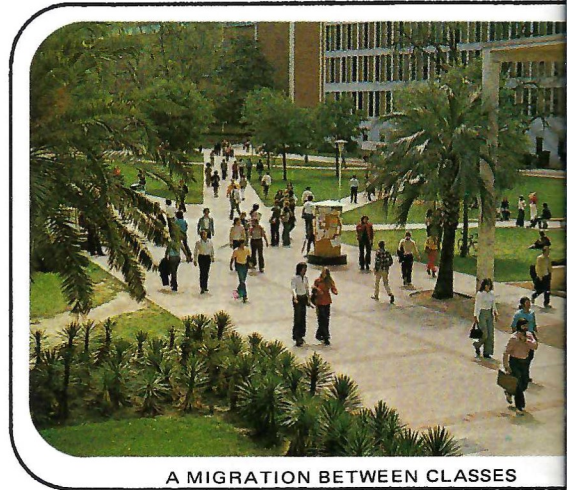

Florida State University is a study in contrasts, its palm trees and oaks shading charming old buildings with Gothic spires and striking contemporary structures of brick and steel.

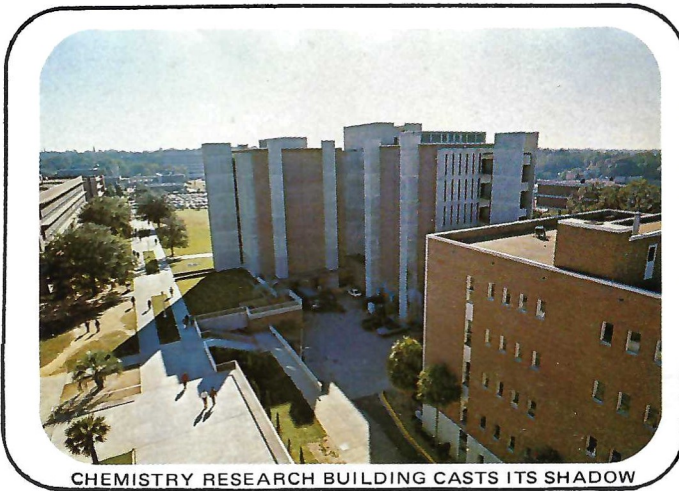
Its history dates back to 1857, when the state legislature named it the Seminary West of the Suwanee. Later it became Florida State College for Women but in 1947, that venerable institution became coeducational Florida State University and a growth spurt started that hasn't stopped yet. Enrollment this year has topped 21,000.

The University has a total population larger than many towns. Add the staff of over 7,100 employes, including some 1,300 faculty members and you have a nearly 30,000 members of an active, vital community.

Contract and grant expenditures for 1974-75 for research and training at Florida State amounted to \$17,285,000. The University has an operating

budget of \$81 million, which includes state, federal and private sources.

The University's 14 schools and colleges include Arts and Sciences, Business, Social Sciences, Criminology, Communication, Nursing, Physical Education, Library Science, Home Economics, Theatre, Law, Music and Visual Arts. In these fields there are 52 doctoral programs, more than 80 bachelor's and master's degrees.

Florida State was one of the first universities in the nation to have its affirmative action program approved by the U. S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare. The University actively seeks to build a community in which opportunities are equalized and uses its facilities and resources to develop the skills and opportunities of the members of all groups so they may play possible and productive roles in society.

Florida State football fans are looking to the 1975 season with a high degree of optimism.

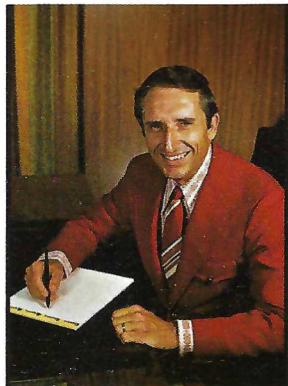

AUBURN UNIVERSITY

Coeducation was inaugurated in the South in 1892 when Auburn first admitted women students. Likewise, the Auburn football team was a party with the University of Georgia team in inaugurating football in the Deep South in 1892.

Today Auburn University is one of the largest institutions in the South. From its 1859 enrollment of 80, Auburn's students today number almost 15,705. Growthwise, the original plant consisting of a single building and 16 acres has expanded into a multi-million dollar plant comprising 60 main buildings and 1,871 acres at the main campus. Total acreage over the state devoted to the Agricultural Experiment Station amounts to over 16,000 acres.

Auburn has been called a liberal arts college, a technical college, a technological college, a college of industrial science, a college of applied science, and more recently a university of applied science. From the first, the name of the City, drawn from Goldsmith's line, "Auburn, loveliest village of the plain," has been used to designate the institution. In recognition of these facts, the Legislature, as of January 1, 1960, changed the name of the institution to Auburn University.

Since Florida State's formative years in modern football, night football has been a part of the fall weekends in Tallahassee. The first Seminole home games were played downtown at Centennial Field. But it was evident from the beginning that this was only a temporary situation.

Within the rapidly expanding university, funds for new facilities were being called for from every end of the campus. However, both the university administration and the local townspeople were aware that athletic facilities were going to be needed in a hurry.

Since state monies were being earmarked for academic construction projects, it was obvious alternate forms of financing for the athletic facilities, especially a football stadium, would be necessary. President Doak S. Campbell never wavered from his commitment to establish a strong athletic program at the fledgling school and his enthusiasm was reflected by many Tallahassee citizens.

Early in 1950, the Chamber of Commerce made the building of a football stadium its number one priority. The state agreed to a bond sale, but the University would have to raise a portion of the cost. Therefore the Tallahassee Athletic Council, Inc. was formed on Feb. 6, 1950.

Its plan was to sell 1,000 five year season football tickets at \$50 each. The drive began immediately. Two weeks later it was reported more than half the tickets sold. A month after that, on Mar. 20, the goal had been reached.

With the financing assured, bids were let and contracts awarded, Apr. 20. The first steel was brought to site on July 5. Work was far enough along to allow the Seminoles to play in the new stadium on Oct. 7, 1950.

The home opener was against Randolph-Macon and was the Seminoles' second game of the year. The stadium was only partially completed, but a record 9,676 nevertheless turned out for the game which the Seminoles won, 40-7.

The stadium was completed shortly and official dedication ceremonies were held at Homecoming, Oct. 28, against Sewanee. President Campbell's untiring efforts to see to the construction of not only the stadium, but also many other buildings on campus, made the selection of a name for the new facility almost academic.

The Homecoming contest was attended by another record breaking crowd, this one numbering 12,033. Taking part in the festivities, which included a presentation of the Stadium to Gov. Fuller Warren for the people of Florida, were Dr. Campbell and Student Body President Reubin Askew.

At the time of the fund raising and initial construction, many people thought a stadium seating 15,000 people would be "larger than anything Tallahassee would ever need."

However, it was not many years before it was obvious expansion would be necessary. By 1956, seating had been increased to 20,000. In 1961, the stadium was again expanded, this time to 25,000.

Other improvements were being made also during this period. A new press box, going up with the second expansion, being the most noticeable. In 1963 the Seminoles moved into new coaching and locker room facilities at the North end zone.

With the advent of the Florida State-Florida series on a home and home basis, it became obvious that 25,000 seats would not be enough to hold the crowds that would be attracted to that game. So when the Seminoles opened the 1964 season, they found a newly enlarged "home" seating for 40,500 fans.

There have been no expansions to the stadium itself in the last 10 years, although the fieldhouse is currently being expanded and renovated. While no definite proposals are now on the boards, future expansion of the stadium is likely as the university and interest in the Seminole program grows.

And for you "stats nuts", tonight's Silver Anniversary game is the 132nd varsity contest in Campbell Stadium. The Seminoles have won 81, lost 47 and tied two games here for a .626 winning percentage.
