He was a very fine guard for four years there and finished his intercollegiate career by playing in the Blue-Gray game in Montgomery, Ala., last December.



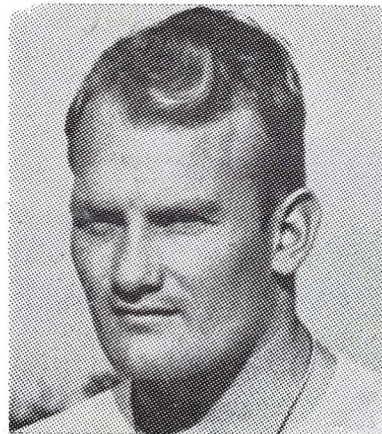
H. G. DANFORD

COACH CHARLES ARMSTRONG

An Air Corps veteran, Armstrong returned to grid warfare at Indiana University in the fall of 1945. He played on Indiana's Big Ten Championship team that year. He was a placekicker specialist while in college. Coming to FSU in the spring of 1948 he handled the Seminole's first baseball team and spring football practice.

Coach Bill Armstrong played on the same Indiana team with his brother, Charlie and Coach Harbison. He finished his playing days in the Blue-Gray affair in Montgomery in 1947. He is working on his master's degree in education and would like to have a high school football team of his own in Florida.

THE DIXIE CONFERENCE was organized last year by the representatives of nine Southern colleges, whose institutions were definitely committed to the principle of amateurism in college sports.

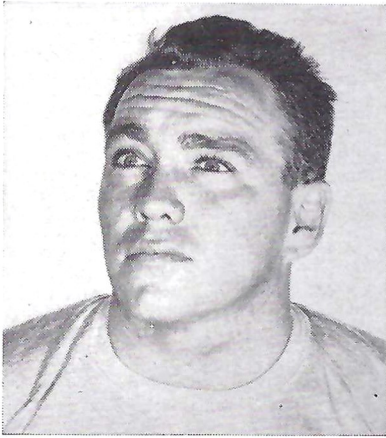
