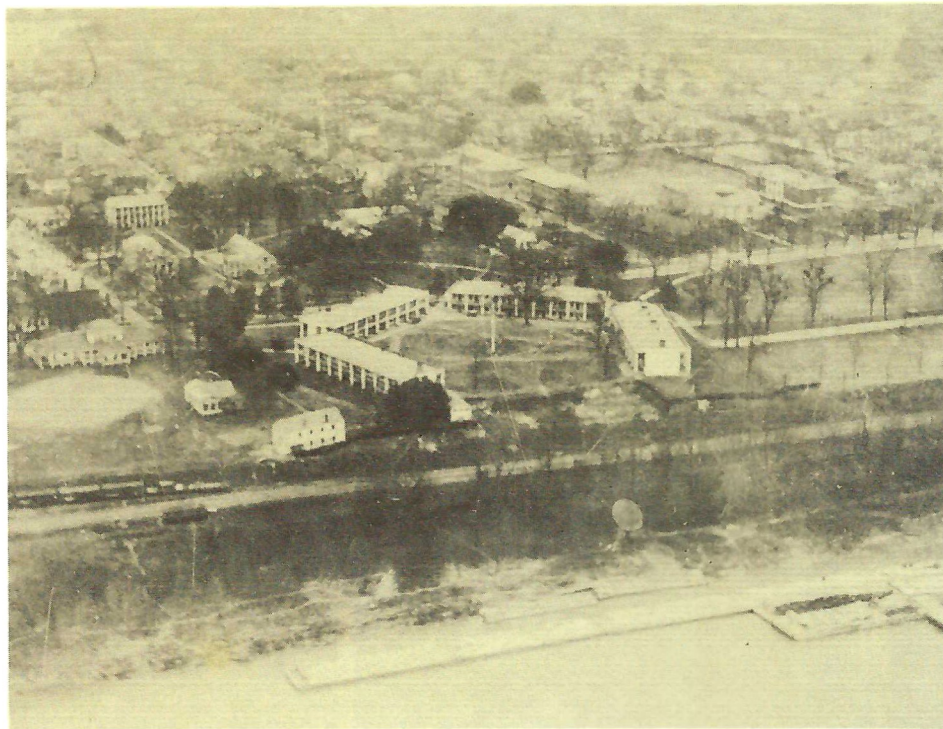

(This structure should be familiar to all since it was moved, lock, stock and barrel, to the present campus.)



Bird's-eye view of the famous Pentagon Barracks, which now houses several hundred University Cadets. They were once sleeping quarters for Spanish and French in the late years of the eighteenth century. The fifth building facing the Mississippi River was destroyed by fire some years ago.

The entire present University can be seen in this picture.
(This picture is historically valuable in addition to its content, but by the fact that it was shot from an airplane . . . or as it was called in those days, an "aeroplane." The open expanse of ground at the left center is the site of the present Louisiana State Capitol building. Although there is no date it is assumed that the photograph was made in the early 1920's.)

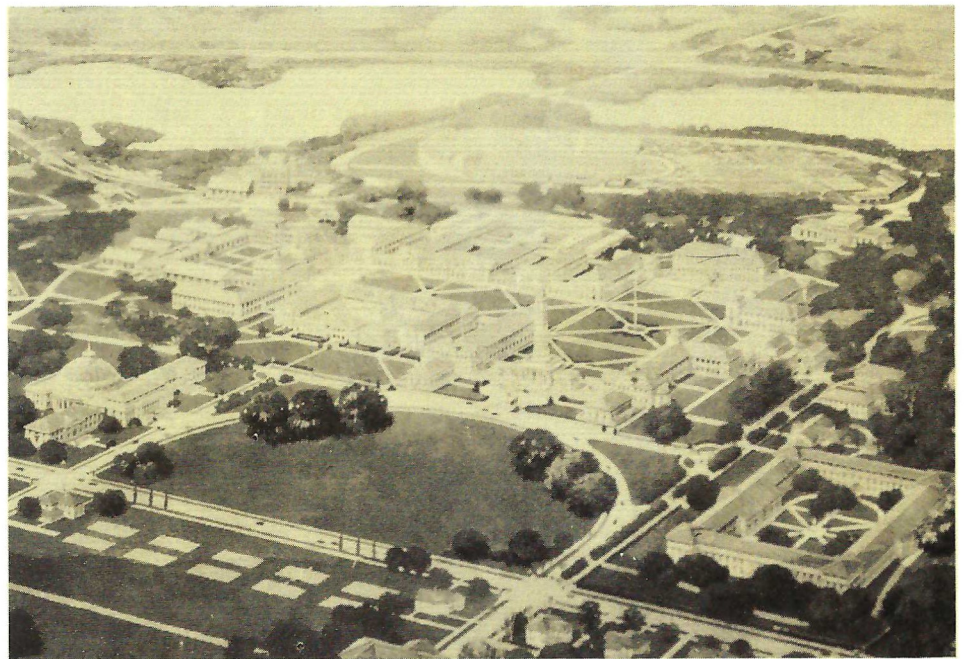
So here are scenes extending back to over half a century of LSU as it then looked.

The identifying information was the original copy written by Mr.

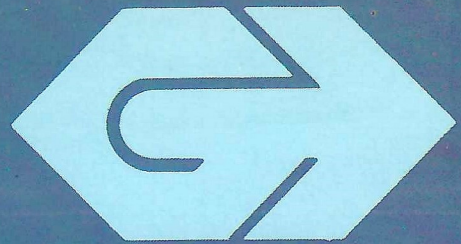

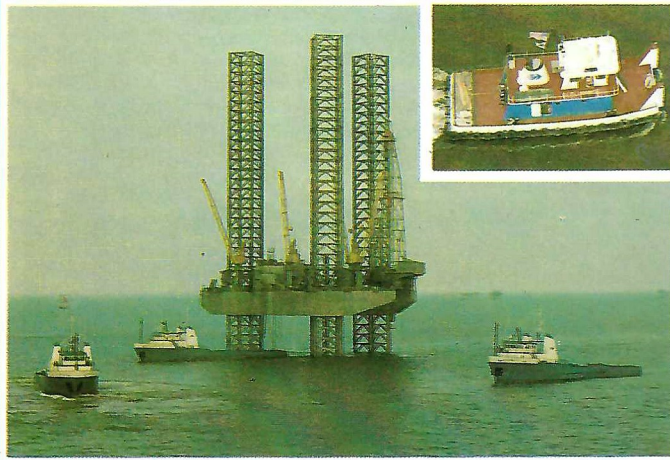
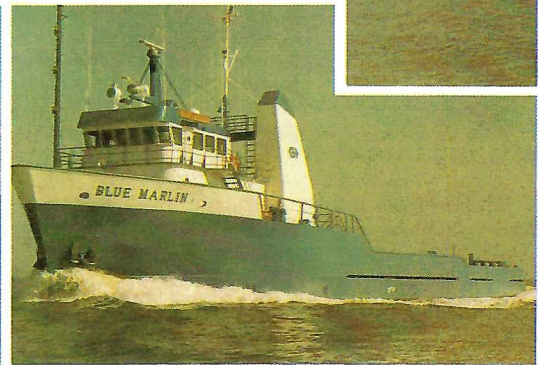
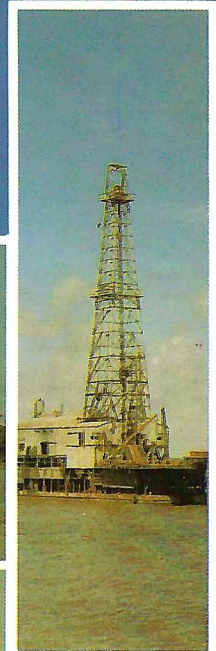
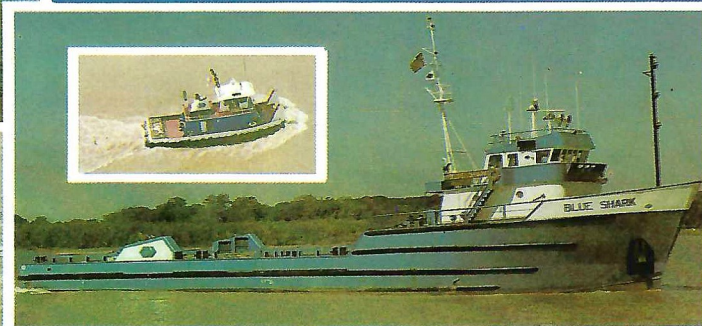
The new Louisiana State University as it will appear when completed in 1926. The Mississippi River is in the foreground.

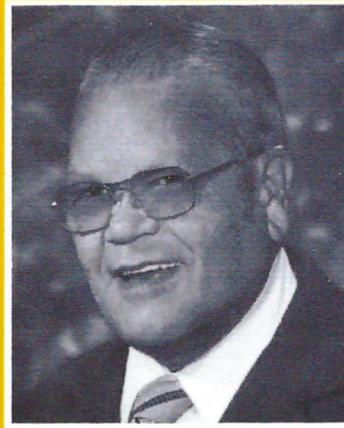

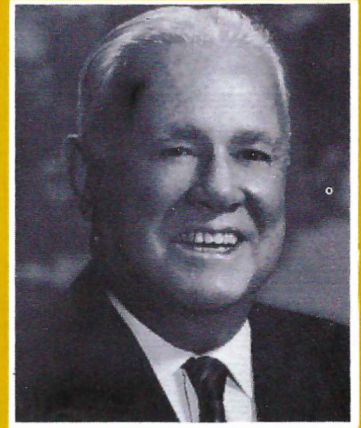

The Hall Of Distinction

A prestigious new award was instituted by the LSU Department of Athletics.

It is the Hall of Distinction and will honor those individuals who have demonstrated outstanding service, other than athletic accomplishment, to the intercollegiate athletic program at LSU; or demonstrated outstanding support for a considerable period of time in the recruitment program for athletes at LSU or in the well-being of a student-athletes

after enrollment and after graduation; or made a major financial contribution to the LSU athletic program.

Four men who have met the criteria were named as charter members of the new Hall. They are Jesse E. LeBlanc, the late Dean J. G. Lee, G. A. Morse and Percy E. Roberts.

Mr. Roberts and Mr. LeBlanc — better known as “Uncle Jesse” — are prominent Louisiana business and civic figures who formerly served on the LSU

Board of Supervisors.

Mr. Morse ... a man whose personality has endeared him to countless thousands ... hails from Vivian in Caddo Parish and is more popularly referred to as “Goober.” He has been a mainstay of the LSU track scene since the 1930’s and is in constant demand as the clerk of course for all meets in this area.

Dr. Lee was an active worker with the Athletic Council during the days when he was an integral

member of the LSU faculty and dean of the College of Agriculture.

The major thrust of the Hall of Distinction is, according to the Constitution, to "provide suitable recognition for those individuals who have brought distinction to themselves and who have supported, provided leadership for and contributed in an exceptional and exemplary manner to the intercollegiate athletic program at Louisiana State University."

The establishment of the new award was made to honor a group of persons who have made these contributions yet were ineligible for the Athletic Hall of Fame since the prime requisite is participating in a varsity athletic event for LSU.

This precludes the election of a host of people who have made their mark for the Tigers, including coaches and administrators as well as supporters of the program through the years.

The Election Board for the Hall of Distinction consists of nine members: the current chairman of the Athletic Council, representatives of the LSU Alumni Federation and the National "L" Club, the current president of the Student Government Association, two members of the Tiger Hall of Distinction, a faculty member, a staff member and Athletic Director Paul Dietzel.

According to the constitution any person may nominate anyone for election to the Hall, but should make the nomination in writing.

Seven first aid stations and one cardiac emergency station are manned by volunteers of the Baton Rouge Chapter, American Red Cross. In the event of an emergency, contact ushers, marshalls, first aiders or policemen on duty for assistance.

REST ROOMS

Men's and Ladies' rest rooms are located beneath the stands in all four sides of the stadium and on the concourse of the upper deck in west stadium.

PUBLIC TELEPHONES

Public telephones are located on the ground level under each of the four stands, in the center of the south upper deck, and on the concourse of the upper deck in west stadium.

CONCESSIONS

Refreshment stands are located in each of the four stands and on the concourses of the upper deck in west stadium. Vendors circulate throughout the stadium before the game and during the half time.

LOST ARTICLES

Articles found should be turned over to the Stadium Office inside Gate 5 under the west stands. Persons seeking to recover lost articles should inquire at the Campus Security Office located at the northwest corner of the stadium.

LSU UNION

Various food service areas available to midnight Saturdays. The possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages in the stadium of Louisiana State University is expressly prohibited by University regulations.

Highway traffic will be heavy on all roads leading out of Baton Rouge after the game. Please drive carefully.

1979-80 LSU Basketball

The 1979-80 LSU basketball Tigers, to say the least, have a tough act to follow. When one considers that last year's team won the SEC championship for the first time in 25 years, finished 23-6 to become the winningest team in LSU basketball history, went all the way to the NCAA Mid-Eastern Regional semi-finals before losing to eventual national champion Michigan State and had two departing seniors, Al and Lionel Green, taken in the first four rounds of the NBA draft, it's pretty obvious that the Tigers have their work cut out for them this year.

Head coach Dale Brown, voted by his fellow coaches as "SEC Coach of the Year" last season, welcomes back three starters and 12 lettermen to face a schedule that includes the likes of DePaul, a 1979 NCAA Final Four participant, Arkansas, always a national contender and traditionally strong Kentucky.

DeWayne Scales, Ethan Martin and Greg Cook are the returning starters. The 6-9 Scales won ALL-SEC honors last season in his forward position by averaging 19.4 points and 9.1 rebounds. Martin, ball-handler and defensive specialist supreme, averaged 9.7 points and 5.4 assists per game.

Cook had to step into a starting forward spot early last year when ALL-SEC performer Durand Macklin injured his foot. Cook ended up averaging 6.3 points and 6.3 rebounds, but this season, Cook will return to the center position to fill the space vacated by Lionel Green and to make room for the return of Macklin.

Observers are anxious to see Macklin and Scales on opposite wings once again. Macklin is a smooth inside operator who averaged 19.0 points and 10.6 rebounds two seasons ago as a sophomore. He is probably one of the outstanding players returning to the collegiate ranks this fall.

Jordy Hultberg, a hot-shooting outside guard, returns for his senior season after averaging 9.6 points in a reserve role last year. He'll be pushed by Mark Alcorn a red-shirt, who transferred to Tigertown last season from St. Louis University.

For other reinforcements to the Tigers front five, Brown will count on junior Willie Sims and sophomore J. Brian Bergeron at guard; senior Rick Mattick (7-0) and Andy Campbell (7-2) at center; sophomores Walter Campbell (6-6), red-shirted last season because of an injury; Gus Rudolph (6-5) and freshman Joe Costello (6-7), red-shirted last year, Howard "Hi-C" Carter (6-5) and Tyrone Black (6-8) at forwards.

All in all, Brown will have six players and a new part-time coach, Rick Huckabay, who weren't associated with last year's Tiger team that returned LSU basketball to the national spotlight. The beauty of that situation is that Brown only used two new scholarships this past season in signing Carter and Black.

LSU'S SUPERCOMPUTER

Louisiana State University has established itself as a leader in the campus computer field, thanks to the acquisition of its \$6 million supercomputer.

In May 1978, IBM's 370/3033 was installed on the Baton Rouge campus, replacing the IBM 360/65 and the 360/40, its obsolete and overlabored predecessors.

The 360/65, after providing more than 75 percent of all the instructional and research computing for Louisiana's colleges and universities, had become an antiquated slowpoke, as did the administrative unit 360/40. Said one California computing consultant: "I know of no university of comparable size to LSU that is able to get by with a 360/40."

In order to meet the pressing demands for instructional, research,

and administrative computing, LSU officials committed themselves to the purchase of a new computer with greater capacities. A major problem, however, was that ever-present educational bugaboo — money.

In 1975, the University's capital-outlay request from the state included funds for new computer capabilities.

In 1976, Governor Edwin Edwards received a petition signed by more than 4,500 students who expressed what they called "a dire need for new computing equipment.

And then in 1977, the Louisiana Legislature approved \$6 million for a new central computer system, plus a half million dollars to renovate the computer's future home.

After extensive planning by LSU and assurance of financial support from the state, the University

prepared to order a machine which would have increased its computer capabilities six-to sevenfold.

But modern technology produced an unexpected boon: As a result of continuously innovating developments in the computer field, a new model — the 3033 — became available, at about the same price and with about 1.6 times the capacity of the equipment the University had planned for, plus more.

Despite the fact that 3033 gives LSU about 10 times its former computer capacity, the new unit is actually slightly smaller in physical size than the Center's previous 360/65.

The 3033's computerized heart is connected to gadgets through which it communicates and is communicated with — disk and tape drives, printers, data-entry devices, storage systems, terminals, and other paraphernalia.

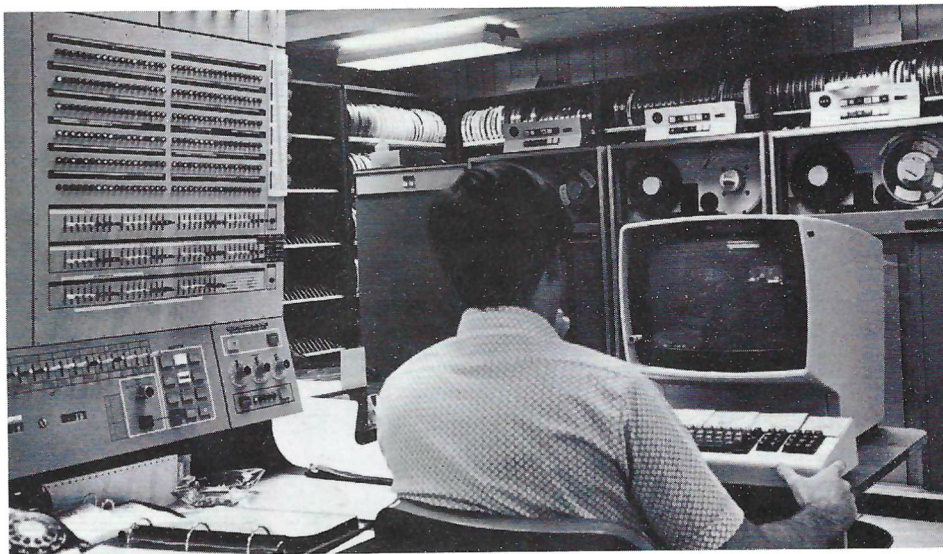
Computers on other LSU campuses are now affiliated with the 3033 on the Baton Rouge campus to greatly increase their capabilities. Therefore, the name of the Computer Research Center has been changed to the "System Network Computer Center."

Administrative data processing is a natural and high-priority function of the computer, dealing with personnel records for the entire LSU System, as well as accounting procedures for compiling grades, maintaining transcripts, and producing statistics that are necessary for day-to-day operation and long-range University planning.

Moreover, instruction and research concerns benefit from computer applications in the sciences, engineering, agriculture, mathematics, and humanities.

In assessing the importance of computers in today's society and education, LSU Chancellor Paul W. Murrill contends that "barring some sort of catastrophic nuclear exchange between major powers of the world, the computer will have a much more phenomenal impact on the life of an individual in the twentieth century than will any other development."

Says Dr. John Tyler, Assistant Vice-Chancellor for Computing Services, "LSU has become one of the best equipped universities in the world with the installation of the 3033."



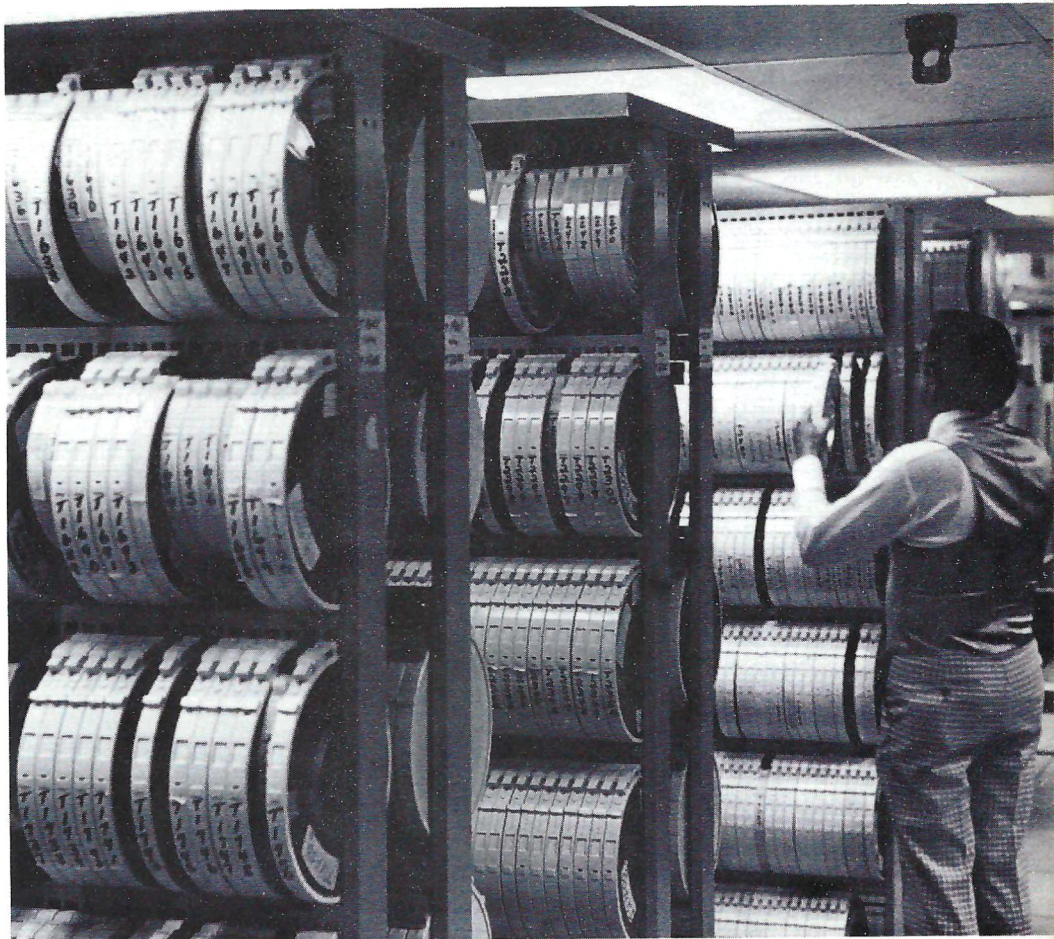
An electronic data processing operations supervisor programs a 3277 console, a small part of LSU's supercomputer, which has made the University a definite leader among campus computer centers in the nation.

The acquisition of the 3033 is really a big deal, according to LSU officials, so much so that LSU is definitely where the computer action is.

"The new computer will, of course, have a great impact upon the LSU community — an impact which I believe is generally underestimated and not fully appreciated. Not only will this improved capability

significantly boost our basic instructional and research efforts, but it will be a great tool in improving the administrative and managerial aspects of the University's operation ... the long-term effect of this much-needed computer will be tremendously beneficial."
