to clinch an automatic NCAA Regional bid.

Under Alameda's guidance, the 2011 Seminoles created a noteworthy program achievement – for the first time in school history, FSU softball reached 12 consecutive NCAA Regionals. Her group also won two games in the Athens Regional, defeating Georgia State and UAB, to get to the final day of a regional for the first time since 2006.

Adding to Alameda's on and off-field influence, Sarah Hamilton became just one of two conference players in 2011 to be named to the All-ACC Team for the third time in her career. Shayla Jackson and Jen Lapicki joined Hamilton on the 2011 all-conference squad. Hamilton ended her illustrious career as one of the best pitchers

in school history, with Alameda playing a large role in her success. Among her noteworthy feats, Hamilton became the first hurler in FSU history to finish with at least 1,000 career strikeouts, ending her four-year stay with 1,005 Ks.

In her second season as FSU head coach in 2010, Alameda led the Seminoles to a 44-18 record and second-consecutive appearance in not just the ACC Championship game but its 11th-straight appearance in the NCAA Division I Softball Championship. At the time, FSU's ACC Championship game appearance marked the 14th time in school history it had the



chance to play for a title - a total number that was more than any other school in the conference.

Under Alameda's tutelage, the 2010 Seminoles accomplished a lot of statistical feats. Not only did FSU get off to its best start since 1993 by starting the year 20-2, but the team capped off the year with high marks in a bevy of categories. The Seminoles' .297 batting average was the best since 2003 and their 226 strikeouts at the plate were the fewest since the 1998 campaign.

Individually, Alameda coached several FSU student-athletes who earned recognition for their hard work on the field and in the classroom. Carly Wynn was named an All-ACC First Team selection and Terese Gober, Sarah Hamilton and Ashley Stager were each placed on the All-ACC Second Team. Robin Ahrberg, Tiffani Brown and Hamilton each got the nod on the ACC's All-Tournament team. Wynn and Hamilton captured Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I All-Southeast Region Second Team honors, while Wynn was named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America Third Team.

Alameda came to Florida State prior to the 2009 season and went on to surpass 200 career coaching victories in her first year in Tallahassee (she picked up win No. 300 on March 17, 2012 against Fairfield and added win No. 400 at North Carolina on March 30, 2014). The Seminoles finished the 2009 campaign with a 44-16 record and achieved the best conference record in school history at the time with a 17-4 league mark.

For her team's exploits on the field in 2009, Alameda and the Seminoles had the opportunity to host a regional in the NCAA Tournament for the first time since the 2004 season. Alameda coached several Seminoles that garnered postseason awards as Hamilton was named a Third Team Louisville Slugger/NFCA Division I All-American as a sophomore. Hamilton was also named ACC Pitcher of the Year, an ACC First Team member and to the Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Southeast Region Team. Then-senior catcher Kaleigh Rafter was also named to the All-Region team and was an All-ACC First Team member as well. Wynn and Gober (both second team) were also student-athletes coached by Alameda who were recognized as All-ACC players.

Alameda carries an impressive coaching résumé on the international level and from 2004 to 2008 she helped in the development of Canada's National Team. She aided Canada up until the 2004 Summer Olympics and resumed as an assistant following the Rebels' 2005 season. In the summer of 2006, Canada qualified for the 2008 Summer Olympics in Beijing, China, after its strong showing in the World Championships. Alameda spent the summer of 2008 with the Canadian team, which ended its quest for the gold with a fourth-place finish at the Beijing Olympic Games. Alameda went back to the Olympics in the summer of 2021 with Canada as their pitching coach in the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games.

Alameda came to FSU from UNLV, where she spent five seasons reviving the Rebels' program. She replaced Dr. JoAnne Graf, who retired after 30 seasons with the Seminoles. Alameda went 25-35 in her first season at UNLV in 2004, which was a four-game improvement over 2003's final tally. She then posted a staggering 44-19 mark in 2005 and the program's first trip to NCAA Regionals since 1996. Alameda was named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year in 2005 and the entire staff garnered NFCA West Regional Coaching Staff of the Year honors.

The 2005 season featured an assault on the program's record book, appearances in the national statistical rankings and the introduction of several conference and national award winners. The 44 wins were the third-most in the program's history, while the 17 Mountain West Conference wins were the most-ever since joining the league in 1999. After being predicted to finish last in the league, UNLV excelled, placing second in the league in both the regular season and Mountain West Conference tournament.

In 2006, the squad was set back by injuries and fell to 26-37, but saw a 180-degree turnaround in 2007 and finished with a 37-27 mark as Alameda earned MWC Coach of the Year honors for the second time.

Alameda and UNLV had high hopes for 2008 and had the Rebels ranked in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll for the first time in program history. After starting the season 9-1-1, UNLV moved up to No. 18 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 Poll, but injuries to four starters proved costly as the season progressed.

Under Alameda's direction, the Rebels enjoyed recognition at the conference and regional level. Five Rebels garnered Louisville Slugger/NFCA All-Regional honors while 13 players earned all-Mountain West Conference accolades, including two pitchers of the year and one freshman of the year awards.

To Alameda, academics are just as important as on-the-field production. Since taking over the program, the Rebels had 58 Academic All-MWC honorees. Over that time span, the team had 10 or more honored in a season four times, including 11 softball student-athletes in 2008. The softball program had 21 MWC Scholar-Athletes selected, as well.

In her 13 seasons at Florida State, Alameda's academic priorities have been apparent. She has coached three ACC Scholar-Athletes of the Year, three academic All-Americans, eight NCAA postgraduate scholarship award winners, 16 academic all-district team members and 41 All-ACC Academic Team players.

During her tenure at UNLV, Alameda also stressed the importance of community service and had players volunteer their time at the Nevada Childhood Cancer Foundation and Child Haven while participating in breast cancer walks and blood drives. Her emphasis has not changed since arriving at FSU, with the 2011 Seminole Squad earning honors such as the SemiGnome Award for community service and routinely producing standout student-athletes who are honored for their charitable ways. One of those players was Kelly Hensley who was awarded a 2013 Top Six For Service honor. In 2014, 2015 and 2017, the Seminole softball program earned the FSU Director's Cup for Service as they averaged over 50 hours of community service per student-athlete to lead all 20 FSU varsity sports.

Alameda moved to Las Vegas after eight seasons as the assistant coach at Stanford University, where she helped guide the Cardinal to a 320-179-1 record and six straight NCAA Regional appearances. She oversaw the pitching staff there and produced three All-Americans: Becky Blevins, Marcy Crouch and Dana Sorenson.

Prior to her stint at Stanford, Alameda spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Barry University (Miami Shores, Fla.). She helped the Buccaneers to a fifth-place NCAA Division II finish in her first year. She also spent some time on the international stage, serving as an instructor for both the Aruba (1995) and Spanish (2000) national teams.

An all-around great athlete, Alameda began her collegiate career as a pitcher at St. Mary's University (San Antonio, Texas) where she led the Rattlers to the NAIA Tournament in her only season. She later transferred to Oklahoma in 1989 and played softball and volleyball for the Sooners. She was a two-time All-Big Eight selection as a first and third baseman while hitting .359 as a senior in 1992.

Alameda earned her bachelor's degree in communications from Oklahoma in 1993 and played softball professionally in Europe for a season before beginning her coaching career.

Assistant Florida State softball coach Travis Wilson will begin his 14th season at Florida State in 2025 as he leads the Seminole offense and defense. FSU has earned eight ACC regular season/division titles, eight ACC tournament championships, 10 trips to the NCAA Super Regionals, five appearances in the Women's College World Series and won the 2018 NCAA National Championship, while posting a 642-149-2 record (.812 winning percentage) in his 13 years at Florida State. Wilson, along with head coach Lonni Alameda and former assistant coach Craig Snider, earned 2018 NFCA National Coaching Staff of the Year honors.

The Noles have turned their offensive production around under Wilson, as they have had at least 335 runs scored, 460 hits, 50 home runs and 300 RBI in 10 of the last 12 full seasons. When Wilson arrived at Florida State after the 2011 season, the Seminoles had finished the year with 286 runs scored, 40 home runs and 238 RBI. Overall, the Seminole offense has continued to see great improvement under Wilson. Since he came to campus, Florida State has set school records for batting average, runs, home runs, doubles and RBI.

FSU continued their reign as one of the top programs of the country in 2024 as they finished the season with a 46-16 record and reached a NCAA Super Regional for the 10th time in the last 11 seasons. After a tough start to the season where the Seminoles were 18-9 and were coming off losses in four out of its five games to the likes of Alabama, Duke and Texas, FSU went 22-1 in its next 23 games to put themselves in position to host another NCAA Regional. FSU breezed through the Tallahassee Regional as they went 3-0 in a regional for the first time since 2021. FSU's season ended in the Super Regional as they fell to eventual National Champion Oklahoma in Norman. FSU set the school record for batting average in a single season (.332) and scored the second-most runs in the school history (456). FSU finished top 10 nationally in runs per game, batting average, doubles, home runs per game, on-base percentage, slugging percentage and walks. Wilson helped produce some stars on Florida State's offense as Jaysoni Beachum was named the 2024 TUCCI/NFCA Division I Freshman of the Year after having the best freshman season in school history. Beachum was named the ACC Freshman of the Year and joined Michaela Edenfield as FSU's two NFCA All-America honorees.

After a shocking exit in the 2022 Tallahassee Regional, the Seminoles were ready to prove that they are still one of the top programs in the country, and they did just that. Playing one of the toughest schedules in the country which included 29 games against ranked opponents, 26 of those away from home, the Seminoles posted a 58-11 record. The Seminoles rolled through the ACC schedule finishing 19-2 en route to another ACC Regular Season Championship. The Seminoles did not drop a single series in ACC play and also went on to defeat Syracuse, Virginia Tech and Duke in the ACC Tournament to win their second-straight ACC Championship. The Seminoles went on to win both the Tallahassee Regional and the Tallahassee Super Regional to advance to the Women's College World Series. The Seminoles had their best start in school history in Oklahoma City going 3-0 to advance to the Championship Series. The Seminoles eventually fell to Oklahoma to finish as National Runner-Ups for the second time in the past three seasons.

In 2023, Wilson helped the Seminoles finish top 25 nationally in runs, slugging percentage and on-base percentage while also leading the country in doubles.

In 2021, the Seminole were back on top of the ACC, winning their 18th ACC Championship in school history. Florida State made it into the NCAA Tournament for the 22nd straight year and hosted a regional for the eighth consecutive season. Their number two national seed was the highest seeding that Florida State softball has had in the NCAA Tournament in program history. The Seminoles finished the season with a 54-7 record and a .885 winning percentage. That winning percentage is tied for the highest in a season in school history with the 1982 team that won the AIAW National Championship. The Seminole defense was a big reason why the Noles finished with 54 wins. FSU finished the season with the second-highest fielding percentage in the country (.982) and with the fifth most shutouts in the nation (20). The Florida State defense was led by first-team All-ACC members, Kathryn Sandercock, Sydney Sherrill, Kaley Mudge and Mack Leonard. Sandercock finished the season with a 1.44 ERA and a 30-3 record. Her 30 wins were the second-most in the country. Sherrill was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Year for the third time in her career as she finished the season with a .975 fielding percentage.

The Florida State offense showed some power in 2021 finishing with 70 home runs as a team. Those 70 home runs ranked fourth in a season in school history and led to 363 runs, the sixth-most in a season in school history. The offense was led by transfer Mack Leonard who led the team with a .375 batting average, eight home runs and 49 RBI. Kalei Harding and Michaela Edenfield helped bring home the most runs for the Noles as Harding recorded 15 home runs and 11 doubles leading to a team-high 53 RBI. Edenfield had 16 home runs in her freshman season, three shy of Jessie Warren's freshman record, and accounted for 50 RBI. Sydney Sherrill capped off her career with a .321 batting average and 16 more doubles to finish her career with an ACC and FSU record of 82 career doubles.

Florida State finished the 2021 season with a 49-13-1 record in 2021 and did it differently than years past. FSU was not the power-hitting team of old but won by playing cerebral softball with good pitching and great defense, led by second-team All-American Kathryn Sandercock and the two-time ACC Defensive Player of the Year, Sydney Sherrill. Florida State led the ACC and was ranked 22nd in the country in fielding percentage (.975) in 2021 and finished with the second-best team ERA in the ACC and 11th best in the NCAA (1.82). The Seminole defense also turned and ACC leading 33 double plays, which ranked second in the nation.

In the shortened 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Seminoles played well and posted a 17-7 record, despite having half of the team as newcomers (11-of-22 with six freshmen, three transfers and two redshirt freshmen), as well as playing a competitive schedule with nearly half of FSU's games coming against ranked teams (11-of-24). The Noles ranked 12th in the NCAA in scoring with 6.83 runs per game and were outstanding defensively, recording a .977 fielding percentage to rank 11th in the nation and were fifth in the NCAA with 14 double plays.

Another season of record-setting offense was on display for the Seminoles in 2019, as Florida State finished third in the country with 105 home runs, easily surpassing the previous mark of 76 HRs from 2018. The Noles had seven different players with at least 10 home runs (Sydney Sherrill, Cali Harrod, Carsyn Gordon, Dani Morgan, Elizabeth Mason, Cassidy Davis and Anna Shelnutt) and six with 40 or more RBI, as FSU also set a school record with 423 RBI. FSU also set a record with a .330 batting average and a .601 slugging percentage as the Noles finished in the top 20 in the NCAA in six different categories.

Sophomore Sydney Sherrill led the team in six different categories and finished with a .405 batting average, 18 doubles, 16 home runs, 60 RBI, .762 slugging percentage and 75 hits as the infielder earned NFCA First Team All-America honors. Cali Harrod became the only player in the country since at least 2011 (as far back as the NCAA records would go) to record 15+ home runs and 40+ stolen bases in the same season, as the senior shortstop finished with 15 home runs and 43 stolen bases.

Florida State set single-season team records in doubles (115) and home runs (76) in 2018 on its way to its first NCAA National Championship. The Seminoles became the third school in WCWS history to lose its first game of the tournament and come back through the loser's bracket to win the title, joining Texas A&M (1983) and UCLA (2003). In all, the Noles won six elimination games in the NCAA Tournament, to tie an all-time record.

The 115 doubles led the country in 2018 and ranked in a tie for eighth-most in a single season in NCAA history, led by freshman Sydney Sherrill who tallied 29, which set FSU and ACC records and tied for the most in the NCAA. Senior Jessie Warren closed out her impressive career with her third NFCA All-American honor and second-straight ACC Player of the Year accolade. She led the team with a .404 batting average, 21 home runs, 70 RBI and a .836 slugging percentage and was the 2018 WCWS Most Outstanding Player. She finished with FSU and ACC records for home runs (83), RBI (273), runs scored (229) and slugging percentage (.820). The 273 RBI ranks eighth in NCAA history, while the 83 HR are tied for eighth all-time and her .820 slugging

The offensive production in 2018 came from all over the lineup as 13 different players hit at least one extra-base hit, 13 players scored at least 10+ runs, eight different players had 10+ stolen bases and all nine spots in the batting order had at least one extra-base hit at the 2018 Women's College World Series.

2017 saw the Seminole offense become one of the best in the nation, as Florida State finished in the top 10 in the NCAA in eight different categories, including slugging percentage (fourth – 0.544), on-base percentage (fourth – 0.429), scoring (fifth – 6.63) and batting average (seventh – 0.329). FSU set school records with 94 doubles and 71 home runs, and along with its 24 triples became the first team since Notre Dame in 2010 to tally at least 90 doubles, 20 triples and 70 home runs in a season.

Seven different FSU players recorded over 35 RBI in 2017, led by junior Jessie Warren who topped the team with a .413 batting average, 14 doubles, 23 home runs, 68 RBI and a .922 slugging percentage as she earned NFCA First Team All-America honors, along with ACC Player and Defensive Player of the Year accolades.

FSU posted a perfect 24-0 record in ACC play in 2017 for its fifth consecutive regular-season conference title and is one of three Power 5 schools to have an undefeated conference slate – Nebraska (16-0 in 1998) and Iowa (22-0 in 1997).

FSU broke several school records and nearly toppled a few others in 2016 as the Noles established program records with 459 runs scored, 407 RBI and a .323 batting average. The team also finished second in FSU history with 155 stolen bases and 63 home runs, and fourth all-time with 87 doubles.

Redshirt junior Alex Powers and Jessie Warren carried the FSU offense to the 2016 WCWS semifinals, as each were named NFCA All-Americans. Powers, the 2016 ACC Player of the Year, led the team with a .396 batting average and 16 doubles while adding 16 home runs and 62 runs scored. Warren led the team and finished in the top 10 nationally with 20 home runs, 78 RBI and 72 runs scored, ranking second in FSU history in a single season in all three categories.

The 2016 offense was aggressive and effective as five players had at least 11 stolen bases, seven players had at least nine doubles and 10 different student-athletes hit a home run en route to an ACC regular season and tournament championship. The Noles set an ACC record with six members on the All-ACC First Team as Powers and Warren were joined by Jessica Burroughs, Ellie Cooper, Meghan King and Morgan Klaevemann.

A pair of freshmen led the Seminole offense in 2015 as Jessie Warren earned ACC Freshman of the Year honors and finished with 19 home runs, 57 RBI and 53 runs scored to lead the team. Morgan Klaevemann led the team with a .393 batting average and 20 stolen bases as the outfielder also recorded a 26-game hitting streak from March 25 to May 17. The Noles earned the ACC Championship for the second year in a row and advanced to the NCAA Super Regional round for the third consecutive season in 2015.

The 2014 Seminoles reached the Women's College World Series for the first time since 2004, posted a 55-9 record and earned the ACC regular-season title with a 24-3 mark. The 24 ACC wins set a new school and ACC record for conference wins in a season and gave the Seminoles the No. 1 seed on their way to winning their 12th ACC Tournament Championship.

Under Wilson's guidance, the Florida State lineup was dangerous from top to bottom and saw many players recognized for their success. Maddie O'Brien set new single-season school records for home runs (24), RBI (83), walks (56) and slugging percentage (.942) on her way to being named an NFCA First Team All-American and ACC Player of the Year. Courtney Senas was named to the NFCA All-Southeast Region First Team would have set school records in home runs (15) and RBI (57) if not for her teammate, as both totals were more than any Semnole had hit prior to the 2014 season.

As a team, the Seminoles set program records in runs scored (400), home runs (65), extrabase hits (168), RBI (363), walks (318) and slugging percentage (.493). These marks eclipsed several records that were set during the impressive 2013 campaign that saw FSU reach its first NCAA Super Regional since 2006. Wilson helped Florida State achieve record-breaking numbers in just his second season as the Seminoles shattered the previous home run record of 49 in 2007 by producing 60 round-trippers in 2013. For the first time ever, four Seminoles finished with double-digit home runs including Courtney Senas (14), Kelly Hensley (13), Mad-

die O'Brien (10) and Celeste Gomez (10).

Florida State's 316 RBIs in 2013 set a school record, topping the previous mark of 313 in 2004. The 2013 squad also set a program record for slugging percentage at .476, were able to win 17 games by mercy rule and recorded 20 games with double-digit base hits. Wilson also oversees the team's fielding and with early-season injuries in 2013 throwing players into makeshift positions, Wilson worked arduously with each infielder and outfielder on their mechanics and created a well-accomplished group that got the job done.

Joining assistant coach Craig Snider as the team's offensive instructors, Wilson helped the Seminoles make strides at the plate in their debut 2012 year. Coaching a youthful unit that included just one everyday senior starter, Wilson also made a great impact on the team's defensive game as it became a sound group in the field.

In 2012, the Seminoles finished the year with a .966 fielding percentage to rank in the upper echelon on a national scale. FSU became an entertaining group to watch defensively as student-athletes such as third baseman Briana Hamilton, shortstop Maddie O'Brien, second baseman Tiffani Brown and centerfielder Courtney Senas made a bevy of highlight-reel plays throughout the season. A fundamentally sound unit of infielders and outfielders collectively produced both the routine and difficult plays.

It was the solid play of FSU's defensive stalwarts that helped the Seminoles begin the 2012 season with a 16-0 record, the second-best start in school history. The 16-game win streak ties for the 12th longest winning stretch for the program.

Wilson is seen as an excellent instructional mind by FSU's student-athletes, which was evident from the first day of practice in fall 2011. He is a reliable arm for **bat**ting practice who is always offering excellent teaching points to better enlighten each player. Wilson has proven to be an absolute student of the game who utilizes various statistics in his meticulous game-day preparation.

Wilson is a native of New Zealand who has already taken on an important role in recruiting. The baseball, softball and cricket veteran serves as the Seminoles' hitting and fielding coach, using his past success as a player to better serve his student-athletes.

"Travis is from both professional baseball and the New Zealand National Program," head coach Lonni Alameda said when Wilson first arrived in summer 2011. "From the first time I met Travis I knew he would be a great fit for our program. It is not often you come across someone that has played the same game that the girls do and yet has 10 years of Major League Baseball experience. He is personable and he has won at the highest level of this game from the men's side. He has played every position you can on the field and has been among some of the world's best in men's fastpitch. I believe Travis will be able to relate to the players on a unique level as he stills plays the game. He is excited about this opportunity and can help our program get to the next level."

Alameda's words have become prophetic so far, with Wilson doing an excellent job of working with each student-athlete and enhancing their overall game. In his eight seasons of work, countless players have improved their offense and expanded their defensive abilities through the work of Wilson.

From 1996-2004, Wilson played seven seasons in the Atlanta Braves organization covering all stops from Rookie Ball to Triple-A. He enjoyed much success in his professional stint, being named an All-Star for the Appalachian League (1998), South Atlantic League (1999) and the Carolina League (2000). He was named Carolina League Player of the Year for the Myrtle Beach Pelicans and led the Grapefruit League in hitting for the

Braves during spring training in 2001.

Wilson ended his professional career in 2004 with the Cincinnati Reds organization in Chattanooga, Tenn. As a softball player in New Zealand for the Black Sox, he made his debut as a 16-year old in 1994 and was named both the New Zealand Softballer of the Year and the Canter bury Softballer of the Year after posting a team-best .396 batting average in 1996. He would earn the Canterbury Player of the Year honor multiple times and become one of his country's biggest softball ambassadors. Wilson also was named the New Zealand Softballer of the Year in 2006 and was voted into the New Zealand Softball Hall of Fame in 2017.

Wilson's most recent baseball stint was as an instructor for the Idaho Falls, a Rookie League team of the Kansas City Royals. His tasks included scouting the Pioneer League, writing reports and utilizing video while communicating with the Royals organization on several prospects. His efforts have helped the Royals claim their status of having the best farm system in Major League Baseball, as asserted by several minor-league publications. On the field, he helped his players develop their infield/outfield skills, base running and hitting mechanics. Wilson also served as an expert commentator for the ISF Men's World Softball Series and was a fielding coach and video analyst for the Black Caps of the New Zealand Cricket Association.

From 2015-2017, he served as the assistant coach for the USSSA Pride of the National Pro Fastpitch league, helping the Pride lead the league in the regular-season standings and finish second in the postseason in all three seasons.

Wilson is married to his wife, Jill. The two have a son named Tyler and a daughter named Josie.



ASSISTANT COACH TROY CAN



Assistant Florida State softball coach Troy Cameron will begin his 6th season at Florida State in 2025 as he helps lead the Seminole offense and defense. Cameron came to Tallahassee after seven years as the high school baseball coach at St. Thomas Aquinas in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. FSU has earned two ACC Tournament championships, three trips to the NCAA tournament two appearances in the Women's College World Series, in which the Seminoles finished as national runners-up in both 2021 and 2023, while posting a 224-54-1 record (.805 winning percentage) in his five years at Florida State.

FSU continued their reign as one of the top programs of the country in 2024 as they finished the season with a 46-16 record and reached a NCAA Super Regional for the 10th time in the last 11 seasons. After a tough start to the season where the Seminoles were 18-9 and were coming off losses in four out of its five games to the likes of Alabama, Duke and Texas, FSU went 22-1 in its next 23 games to put themselves in position to host another NCAA Regional. FSU breezed through the Tallahassee Regional as they went 3-0 in a regional for the first time since 2021. FSU's season ended in the Super Regional as they fell to eventual National Champion Oklahoma in Norman. FSU set the school record for batting average in a single season (.332) and scored the second-most runs in the school history [456]. FSU finished top 10 nationally in runs per game, batting average, doubles, home runs per game, on-base percentage, slugging percentage and walks. Cameron helped produce some stars on Florida State's offense as Jaysoni Beachum was named the 2024 TUCCI/NFCA Division I Freshman of the Year after having the best freshman season in school history. Beachum was named the ACC Freshman of the Year and joined Michaela Edenfield as FSU's two NFCA All-America honoress. FSU's two NFCA All-America honorees.

After a shocking exit in the 2022 Tallahassee Regional, the Seminoles were ready to prove that they are still one of the top programs in the country, and they did just that. Playing one of the toughest schedules in the country which included 29 games against ranked opponents, 26 of those away from home, the Seminoles posted a 58-11 record. The Seminoles rolled through the ACC schedule finishing 19-2 en route to another ACC Regular Season Championship. The Seminoles did not drop a single series in ACC play and also went on to defeat Syracuse, Virginia Tech and Duke in the ACC Tournament to win their second-straight ACC Championship. The Seminoles went on to win both the Tallahassee Regional and the Tallahassee Super Regional to advance to the Women's College World Series. The Seminoles had their best start in school history in Oklahoma City going 3-0 to advance to the Championship Series. The Seminoles eventually fell to Oklahoma to finish as National Runner-Ups for the second time in the past three seasons.

In 2021, the Seminole were back on top of the ACC, winning their 18th ACC Championship in school history. Florida State made it into the NCAA Tournament for the 22nd straight year and hosted a regional for the eighth consecutive season. Their number two national seed was the highest seeding that Florida State softball has had in the NCAA Tournament in program history. The Seminoles finished the season with a 54-7 record and a .885 winning percentage. That winning percentage is tied for the highest in a season in school history with the 1982 team that won the AIAW National Chamfor the highest in a season in school history with the 1982 team that won the ALAW National championship. The Seminole defense was a big reason why the Noles finished with 54 wins. FSU finished the season with the second-highest fielding percentage in the country (.982) and with the fifth most shutouts in the nation (20). The Florida State defense was led by first-team All-ACC members, Kathryn Sandercock, Sydney Sherrill, Kaley Mudge and Mack Leonard. Sandercock finished the season with a 1.44 ERA and a 30-3 record. Her 30 wins were the second-most in the country. Sherrill was named the ACC's Defensive Player of the Year for the third time in her career as she finished the season with a .975 fielding percentage.



The Florida State offense showed some power in 2021 finishing with 70 home runs as a team. Those
70 home runs ranked fourth in a season in school history and led to 363 runs, the sixth-most in a
season in school history. The offense was led by transfer Mack Leonard who led the team with a .375 batting average, eight home runs and 49 RBI. Kalei Harding and
Michaela Edenfield helped bring home the most runs for the Noles as Harding recorded 15 home runs and 11 doubles leading to a team-high 53 RBI. Edenfield had 16 home
runs in her freshman season, three shy of Jessie Warren's freshman record, and accounted for 50 RBI. Sydney Sherrill capped off her career with a .321 batting average
and 16 more doubles to finish her career with an ACC and FSU record of 82 career doubles.

Florida State finished the 2021 season with a 49-13-1 record in 2021 and did it differently than years past. FSU was not the power-hitting team of old but won by playing cerebral softball with good pitching and great defense, led by second-team All-American Kathryn Sandercock and the two-time ACC Defensive Player of the Year, Sydney Sherrill. Florida State led the ACC and was ranked 22nd in the country in fielding percentage (,975) in 2021 and finished with the second-best team ERA in the ACC and 11th best in the NCAA (1.82). The Seminole defense also turned and ACC leading 33 double plays, which ranked second in the nation.

During Cameron's first full season with the Seminoles in 2021, he helped lead them to the Women's College World Series as they earned a spot in the championship series against Oklahoma. Under his coaching, the Florida State defense recorded 33 double plays in 2021 which led the ACC and was second in the nation. Florida State was



in the top-to in 11 different statistical categories, including No. 1 in double plays, fielding percentage, shutouts, stolen bases and walks. The Seminoles finished the season with a 49-13-1 record as they ended the season ranked second in the country.

Thrown into the fire immediately in his first season working in softball, Florida State posted a 17-7 record during the shortened 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic, as half of the players on the roster were new like him (11-of-22 with six freshmen, three transfers and two redshirt freshmen) and the Seminoles played nearly half of their games against ranked teams (11-of-24). The Noles earned five ranked wins on the season, including a pair of wins over No. 1 Alabama, road wins at No. 21 Arkansas and No. 22 UCF, along with a win against No. 19 Baylor. FSU finished in the top 35 of the NCAA in 10 different categories, including ranking fifth in double plays (14), 11th in fielding percentage (.977) and 12th in scoring (6.83 runs per

A first-round draft pick by the Atlanta Braves in 1997 (29th overall), Cameron played nine years of professional baseball with five different organizations – Atlanta, Cleveland, Colorado, Chicago White Sox and San Diego. Cameron signed a national letter of intent to play college baseball at Florida State under Mike Martin but pursued professional baseball out of high school after he was drafted in the first round.





Cameron reunited with FSU assistant coach Travis Wilson, as the pair made their professional baseball debuts in Rookie League together with the Danville Braves in 1997. Cameron and Wilson were roommates, as well as teammates, for five different seasons within the Braves organization through Rookie, A and A+ ball from 1997-2001.

Through his nine seasons of professional baseball as an infielder, advancing to AAA with the Portland Beavers, Cameron posted a career batting average of ,238 with 782 hits, 178 doubles, 26 triples, 122 home runs, 477 RBI and 496 runs scored.

Along with being the coach of St. Thomas Aquinas, he has worked with USA Baseball in numerous capacities since 2013, including as an assistant on the 15U National Team in 2017, which won the gold medal at the Pan Am Championships and currently as the manager of the 2019 15U National Team, that will compete at the 2019 Pan Am Championships in Mexico in September.

At the helm of the STA Raiders, Cameron was named the District Coach of the Year in all seven seasons (2013-19), led the Raiders to District Championships and the Regional semifinals each year, including two regional championships (2013 & 2018) and the 2018 FHSAA 8A State Championship. He has coached seven players that have been drafted and are currently playing professional baseball, as well as 49 players that have gone to play college baseball, with 22 at the Division I level.



A graduate of Florida Atlantic in 2012, Cameron has worked in insurance along with coaching baseball at St. Thomas Aquinas, Cameron is married to his wife Lauren, and they have a daughter Jaden and a son Crew.

ASSISTANT COACH KALEIGH RAFTER



After two seasons as the Seminoles' volunteer assistant coach, Kaleigh Rafter was promoted to assistant coach prior to the 2024 season. Rafter also currently serves as the head coach for the Canadian National Team.

Rafter primarily works with the Seminoles' catchers and offense and has served as FSU's primary first base coach for the past two seasons. Rafter has been an integral part in the development of two-time All-ACC catcher in Michaela Edenfield. In three seasons with the Seminoles, Edenfield has hit 44 home runs which is the fourth-most ever by a Seminole and has drove in 152 runs for FSU which ranks 10th all-time in school history.

Rafter helped the Seminoles to a National Runner-Up finish at the 2023 Women's College World Series and helped FSU to an ACC Regular Season Championship and another ACC Tournament Championship.

Rafter competed with the Canadian Women's National Team for 15 seasons. She is a two-time Olympian, a four-time Pan American Games medallist (one gold; three silver) and represented Canada in five WBSC World Cups, winning three bronze medals. She also won a gold medal at the 2007 Universiade (World University Games) and played two seasons of professional softball in Japan and one in the National Pro Fastpitch League.

While competing with the Canadian National Team, Rafter had the opportunity to coach at the NCAA level, serving as a student assistant coach and volunteer coach in several stints at Florida State University (2009-2010; 2012-2013; 2015 and currently) and as an assistant coach at the University of New York at Buffalo (2015-2016) and the University of Virginia (2016-2019). Rafter is a Competition – Development Certified coach in the Coaching Association of Canada's National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP).

Rafter's collegiate career was split between the University of Detroit (2005-07) and Florida State University (2009) where she transferred after the 2008 Olympics to join Coach Lonni Alameda who had worked with Team Canada for the Games. She set a Detroit single season homerun record in 2007 while earning Horizon League Player of the Year honours. Rafter played professionally in Japan for Team Honda for two seasons.

PLAYER PERFORMANCE DIRECTOR ELLIE COOOPER



Before the 2023 season, Ellie Cooper was named the Player Performance Director for the Seminoles. She is in charge of implementing and developing the mental game and player performance while assisting with technology, video and the day-to-day operations of Florida State softball.

The Seminoles also won another ACC Regular Season Championship after going 19-2 in conference play and won their second-straight ACC Tournament Championship.

Cooper was a member of the Seminoles from 2014-17 and was on staff as a Student Assistant during the Seminoles' 2018 National Championship run.

During her time at Florida State, she was named to the All-ACC team twice (2015 and 2016) and was named a member of the NFCA Southeast All-Region Second Team in 2016. During her time in Tallahassee, she hit .319 with 122 RBI, 31

doubles, seven triples and seven home runs while getting on base 41.7 percent of the time. Cooper was a mainstay at second base, playing in 243 games in her career and finishing with a .960 fielding percentage.

In her four seasons at FSU, the Noles won four ACC Championships and reached four NCAA Super Regionals with two trips to the Women's College World Series.

JESSICA VAN DER LINDEN 2004 USA Softball Player of the Year

- Jessica van der Linden was one of the top two-way players in Florida State softball history.
- Van der Linden was a two-time First Team All-American in 2003 and 2004.
- Van der Linden was a four-time All-ACC selection and was named the ACC Player of the Year in 2004.
- Van der Linden was inducted into FSU's Hall of Fame in 2014.
- In 2004, van der Linden finished the season with a 0.60 ERA in 246.1 innings. She recorded 387 strikeouts compared to just 51 walks. Her 387 strikeouts is the most every by a FSU player.
- Along with her pitching, van der Linden was phenomenal in the batter's box.
- Jessica's .361 career batting average is tied for fourth in school history.
- She also ranks in the top 10 in hits, doubles, triples, RBI and walks.
- Van der Linden helped the Noles to two Women's College World Series appearances in 2002 and 2004, ending a nine-year drought for the Seminoles.





LACEY WALDROP 2014 USA Softball Player of the Year

- Lacey Waldrop was one of Lonni Alameda's first top pitchers at FSU and helped the Noles to the Women's College World Series in 2014.
- Waldrop was a four-time All-ACC selection and a threetime All-American.
- Waldrop is one of two Seminoles to win multiple ACC Pitcher of the Year awards as she won the award in back-to-back season in 2014 and 2015. Jessica Burroughs won the award in 2016 and 2017.
- During the 2014 season, Waldrop finished with a 1.13 ERA and a school record 38 wins in 48 appearances.
- In her four seasons at FSU, Waldrop never had more than a 1.53 ERA which came in her sophomore season.
- Waldrop finished her career in the top 10 in FSU history for appearances, innings pitched, wins, strikeouts and saves. Waldrop's 287 strikeouts in 2014 ranks ninth in school history.
- Waldrop went on to play three seasons professionally with the Chicago Bandits from 2015-17.

DARBY COTTLE 1982 Broderick Award

- Darby Cottle was one of the top players in all of softball during her time at Florida State.
- Cottle was a two-time All-American in 1981 and 1982 for the Seminoles.
- She earned the 1982 Broderick Award which was awarded to the top slow-pitch softball player in the country.
- Over the course of her career, Cottle hit .425 in 222 games while driving in 181 runs.
- In the 1982 season, Cottle hit .459 with 10 home runs and 44 RBI.


- Jessi Warren ended her career as one of the best to ever play softball at Florida State, in the ACC and in the history of the NCAA as she led the Seminoles to their first NCAA National Championship.
- Finished with the FSU and ACC records for home runs (83), RBI (273), runs scored (229) and slugging percentage (.820)...The 273 RBI ranks eighth in NCAA history, while the 83 HR are tied for eighth all-time and her .820 slugging percentage is the 13th-best in college softball history.
- She also set the school record for career batting average (.391) and tied for the most doubles in a career (51), while finishing second in FSU history with 289 hits, third with 515 defensive assists and sixth all-time with 121 walks.
- Led the team in 2018 in eight different categories, including a .404 batting average with 21 home runs, 70 RBI and a .836 slugging percentage.
- Added 14 doubles, 44 runs scored, 36 walks and five stolen bases...had a team-high 22 multi-RBI games and was second on the team with 19 multi-hit games.
- Named an NFCA All-American for the third consecutive season and is just the fourth Seminole in program history to be a three-time All-American.
- Was selected as the ACC Player of the Year for the second year in a row and received All-ACC First Team honors for the fourth time, becoming the second player in league history to be named to the All-ACC First Team in all four seasons.
- Tied a Women's College World Series record with 13 hits and finished with a .520 batting average, two doubles, two home runs, four RBI and six runs scored in Oklahoma City to earn 2018 WCWS Most Outstanding Player honors.





SYDNEY SHERRIL 2022 Rawlings Gold Glove Winner

- Sydney Sherrill continued Warren's legacy at third base to become one of the best infielders in the country.
- Sherrill finished her career as one of the most decorated Seminoles softball players in school history.
- No one has played more games in the Garnet and Gold than Sydney Sherrill who played 283 games in her time at Florida State.
- She ranks 10th in FSU history with a .352 batting average, third in slugging percentage with a .622, second in on-base percentage with a .474, 2nd in runs with 225, sixth in hits with 281, first in doubles with 82, third in home runs with 43, third in RBI with 209, second in total bases with 496, second in walks with 186 and second all-time in program history with 555 assists.
- Sherrill also holds the single-game school record for home runs in a game with three against NC State (5/7/22).
- Sherrill won three ACC Defensive Player of the Year awards in 2019, 2021 and 2022.
- Sherrill earned All-America status in 2018 as a freshman and again in 2022.
- Sherrill was a four-time First Team All-ACC player.





RICHARD McCULLOUGH

University President

Richard McCullough became the 16th president of Florida State University on Aug. 16, 2021, bringing more than 30 years of academic research and leadership experience to the role as well as a commitment to innovation, entrepreneurship, and student success.

President McCullough is focused on building on Florida State University's foundation as a top public university and pursuing a bold vision for the future. Since assuming the presidency, he has recruited world-class faculty, staff, and administrators; invested in academic excellence, student success, and faculty and staff; grown the university's research portfolio; encouraged student and faculty entrepreneurial endeavors; cultivated relationships with elected officials and community leaders; enhanced fundraising efforts; and promoted athletic success.

Under McCullough's leadership, the university launched FSU Health — one of the largest and most ambitious projects in Florida State history. This initiative will transform health care delivery, education, and biomedical research in North

Prior to joining FSU, McCullough had served as vice provost for research and professor of materials science and engineering at Harvard University since 2012. In this role, he oversaw the development, review and implementation of strategies, planning, and policies related to academic research. In addition, he led an office of Foundation and Corporate Engagement and assisted in the oversight of more than 25 interdisciplinary institutes, centers and initiatives across the university.

During his tenure, McCullough successfully built and launched the new Harvard Data Science Initiative, a collaboration between 12 of the university's schools and more than 120 faculty, which led to the creation of three new master's programs and many new undergraduate courses.

McCullough developed and launched a new structural biology program and cryo-electron microscope facility that partners Harvard Medical School with three Boston-area hospitals. He also led the development of a new \$100 million, multi-institution collaboration to build the Advanced Biological Innovation and Manufacturing Center and Facility, known as Landmark Bio, which is a hub for medical research and education, as well as economic and workforce development.

Previously, McCullough spent 22 years at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh, where he began his academic career as an assistant professor of chemistry in 1990 and became the Thomas Lord Professor of Chemistry in 2009. He was promoted to head of the chemistry department in 1998 and then served as dean of the Mellon College of Science from 2001 to 2007 before becoming the university's vice president for research.

McCullough, who holds multiple patents and is the founder of two companies, has a rich background in entrepreneurship and innovation. At Carnegie Mellon, he developed a vibrant innovation ecosystem, including the Greenlighting Startups Initiative that exponentially increased the generation of university spin-out companies and corporate engagement. In 2013, he was elected a fellow of the National Academy of Inventors.

McCullough is the author of numerous peer-reviewed articles and serves on the editorial boards of several academic journals, including Advanced Materials. He has been an innovation, entrepreneurship, and technology transfer advisor to Oxford University, Princeton University and Washington University at St. Louis.

A first-generation college student from Mesquite, Texas, McCullough attended Eastfield Community College before earning a bachelor's degree in chemistry from the University of Texas at Dallas in 1982 and a doctoral degree in organic chemistry from Johns Hopkins University in 1988, McCullough also spent two years as a postdoctoral fellow at Columbia University in New York.

He and his wife, Jai Vartikar, have two children, Jason and Dylan, daughter-in-law, Sarah Christian, and two granddaughters, Gladys and Archer.
